

Municipal Assessment Valuations

The Bureau's annual bulletin showing the Assessment Valuations of the various classes of municipalities throughout Canada is presented herewith. The statistics which cover the year 1930 furnish the latest available data.

Similar information has been published from the year 1919 and while assessment systems as between provinces are very diverse the Bureau by consultation with municipal and provincial officers has been able to produce statistics of a comparable nature. The following notes, however, will be of service in the use or discussion of the tables presented.

There is no system of rural municipalities in Prince Edward Island and the land valuations as shown were estimated by provincial government authorities. Land and Building valuations are only shown separately for the provinces of Ontario, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. Personal property assessment is not recorded in the provinces of Quebec Ontario, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia, while Income Valuation is only shown for Saskatchewan, Ontario, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

The report is divided into two main tables, one giving a summary by provinces of the valuations of various classes of taxable properties, also exempted valuations, the other giving in detail valuations according to classes of municipalities.

There has been considerable increase in Assessment Valuations from 1919 to 1930 as shown by the following comparisons. The total assessed value of taxable real property in Canada increased from \$6,023,012,649 in 1919 to \$8,467,559,699 in 1930. Personal property which is taxed only in certain provinces, increased from \$52,932,719 in 1919 to \$65,785,335 in 1930. Income is only taxed by municipalities in a few provinces. In 1919 income was assessed by these municipalities at \$103,260,441 and in 1930 it amounted to \$139,282,188. There was also an increase in other taxable valuations which amounted to \$167,498,151 in 1919 and increased in 1930 to \$313,217,116. Property which is exempt from taxation, consisting mainly of government property, educational, charitable and religious institutions, had an assessed valuation of \$811,935,964 in 1919 and amounted to \$1,460,936,727 in the year 1930,




