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

INTRODUCTION

This report is the eleventh of an annual series presenting estimated current revenue and expenditure of municipal governments in provincial aggregates. This compilation is on a basis consistent with the actual current (as opposed to "gross general" and "net general") revenue and expenditure presented in the publication "Municipal Government Finance" Catalogue No. 68-204, the latest issue of which is for the year 1964. In this report "preliminary" data is provided for 1965 and 1966 and "estimated" data for 1967. The term "preliminary" is applied to data based on information contained in financial statements pertaining to municipal revenues and expenditures, while the term "estimated" is applied to data based on municipal budget information.

An analysis of debenture debt charges and estimated gross debenture debt issued and outstanding at the year end has again been included in provincial aggregate form for all provinces—this information however, was not available for Quebec, Yukon and Northwest Territories.

This report is more comprehensive than its predecessors in that it includes for the first time revenue and expenditure data for municipalities within the Yukon and Northwest Territories and also for municipalities within selected Census Metropolitan Areas. The latter is intended as a step toward meeting the growing demand for regional statistics which with further development might allow for specialty studies not feasible on a provincial aggregate basis. The ultimate goal is to present "gross general" revenues and expenditures, along with an analysis of current and capital grants, and debt transactions for all Census Metropolitan Areas and Major Urban Areas.

Local Government Organization and Structure

Government in Canada may be said to comprise federal, provincial (and territorial), and local governments. Local government is defined by DBS as all government entities below the provincial level. The number of these entities is large, and their relationships with one another and with the other levels of government are extremely complex. An understanding of these relationships is essential for the interpretation of local government statistics.

Local government exists to provide services which constitutionally are the responsibilities of the provinces but which, in the latter's opinion, are best administered by organizations whose jurisdictions are confined to localities within the province. Because the constitution is permissive insofar as the establishment of "municipal institutions" by provincial governments is concerned, and because of the wide variations in tradition, history, development, and other determinants in each province, the

roles assigned to local government and the way it discharges those roles vary considerably, not only from province to province, but also between similar entities within a single province.

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics assigns local government entities to four principal categories—regional municipalities, local municipalities, school boards, and joint boards and commissions. There is a fifth category comprising enterprises, institutions, and special purpose boards which are usually the creations of regional and local municipalities; some of this fifth category however, may be provincial creations and, as such, be more or less independent of other local governments.

The financial statistics presented herein are for municipalities, both regional and local, and include other local government entities (a) to the extent to which they are financed by municipalities, and (b) as is required to approach, as near as possible, uniformity in coverage between provinces.

Estimating Procedures

The estimates provided in this publication were obtained by projection of 1964 information as published in Municipal Government Finance, Catalogue No. 68-204.

The estimating procedures apply to all provinces except Quebec, where the source data used for projection was provided by the Quebec Bureau of Statistics. In the Yukon and Northwest Territories the organized municipalities were surveyed on a full coverage basis and the results were compiled without inflation.

Information obtained from a survey of a sample of municipalities was used to compute estimated provincial aggregates on a "preliminary" basis for 1966 and an "estimated" basis for 1967.

Composition of the sample varied from province to province to accommodate the peculiarities of local government structure in each province. Essentially the selection of municipalities to be surveyed was made within the grouping or classification in the departments of municipal affairs reports. First, the municipalities in the Census Metropolitan Areas were selected and grouped separately, secondly, the municipalities that were considered unique and neither representative of nor capable of being represented by others, were selected and also grouped separately. Finally from the remaining municipalities a sample was selected within each respective group. Municipalities selected prior to the sample selection are referred to as self-representative. Municipalities selected both on a self-representative basis and by application of sampling techniques are referred to as the sample municipalities.

Basically, the method of projection was to apply the percentage change in sample data from base to current year to the total data for the base year. This link or index of change was computed and applied for each item of revenue, expenditure etc. within each sample group. Because estimates were made for two years from the same base data, the formula was altered to enable the application of one ratio for each year's estimates as follows:

$$\frac{\text{Total (base)}}{\text{Sample (base)}} \times \text{Sample (current)} = \frac{\text{Estimate of total (current)}}{\text{total (current)}}$$

The estimates derived from data provided by those selected as sample municipalities were added to the estimates provided by the self-representing municipalities to arrive at projected revenue and expenditure comparable in scope to the department of municipal affairs base data. These estimates on a provincial aggregate basis were then adjusted to compensate for portions of local government not represented by the survey and also to make the estimates comparable in concept with the "actual" series as published for 1964.

Limitations

Although the specific items of revenue and expenditure are common to nearly all municipalities, their relative significance within the financial structure of each municipality differs to varying degrees. As an example, towns of a comparable size in a given area might all have "real property tax" and "licences and permits" revenue. The proportion of these items of revenue to their respective total revenue could vary from one town to another within the group. One might expect that the proportion of "licences and permits" would be more variable. Therefore the sample representation varies between items of revenue and expenditure and the quality of the estimates varies accordingly. Items which form a stable proportion of revenue or expenditure for a sample group of municipalities have a higher degree of accuracy or reliability than others. This inadequacy of the sample to be totally representative was recognized and special attention was given during the compilation to minimize errors resulting from under-representation of this nature. Such errors of sampling vary from item to item. However the sample element forms only a part of the provincial total. Hence the error in the provincial total of a particular item is relatively insignificant.

Current Revenue and Expenditure

Revenue and expenditure in provincial and territorial aggregates presented in Tables 1 and 2 show the three years of data for each province and territory as well as a total to enable the examination of trends. Detail for some provinces was not available or could not be obtained by the estimating procedures and such exceptions are indicated by symbols set forth in the flyleaf of this publication or by footnote.

The most significant year to year change occurred in New Brunswick in 1967 where the resumption of certain services by the provincial government resulted in the cessation of local government expenditures on health, welfare and education and a marked decline in debenture debt charges. This was offset by a substantial reduction in real property tax and in contributions from the Federal and Provincial governments, and the elimination of all taxes other than real property and business. All of these changes resulted from the recommendations of the "Programme for Equal Opportunity" implemented by the Government of New Brunswick on January 1, 1967.

As illustrated in the following summary tables of revenue and expenditure, in most instances increases occurred each year from 1963 to 1967 in all itemized classifications of current revenues and expenditures. Exceptions occurred with a slight decline in "special assessments" in 1966 offset by an increase in "other revenue". Although total revenues and expenditures showed a succession of increases, the rate of increase was irregular but within a narrow range and averaged almost eight per cent per year.

The percentage distribution tables illustrate the consistency of the relationship of the items of revenue and expenditure to their respective totals each year. Commencing in 1963, general taxation, as a proportion of total revenue, displays a declining trend to 1965 with increases in 1966 and 1967, while grants become increasingly important. Other sources of revenue and functions of expenditure, with the exception of "education" which rose slightly, increased at approximately the same rate as total revenues and expenditures.

Adjustments made to make the projected estimates conform in concept with the "actual" series included the addition of taxes levied by school boards and the inclusion of other local government entities not included nor represented by the survey, such as local improvement districts. Various sources and methods were used to determine the amount of these adjustments. In most instances projection of trend was employed, but where possible estimates prepared for other purposes were used, e.g. in British Columbia the taxation of school districts was obtained from the "Provincial Estimates" as published by the Government of British Columbia.

Debenture Debt Charges

The analyses of debenture debt charges shown in Table 3 is a presentation of the charges relative to the gross debenture debt of local government. Charges relative to debentures issued for municipal and school purposes only, agree with the expenditure item "Debenture debt charges" in Table 2. Detail for this table was not available for Quebec and the Yukon and Northwest Territories. The resumption of local education by the province in New Brunswick is reflected in this table with the elimination of debenture debt charges for this purpose in 1967.



Gross Debenture Debt

This table shows the estimated debt outstanding at December 31 for all debentures issued by local government with the exception of Quebec and the Yukon and Northwest Territories for which information was not available.

Census Metropolitan Areas

The selection of Census Metropolitan Areas was based primarily on the availability of information. If the core city or a significant component of the C.M.A. did not respond to the survey or provide adequate information, the C.M.A. was omitted from this report. Also, where major changes occurred in the composition of the C.M.A. during the period under review, the C.M.A. was omitted. For example, reorganization of local government and resumption of certain services by the Province in New Brunswick, which came into effect on January 1, 1967 with the implementation of the "Programme for Equal Opportunity", prevented the inclusion of the C.M.A. of Saint John.

Current revenue and expenditure of municipalities in Census Metropolitan Areas are shown in aggregate for a selection of C.M.A.'s in Tables 5

and 6. The amounts and relative proportions for each C.M.A. as well as for the aggregate of C.M.A.'s in each province are shown alongside the respective provincial aggregates.

So far as possible C.M.A. information is presented on a basis consistent with the respective provincial aggregate. Exceptions to this consistency are noted by footnotes to the tables, e.g. "Joint expenditure" and "Contribution - other municipalities". The unorganized portion was omitted and where only a part of a municipality was included for population presentation, the decision to include the entire municipality for this presentation was based on the proportion of population within the C.M. If more than fifty per cent of the population of municipality was included within a C.M.A. then the entire municipality was included for presentation of municipal finance statistics. An exception was made to include only the Ontario portion of the C.M.A. of Ottawa. Information for the municipalities in Quebec was not available.

The selected C.M.A.'s and their constituent municipalities showing the 1966 population of each, and the proportions of C.M.A.'s populations to their respective provincial totals, follow:


