URBAN MUNICIPALITIES 10,000 POPULATION AND OVER, 1934.

For some years past the Bureau has compiled a bulletin dealing with the financial activities of cities and towns in Canada having a population of 10,000 and over. The information has been taken from reports made by the several municipalities to their respective provincial governments. It has been found, however, that there is no uniformity in the arrangement of statistics as between provinces which makes it difficult to obtain accurate statements for comparative purposes.

The provincial governments of Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick do not publish any information concerning cities within their respective areas and the data contained in this report was obtained direct from civic officials.

The reports on municipal statistics for both the provinces of Quebec and Ontario in 1934 have been subjected to considerable modification as compared with those of previous years. The introduction of the reports of each of the provinces draws attention to the incomparability of 1934 statements with those published for earlier years. In the Ontario report the only receipts shown are those for Tax Collections, Tax Arrears and Water-works Systems, while the figures giving the distribution of general administrative expenditures other than those on waterworks systems have been suspended entirely pending a revision of the system of reporting. With regard to assets the report only furnishes statistics for waterworks systems, arrears of taxes and sinking fund investments. Pending the resumption of the more fully detailed tables by the Department of Municipal Affairs of Ontario it was thought advisable to insert statistics showing revenues, expenditures, assets and liabilities in part, for electric light, power, telephone and street railway systems of the cities of Ontario, dealt with in this report. The Statistics given are those compiled by the Transportation and Public Utilities Branch of this Bureau.

In Quebec, the exempted property valuation as shown in Table 1, includes taxable property temporarily exempted amounting to \$43,624,627 for all the cities shown. The general statistics for the municipalities of Quebec are for the calendar year 1934 with the following exceptions: Montreal, Quebec City and Levis whose fiscal years ended April 30, 1935; Hull, whose fiscal year ended April 30, 1934; Shawinigan Falls on June 30, 1934, and Thetford Mines on November 30, 1934. School statistics are for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1934.

In the provincial report of Alberta the receipts and expenditures for waterworks, street railways and gas plants are not included with other general accounts. In this bulletin such receipts and expenditures have been included. Alberta's municipal expenditure on "Public Utilities" includes their fixed charges. Under assets, sinking funds only are available.

Manitoba does not record expenditures, and the only receipts shown are tax collections.

In British Columbia, the municipal reports do not detail all assets nor do they show the total asset valuations.

The populations given are estimates used by the provincial governments in their municipal reports, with the exception of four cities noted, for which places the Dominion of Canada census populations for 1931 have been employed.


