## INTRODUCTION

CANSIM\* (Canadian Socio-economic Information Management System), is Statistics Canada's computerized data base and information retrieval service. Statistics Canada maintains the complete Time Series Data Base and software at a commercial service bureau to ensure timely access from anywhere in Canada or internationally. The Time Series Data Base provides detailed and timely statistical information to data users in the private and public sectors in both official languages.

In addition to the central facility maintained by Statistics Canada, subsets of the CANSIM Time Series Data Base are distributed by various commercial service bureaux under license to Statistics Canada.

The Time Series Data Base contains a wide variety of data relating to such topics as the System of National Accounts, Labour, Manufacturing, Construction, Trade, Agriculture and Finance. As well, selected demographic and social data, such as population estimates and vital statistics, are available.

An intrinsic property of the Time Series Data Base is that the data are organized according to a hierarchical structure - the highest level of which is the data matrix. Each of the approximately 6,000 matrices on the data base contains individual series which are related to each other in some coherent fashion. Each series represents a concept or variable for which data are stored across time.

The CANSIM Time Series Data Base is one of several data base systems administered by the Electronic Data Dissemination Division. Socio-economic statistics are available in cross-sectional format on the Cross-Classified Data Base (XCL), which shows data in multi-dimensional relationships with other data over time. Census data, for a variety of geographic areas, are available on the Census Summary Data System (CSDS) for Census years from 1961 to 1986. Time series and Census data are also available on CD-ROM.

### VOLUME 1 - Summary - Description of Contents

**DIRECTORY SUMMARY** - This section contains a brief description of the subject matter, a list of contact persons and a listing of the Time Series Data Base contents at the matrix level. The Directory Summary is sorted alphabetically, as outlined in the Table of Contents.

The matrices in bold print are those which have some data on the StatCan: CANSIM Disc CD-ROM.

A matrix number followed by a "T" indicates that all series within that matrix have been terminated. The detailed series listing for these matrices will be found in Volume III. Fully active and partially active matrices will be found in Volume II.

**INQUIRIES LIST** - Most questions can be answered at your nearest Statistics Canada Regional Office or by the Electronic Data Dissemination Division in Ottawa. Questions may arise, however, about the actual data stored on the CANSIM Time Series Data Base; questions about terminology, survey coverage and procedures, revision policy, etc. In these cases, you are advised to consult subject matter staff in the Inquiries List or in the appropriate section of the Directory Summary.

**SUMMARY OF DATABANK NUMBER RANGES** - This section provides ranges of databank numbers that have been assigned to subject areas for time series on the data base. A count of the number of series on the base within each range is also given.

**STATISTICS CANADA PUBLICATIONS** - This section lists the catalogue numbers of publications represented in the CANSIM Time Series Data Base.

**GLOSSARY OF TERMS** - A selection of terms is defined.

**ALPHABETICAL SUBJECT INDEX** - This is a subject index to the matrices which comprise the CANSIM Time Series Data Base. Main topics are in alphabetic sequence, with sub-groupings such as geography, industry, or commodity breakdowns indented for easy reference. Users should note that investigation of these sub-groups, in addition to the main alphabetic citations, should provide substantial references for a given topic or group of topics. For example, direct citations exist for GRAIN, but this item may also be found as a component of major topics such as Balance Sheet data and Concentration by Control statistics. In the development of this index, an attempt has been made to extract essential keywords from the matrix titles, as well as to offer, in some instances, a broad indication of series-level content. Users are cautioned not to rely totally on this Index however, and should also refer to the structured, subject matter oriented Directory Summary.

**VOLUME 11 - Active Matrices** - those matrices which are updated on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual basis.

**VOLUME 111 - Terminated Matrices** - those matrices which are no longer updated but remain on the base because of their historical importance.

## HOW TO USE THE DIRECTORY

Are the data I want on the CANSIM Time Series Data Base? It is not easy to structure a directory representing over 500,000 time series. The following suggestions may make your task much easier.

1. You know the subject area - go to the Directory Summary section listed in the Table of Contents. A quick review of this section will tell you if one or more matrices warrant detailed investigation. A matrix number followed by a "T" indicates that all the series in that matrix are terminated (discontinued); you will find that matrix in Volume III. Otherwise, some or all of the series in the matrix are active and you go to Volume II.

Example: You are interested in obtaining data related to income and expenditures of railways in Canada and you know that the Transportation subject matter area produces the statistics.

- In the Table of Contents, you find the transportation statistics are described under Section L of the Directory Summary.
- In Section L, two matrices (142 and 1431) relate to railway statistics;
- Go to Volume II: Series Directory, to locate the list of series. (A sample of Matrix 142 is part of the Introduction). It explains all the components of the directory listing.

2. You know the publication catalogue number - go to the Statistics Canada Publications section. A letter (A, B, C, etc.) associated with the publication number will direct you to the appropriate section. If you go to the Table of Contents, you will find the starting page number. Follow the procedure noted in number 1.

Example: You are interested in obtaining data relating to income and expenditures of railways in Canada and you are familiar with Publication Catalogue No. 52-003, Railway Operating Statistics.

- Go to the Statistics Canada Publication List, which is sorted sequentially by Catalogue Number.
- The list refers you to Section L of the Directory Summary.
- Refer to Section L, as in Example 1

3. You have a topic in mind and you are not sure which subject area is responsible for that topic. Consult the Index and assuming you find the subject, you may go directly to either Volume II (active matrices) or III (terminated matrices 142).

Example: You want to find data relating to income and expenditures of railways in Canada but you do not know the subject area nor the publication Catalogue number.

- Look for "Railways" in the Alphabetical Subject Index.
- It refers you to
  - Operating Statistics
  - Balance Sheet Data
- Operating Statistics, Railways refers you to Matrix 142. (See Volume II)
- Balance Sheet Data - Railways refers you to Matrix 5241. (See Volume II)

The source for a matrix will allow you to locate and review whether the same subject area has additional data of interest to you.

- The data source for Matrix 142 is Publication Catalogue No. 52-003.
- The Statistics Canada Publication List shows the data is produced by Transportation Division, and listed in (Section L).
- Section L lists the matrices relating to Transportation and Communications.

4. You know the Matrix number - if you know the matrix is active, go directly to Volume II. (The Directory is sequential, by matrix number.) If you know the matrix is terminated, go directly to Volume III. If you are not sure, go to the sequential matrix list at the beginning of either Volume II or III.

5. You still cannot find the series - call or FAX one of the offices listed immediately below for CANSIM Time Series information.

Data on taxable income, income taxes, and selected capital cost allowances for corporations are available for 37 major industries. There are also data on Government Finance, Employment and Payrolls.

Statistics derived from the application of the Corporations and Labour Union Returns Act, (CALURA) include information on major financial characteristics, degree of concentration and foreign control.

This section also contains the statistics used in the preparation of the Bank of Canada Review mostly made up of data series on activities of financial institutions and financial markets and some general economic and international statistics.

Construction statistics cover a wide spectrum of data, from the measure of output of the construction industry at its most aggregate level (National Wealth and Capital Stock) on through to its inputs (building materials) at a more detailed level. National Wealth and Capital Stock include annual estimates of the stocks and flows of fixed non-residential capital in Canada, Canada by major industries both in constant and current dollar valuation. Capacity Utilization Rates in manufacturing comparing output with capacity are available by major S.I.C. industry groups. Annual estimates of Capital and Repair Expenditures on construction for up to 70 different structure types, by province and industrial sector, are included. The results of the Investment Intentions Survey from about 24,000 respondents in Canadian businesses, institutions and others provide the estimates for total outlay for construction and for acquisition of producers' machinery and equipment. Housing starts, building permits and shipments of building materials complete the offering.

#### A. NATIONAL WEALTH AND CAPITAL STOCK 1970 SIC

These series represent annual estimates of the stocks and flows of fixed non-residential capital in Canada beginning with the year 1926. The data are published in **Fixed Capital Flows and Stocks**, (13-568), occasional.

The perpetual inventory method, which underlies the present estimates, uses annual investment expenditures, price deflators and estimates of service lives of the assets. The investment expenditures include adjustments and historical revisions made in the National Accounting System. The gross capital stock estimates are obtained by accumulating past investment expenditures less cumulative discards. Net stocks are calculated by adjusting the gross stocks for the physical deterioration and obsolescence they undergo during their service lives.

A comprehensive description of the perpetual inventory method is given in **Fixed Capital Flows and Stock - Manufacturing Canada 1926-1960: Methodology** (13-522), Occasional.

### B. CAPACITY UTILIZATION RATES IN CANADIAN MANUFACTURING, (31-003)

The definition of capacity in this procedure is the maximum output obtainable under normal technological and market conditions.

The methodology used to produce these indexes is based on a comparison of the actual output of an industry during a certain time period with the estimated capacity output during that period.

The estimated capacity output is based on a capacity capital-output ratio derived from the industry's gross stock of fixed capital, measured in 1986 or 1971 dollars. These capital stock estimates are produced by the National Wealth and Capital Stock Section of The Investment and Capital Stock Division of Statistics Canada. For concepts and detailed methodology, refer to **Capacity Utilization Rates in Canadian Manufacturing**, (31-003), Quarterly.

The capacity utilization rates are given by major group according to the 1980 Standard Industrial Classification, from 1971 quarterly.

## F. MANUFACTURING, ENERGY AND DOMESTIC TRADE

This section contains measures of Industrial Production Activities from the Census of Manufacturers and includes items such as value of shipments and orders, employment, wages, and the cost of materials and supplies. Details are provided here for individual manufacturing industries as identified by the Standard Industrial Classification System, and are available at the Canada, region, and province level.

Some production data are also provided. These include motor vehicles, refinery products, gas and utilities.

A summary of statistics from Energy, Mines and Resources representing data formerly presented in the Energy Statistics Handbook, principal statistics of mineral industries, and data from miscellaneous mineral industries is also presented in this section.

The results from the Survey of Retail Trade are presented here and include values of sales of goods by industry (S.I.C.) for Canada, values of sales of goods for some types of retail business by province, and department store sales and stocks by departments at the Canada level.

Also included in this section are the associated subjects of summary statistics on direct selling, values of inventories of wholesale trade, merchandising inventories and sales figures of new motor vehicles.

## B. 1. POPULATION PROJECTIONS FOR CANADA, PROVINCES AND TERRITORIES 1989-2011, (91-520)

These are Statistics Canada's most recent population projections for Canada, the provinces and territories. They supersede the previous ones which were released in 1985. They are generated by the Statistics Canada Population Projection Model (SCPM) using different hypotheses regarding future trends in fertility, mortality, immigration, emigration and interprovincial migration. Four series are presented here, from Projection 1 to Projection 4; the base population is the 1989 post-censal estimate population by age and sex. More information about the general methodology and assumptions is given in Population Projections for Canada, Provinces and Territories, 1989-2011, (91-520), Occasional (March 1990). Data on components of growth are also contained in the Publication (91-520) as well as extensions of these projections at Canada level up to 2036.

In addition, Statistics Canada's projection model is capable of producing customized population, household and family projections and simulations based on user-specified input assumptions. Requests for special projections for either one or more specified spatial units, population groups or components of growth will be considered on a cost-recovery basis.

## I. PRICES AND PRICE INDEXES

This section presents several measures of price levels and price movements. The most familiar item is the Consumer Price Index which is a measure of percentage change through time of the cost of a constant basket of goods and services representing the purchases made by a subset of the population in a specified time period. Also included in this section are the Industry Product Price Indexes for twenty major industries in the manufacturing sector. Construction Price Statistics contain price indexes of inputs into construction, contractors selling prices and special purpose aggregations of price indexes for construction machinery and equipment relating to specified categories of capital expenditures. The references list point to other sections containing additional specific price indexes.

## A. CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (62-001) (62-010)

Beginning with January 1989 the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is compiled using updated weights obtained from the 1986 Family Expenditure Survey. These weights replace those derived from the 1982 Survey which were used in the CPI during the period January 1985 to December 1988.

To maintain the continuity of the series for the All-Items index for Canada and for published urban centres as well as for other indexes representing varying levels of aggregation, the indexes produced using the 1986 weights are linked (or chained) to their respective counterparts obtained from the 1982 weights. December 1988 marks the link month, or the point in time, in which comparable indexes are merged.

With the release of the CPI for June 1990 the time reference base was changed to 1986 = 100 from 1981 = 100. Indexes initiated after 1986 will continue to carry their appropriate time bases. As a service to users the All-items indexes for Canada, the ten provinces and eighteen cities will continue to be updated and published on their previous 1981 = 100 time base. For the city of Victoria the previous time base was December 1984 = 100 and that for Whitehorse and Yellowknife was March 1982 = 100.

## K. SYSTEM OF NATIONAL ACCOUNTS

The System of National Accounts provides a conceptually integrated framework for the systematic recording of activities within the Canadian economy. The System consists of several parts. Data on Gross Domestic Product by industry provide measures of the output of each industry in the economy. The Income and Expenditure Accounts show how incomes are earned in the course of production and how they are spent. The Financial Flows Accounts comprise the aggregate records of financial transactions in the economy. The Balance of International Payments provides detail on our financial dealings with the rest of the world. The Input-Output Tables are a major integrating element of the system. They show the source of inputs and the purchasers of outputs by industry, and by final demand category. Aggregate Productivity Measures relate inputs to outputs, while Current Economic Analysis brings together selective indicators for evaluating the course and pattern of economic developments in Canada.

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**CANSIM - Canadian Socio-economic Information Management System:** Statistics Canada's official vehicle for the dissemination of information in machine-readable form.

**CANSIM Identifiers:** The combination of Matrix and Series numbers to identify series on the CANSIM Time Series Data Base.

**CANSIM Time Series Data Base:** The CANSIM Time Series Base contains more than 500,000 time series. This base is updated daily. Release of new data coincides with the official announcement of availability.

**CANSIM Time Series Directory:** A detailed guide to the data on the CANSIM Time Series Data Base. It provides the title, start date, source of the data and other descriptive information for each series. The Directory includes an index which serves to identify, at a fairly aggregate level, the contents of the data base. The index provides a key to the Directory and is the first step in locating data on the CANSIM Time Series Data Base. Purchasers of the Directory receive semi-annual information on changes to the Time Series content.

**Convertible Series:** CANSIM time series available in both imperial and metric units; designated by a "C" in the CANSIM Time Series Directory.

**Cross-Reference Index:** The CANSIM Time Series Cross-Reference Index contains a list of all of the DATABANK identifiers in the CANSIM Time Series Data Base and their corresponding Matrix and Series numbers.

**D Number - DATABANK Identifier:** A letter and a number to identify series on the CANSIM Time Series Data Base.

**Data base:** A collection of information stored in electronic form designed to allow for multiple applications to access the data.

**Distributor:** Privately owned computer service bureau licensed to offer public access to the CANSIM Time Series Data Base.

**EDDD - Electronic Data Dissemination Division:** A Division of Statistics Canada charged with the public dissemination of business, economic, social and census data in electronic form.

**Host Bureau:** The sole distributor with the right to offer public access to the complete CANSIM Time Series Data Base and to the CANSIM retrieval and manipulation software.

**IST - IST Computer Services Company:** The current host bureau for the CANSIM Time Series Data Base.

**Matrix:** A hierarchical grouping of CANSIM time series of an homogeneous conceptual, methodological and statistical nature; comparable to a table in a publication.

**PS - Part Secure:** This security designation means that some of the time series' observations are only available to the public with the approval of the Source.

**PU - Public:** This security designation means that the time series is published or publishable and is available to the public.

**Replacement Values:** Datapoints that are secure or not available for the time period requested may be replaced by zeros, or other values to distinguish them from real zeros.

**SE - Secure:** This security designation means that the time series is only available to the public with the approval of the Source.

**Series:** A collection of data observations for a particular concept or element; comparable to a column in a table; CANSIM time series are structured in a hierarchical format of totals and sub-totals called matrices.

**Terminated Series:** A terminated series is no longer updated; designated by a "T" in the CANSIM Time Series Directory.



**B) 1992 CANSIM Time Series Directory - Hard Copy**

The CANSIM Time Series Directory comprises three volumes:

Volume I: Summary

- a table of contents; an alphabetical subject index; contact phone numbers; and sources of additional data

Volume II: Active Matrices

- those matrices which are updated on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, semi-annual or annual basis

Volume III: Terminated Matrices

- those matrices which are no longer updated but remain on the Base because of their historical importance

Amendments to Volumes I and II will be issued on a semi-annual basis. Volume III will not be amended. This approach will alleviate considerably the problems associated with maintaining an up-to-date directory. This version costs: Canada: \$160<sup>\*</sup>; United States: U.S. \$180; other countries: U.S. \$200.
