

BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF URBAN AND RURAL MUNICIPALITIES

1924 and 1925.

A bulletin dealing with bonded indebtedness of municipalities in Canada was issued by the Bureau in 1926. It covered the five year period 1919 - 1923. In view of the continued public interest in matters pertaining to government finance similar statistics for 1924 and 1925, which are the latest available, are presented in this bulletin.

There are ever 4,000 municipalities in Canada divided into urban and rural classes, the first represented by cities, towns and villages and the second by rural municipalities, districts and counties. Under the control of the municipal departments of provinces wherein they are situated each of these municipalities has borrowing powers of a greater or less degree. Just as the Dominion and provincial governments have increased their indebtedness, so have the municipal government institutions during recent years.

The statement by provinces shows that the total bonded debt increased in 1924 over 1923 by \$72,002,386 but showed a decrease of \$32,199,451 for 1925 as compared with 1924. The municipalities in the provinces of Ontario, Saskatchewan and Alberta showed a slight decrease for bonded debt in 1925 as compared with 1924, while the municipalities of Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Manitoba and British Columbia have steadily added to their indebtedness from 1919 to 1925. With regard to New Brunswick, the returns made to the provincial government from year to year are so incomplete that accurate comparability is impossible and no attempt has been made to show per capita bonded indebtedness.

The bulletin is made up of four tables, the first dealing with the debt of all municipalities reported in each province, the second showing the debt of all urban and all rural municipalities in Canada, the third showing the debt of the various classes of municipalities by provinces, and the fourth a summary of the total and per capita urban as well as rural municipal debt for each province.

In comparing the classes of municipalities as between provinces, it must be borne in mind that the municipal systems of the several provinces vary with regard to the erection and incorporation of different kinds of municipalities, as in British Columbia where nine out of thirty-three cities have a population of 1,000 or less while town municipalities do not exist. Again in Prince Edward Island, there is no system of rural municipalities, the provincial government administering all public loans and borrowings other than those made by the incorporated urban municipalities which number one city and six towns.


