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ESTIMATES OF HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES IN CANADA, 1954

The estimated number of households in Canada on June 1, 1954, was 3,785,000, an increase of 110,000 or 3.0 per cent since June 1, 1953, and of 224,000 or 6.3 per cent since June 1, 1952. The average size of households in Canada in 1954 was 3.9 persons as compared with 4.0 persons in the period 1951-1953. The average size of household was largest in Newfoundland, at 5.1 persons, followed by New Brunswick at 4.6 persons, and Quebec at 4.5 persons per household. British Columbia showed the smallest average size of household at 3.3 persons.

The estimated number of families in Canada in June, 1954, was 3,595,000, an increase of 118,000 or 3.4 per cent since June 1, 1953, and of 182,000 or 5.3 per cent since June 1, 1952. The highest rate of family increase between 1952 and 1954 was in Saskatchewan at 7.6 per cent, followed by Manitoba at 6.8 per cent. Prince Edward Island, the only province to show a decrease, declined by 4.3 per cent from June 1, 1952. Average size of family in Canada in 1954 was 3.7 persons as compared with 3.8 persons in 1953. Average size of family was greatest in Newfoundland, at 4.6 persons per family, and lowest in British Columbia at 3.3 persons per family.

The household and family estimates for 1954, as shown in this bulletin, were derived from the data on these subjects collected in conjunction with the June, 1954 Survey of the Labour Force, covering a sample of approximately 30,000 households throughout Canada. The survey does not include institutional households, representing only a small number of the population. Although the Labour Force Survey does not cover inaccessible areas in the northern parts of the country and Indian reserves, allowance is made for the population living in these areas in the household and family estimates shown in this report.

Definition of Household.—As in the Census, a household in the Labour Force Survey is defined as a group of persons living in the same dwelling, irrespective of whether they are related to one another by ties of kinship. A dwelling is defined as a structurally separate set of living premises with private entrance from outside the building or from a common hallway or stairway inside.

Definition of Family.—For purposes of comparison with the 1951 Census statistics on families, a family in the sample survey was defined as a group of two or more persons living in a dwelling related to one another either as husband or wife, with or without children, or as parent and child. Other relatives living in the same dwelling, including married children, were not counted as members of the family. However, where a married son (or daughter) and children were living with their parents in the same dwelling or household they were counted as a second family in the dwelling.

NOMBRE ESTIMATIF DE MÉNAGES ET DE FAMILLES AU CANADA, 1954

Le nombre estimatif de ménages au Canada, le 1^{er} juin 1954, était de 3,785,000, augmentation de 110,000 ou 3.0 p. 100 sur le 1^{er} juin 1953 et de 224,000 ou 6.3 p. 100 depuis le 1^{er} juin 1952. La moyenne de personnes par ménage était de 3.9, au regard de 4.0 au cours de la période de 1951-1953. Elle est la plus élevée (5.1 personnes) à Terre-Neuve; ensuite, au Nouveau-Brunswick (4.6 personnes), et au Québec (4.5 personnes); elle est la plus basse (3.3) en Colombie-Britannique.

Le nombre estimatif de familles au Canada, en juin 1954, était de 3,595,000, augmentation de 118,000 ou 3.4 p. 100 sur le 1^{er} juin 1953 et de 182,000 ou 5.3 p. 100 depuis le 1^{er} juin 1952. Les taux d'augmentation les plus marqués entre 1952 et 1954 ont été enregistrés en Saskatchewan (7.6 p. 100) et au Manitoba (6.8 p. 100). Dans l'Île-du-Prince-Édouard, seule province à accuser une diminution, le taux a fléchi de 4.3 p. 100 depuis le 1^{er} juin 1952. La taille moyenne de la famille canadienne en 1954 était de 3.7 personnes au regard de 3.8 en 1953. C'est à Terre-Neuve qu'elle est la plus forte, soit 4.6 personnes par famille, et en Colombie-Britannique, qu'elle est la plus faible, soit 3.3 personnes.

Les estimations relatives aux ménages et aux familles pour 1954, contenues dans le présent rapport, ont été tirées des données pertinentes réunies lors du relevé de la main-d'œuvre de juin 1954, relevé qui portait sur un échantillon de quelque 30,000 ménages au Canada. L'enquête ne porte pas sur les ménages dans les institutions, qui ne représentent qu'une petite partie de la population. Bien que les régions inaccessibles du Nord du pays de même que les réserves indiennes échappent au relevé de la main-d'œuvre, les estimations relatives aux ménages et aux familles contenues dans le présent rapport font la part des populations qui y demeurent.

Définition d'un ménage.—Comme pour le recensement, un ménage, pour les besoins du relevé de la main-d'œuvre, est un groupe de personnes, parentes ou non, qui demeurent sous le même toit. Un logement est une série de pièces d'habitation indépendantes au point de vue de la structure, avec entrée particulière de l'extérieur ou sur un corridor ou sur un escalier, à l'intérieur.

Définition d'une famille.—Pour les besoins de la comparaison avec la statistique des familles établie lors du recensement de 1951, une famille, dans l'enquête-échantillon, est un groupe de deux personnes ou plus vivant sous un même toit et apparentées comme époux et épouse, avec ou sans enfants, ou l'un des deux et un enfant. Les autres parents qui vivent dans le même logement, y compris les enfants mariés, ne sont pas comptés comme membres de la famille. Toutefois, un fils (ou une fille) marié et ses enfants qui demeurent avec leurs parents dans le même logement ou dans le même ménage, sont comptés comme famille secondaire dans le logement.

Children in Families.—Unmarried sons and daughters 24 years of age and under living with their parents were classified as children in the family. Unmarried sons and daughters 25 years of age and over living with their parents were counted as family members but not as children. Step-children and adopted children under 25 years of age were included in the number of children in families. Guardianship children or wards, under 21 years of age, were similarly treated.

Nombre d'enfants dans la famille.—Les fils et les filles non mariés âgés de 24 ans et moins qui vivent avec leurs parents sont comptés avec les enfants dans la famille. Les fils et les filles mariés âgés de 25 ans et plus qui vivent avec leurs parents sont comptés comme membres de la famille mais non comme enfants. Les beaux-enfants et les enfants adoptifs de moins de 25 ans sont comptés avec les enfants de la famille. Il en est de même pour les enfants en tutelle, ou pupilles, âgés de 21 ans.
