

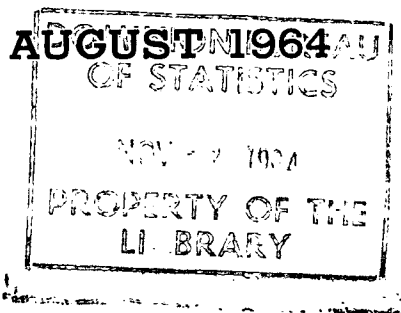

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CLASSIFICATIONS USED IN THIS REPORT

"Commercial Vehicles" are trucks used for commercial purposes.

Highway Traffic not classified as commercial vehicles consists of automobiles, taxis, motorcycles, bicycles and trailers.

FOREIGN VEHICLES INWARD

A traveller's vehicle permit is issued at the port of entry by Customs officers to every foreign vehicle entering Canada. This document authorizes the use of the vehicle during the intended length of stay in Canada and is surrendered when departing at the port of exit.

Residents of border communities who make many trips during the year are entitled to apply for a standing (L) traveller's vehicle permit. The operator of the vehicle covered by the standing (L) traveller's vehicle permit must show the document on each entry into Canada. All visits made after the original visit when the permit was issued are recorded as "Repeats" and entered under the appropriate heading.

Permits covering vehicles with one or more nights stay in Canada (including the first trip of standing (L) permits) are recorded in the first column. Permits covering vehicles entering and leaving Canada on the same day are recorded in the second column. Repeat trips of vehicles using standing (L) permits are recorded in the third column captioned "Repeats and taxis". Taxis are not included in columns 1 or 2.

CANADIAN VEHICLES INWARD

Canadian vehicles returning to Canada are classified by length of stay, depending upon whether they leave Canada and return on the same day; spend one or more nights abroad.

Non-resident Vehicles Entering Canada

Total foreign vehicles entering Canada from the United States in August 1964 declined to 1,748,400, some 8,400 or 0.5 per cent less than in the same month of 1963. Vehicles staying in Canada for one or more nights numbered 758,400, a drop of 7,600 or 1 per cent. On the other hand, vehicles entering and leaving the same day rose to 664,000, an increase of 13,400 or 2.1 per cent. Repeats and taxis totalled 285,800 as compared with 298,100 in August 1963, a decline of 12,300 or just over 4 per cent. Entries of commercial vehicles also showed a decrease, declining by 1,900 or between 4 and 5 per cent to 40,200.

Cumulatively, aggregate entries of non-resident vehicles from the United States for the January-August period of 1964 numbered 7,703,600, an increase of 311,800 or 4.2 per cent over the same period in 1963. The number of vehicles staying one or more nights in Canada advanced to 2,764,900, a gain of 171,900 or 6.6 per cent. Vehicles entering and leaving the same day totalled 3,163,200, representing an advance of 160,500 or 5.3 per cent in comparison with the corresponding 1963 period. On the other hand, entries of repeats and taxis dropped by 6,900 or 0.5 per cent to 1,451,000 while the number of commercial vehicles (324,500) represented a decline of 13,700 or slightly more than 4 per cent from the January-August 1963 period.

Non-immigrants Entering Canada by Plane, Through Bus, Rail, and Boat

The number of foreign travellers entering Canada from the United States by plane, through bus, rail, and boat in August 1964 numbered 357,300, a decrease of 15,800 or 4.2 per cent in comparison with the same month of last year. Plane arrivals totalled 65,700, representing an advance of 9 per cent. This was the only category to show an increase over the same month of 1963. Entries of non-immigrants by long-distance bus amounted to 102,300, a drop of 15,500 or 13.2 per cent from August 1963, while entries by rail, at 33,400, represented a decline of 500 or 1.5 per cent. The number of boat arrivals (155,900) also registered a decline which amounted to 5,200 or 3.2 per cent.

Cumulatively, there was an increase in the number of entries for the January-August 1964 period: entries totalled 1,372,600, an increase of 81,200 or 6.3 per cent over the same period of 1963. Gains were recorded for all types of transportation. Cumulative figures show that there was an increase of 45,200 or close to 14 per cent in the number of entries by plane, which rose to 376,000 in the January-August period of 1964. Entries by bus numbered 411,400, a gain of 18,200 or 4.6 per cent over the corresponding period in 1963. By rail, entries amounted to 170,500, a rise of 13,300 or between 8 and 9 per cent. Entries by boat, amounting to 414,700, represented a slight increase of 4,500 or 1.1 per cent over the January-August 1963 period.

Canadian Vehicles Returning to Canada

The number of Canadian vehicles returning to Canada from the United States rose from 1,096,700 in August 1963 to 1,204,000 in August 1964, an increase of 107,300 or close to 10 per cent. All three categories shared in the increase. There was a substantial increase in Canadian vehicles returning after one or more nights in the United States: such re-entries rose by 39,700 or 16.8 per cent to reach 276,300. Vehicles leaving and returning to Canada on the same day amounted to 874,600, some 66,500 or 8.2 per cent more than in the corresponding month of 1963. Re-entries of commercial vehicles, at 53,100, recorded an advance of 1,100 or just over 2 per cent.

Cumulative figures for the January-August 1964 period show that re-entries amounted to 6,980,700, which represents an increase of 577,400 or 9 per cent over the same period of 1963. Vehicles returning to Canada after one or more nights in the United States totalled 997,200; this was an increase of 104,900 or close to 12 per cent over corresponding 1963 data. Canadian vehicles leaving and returning on the same day numbered 5,537,800, a gain of 442,000 or some 8.7 per cent. Re-entries of commercial vehicles, amounting to 445,700, represented an advance of 30,500 or 7.3 per cent in comparison with the same period of 1963.

Residents of Canada Returning by Plane, Through Bus, Rail, and Boat

Canadian residents returning from the United States by plane, through bus, rail, and boat in August 1964 totalled 170,400. This was an increase of 6,400 or nearly 4 per cent over August 1963. Residents returning by plane amounted to 47,600, 6,000 or 14.4 per cent more than in the same month last year. Canadians returning by long-distance bus totalled 59,100, a gain of 4,200 or 7.7 per cent, while those returning by rail numbered 29,500, an advance of 2,300 or between 8 and 9 per cent. Boat traffic was the only category to show a decrease as the drop in re-entries over the previous year stood at 6,100.

Re-entries of Canadians travelling by plane, through bus, rail, and boat in the first eight months of 1964 numbered 978,000, an increase of 100,000 or 11.4 per cent over the same period of 1963. Residents making the return trip by plane totalled 368,700, compared with 333,300 in the same period last year, a gain of 10.6 per cent. Re-entries by bus, at 333,500, were 44,900 or 15.6 per cent above corresponding data for 1963, while those returning by rail rose from 164,100 to 181,000, an advance of 16,900 or 10.3 per cent. Persons returning by boat amounted to 94,800, some 2,800 or 3 per cent above the comparable period of 1963.
