


Preface

This publication is a directory to data sources in Statistics Canada which are not listed in the agency's annual catalogue of publications. As a companion volume to the catalogue, its purpose is to augment the information already available about Statistics Canada's products and services and how they may be accessed. The many references in the directory to data available on magnetic tape or by direct access to CANSIM, the agency's on-line data retrieval system, reflect the agency's continuing interest in meeting the needs of users for statistical information in machine-readable form.

The information presented in the directory has been obtained from staff within the data-producing divisions of Statistics Canada. Without their assistance the directory could not have been produced. The publication was planned and produced by Norman H. Hodge of the Business, Provincial and Municipal Relations Division. Liaison work and initial organization of material were carried out by Gloria Royce; manuscript preparation and subject index by Amelia Gomez.

Introduction

As indicated in the preface, this publication is a directory to data sources in Statistics Canada which are not described in the annual catalogue of publications. The information was supplied by project managers in the various operating divisions throughout the agency. Compilation therefore required dialogue with a large number of individuals, each following procedures in the handling and organization of data files best suited to their particular operation. As a result, the file descriptions included in the directory may vary somewhat in consistency of content and presentation. However, users of the book should find the descriptive material adequate as a first step in the identification of data related to their needs.

The directory is in two parts. The first part consists of the file descriptions arranged by subject with each file identified by title and by a unique index reference code. The second part is an index to the main subjects covered in the file descriptions.

Data Files

For the convenience of users, the directory is patterned on the *Statistics Canada Catalogue* in its subject structure. Chapter headings and subheadings are identical to those in the catalogue and are in the same order in the two publications, permitting the user to move easily from one to the other and to identify the full range of data available on a particular subject.

In similar fashion the first two digits of the index reference code match the first two digits of the catalogue number and are linked to the chapter headings (first digit) and subheadings (first and second digits). The Table of Contents provides a key to chapter headings and subheadings.

Three basic types of file are described in the directory: microdata, off-the-shelf tabulations and special request tabulations. Microdata files consist of unaggregated records of individual responses to bureau surveys, which have been carefully screened to ensure complete confidentiality (i.e. all records are non-identifiable). Selected data sets in this form have been pre-planned

and assembled on magnetic tape. These tapes, along with necessary documentation, permit the creation of tabulations on users' own computer systems.

"Off-the-shelf" tabulations are pre-planned in anticipation of demand for particular summary type data. The scope and detail of tabulations available in this form vary widely.

"Special request" tabulations are generated in response to specified requirements of individual users and usually involve some computer programming to produce them. As user-defined and not pre-planned, such tabulations from Statistics Canada databases offer an important source of information tailored to the needs of users.

The file descriptions contained in the directory are in the form of information profiles, each consisting of a title and up to 12 profile headings. Each heading provides information on an important aspect of the file. Although not detailed, the profile information is designed to permit a prospective client to decide if information from a particular file is likely to meet his or her need. However, before ordering, it is advised that the address or telephone number provided under the heading, "Contact" be used to obtain information on cost and availability as well as quality, confidentiality, delivery dates, or other conditions or restrictions which may apply to a specific data set. Charges for "special request" tabulations will generally be related to the volume and/or complexity of a particular request and will cover the costs of providing the service. Prices for other tabulations may be obtained on inquiry.

Title and Type

The products and services described in the directory begin with a title appearing in boldface at the top of each entry. One or more of the designations, "Microdata", "Off-the-shelf tabulations", or "Special request tabulations", appear just to the right of each title.

Source

Information under this heading generally indicates the origin of the data, i.e. where and how they were

obtained. Most often, data files originate from surveys conducted by Statistics Canada. Data collected for administrative purposes by other federal or provincial government departments are also frequent sources. Surveys carried out on a sample basis are so indicated.

Universe

The universe specifies the units (households, manufacturing establishments, individuals, institutions, etc.) to which the collected data relate. It usually includes a statement of the scope and/or limitations of the geographic coverage of the data bases.

Subject Content

This is a brief description of the most important variables (characteristics, attributes, activities, etc.) included in the file. No attempt has been made to list all the variables in full detail.

Geographic Coverage

The level of geographic detail available from a file is indicated here. For definitions of Statistics Canada standard geographic units, users are referred to the *1981 Census Dictionary* (Cat. No. 97 – 901) or the *Standard Geographical Classification*, *1981*, Vols. I and II (Cat. No. 12 – 568). For definitions of "region" (of Canada) and "economic region" (recently designated "subprovincial region") see the *Dictionary of the 1971 Census Terms* (Cat. No. 12 – 540). If data can be compiled according to user-specified areas this is indicated.

Additional Information

Information provided under this heading is an extension of subject content and usually indicates in what respect the data differ from that contained in publications.

Frequency and Time Span

This heading indicates the periodicity of the data, i.e. monthly, quarterly, annual, occasional, etc. and the time period covered (e.g. monthly, from 1975).

Size of File

An attempt is made here to give the prospective client some rough indication of what may be available from the file. The measures of quantity presented are: for microdata, the number of respondent records in the files; for off-the-shelf tabulations, the number of tabulations; for user-defined tabulations, the approximate number of variables.

Massaging of Data

This heading refers to additional services available from a number of the contacts listed in the directory in the form of special manipulations such as: calculation of percentages, averages, median, etc.; regression analysis and logarithmic or other transformations; model simulations or solutions. If manipulations of the data are available a general statement to that effect is included

under this heading. Massaging is not offered with microdata.

Mode of Dissemination

Computer generated or other print copy, magnetic tape, microfiche or microfilm, direct access via CANSIM and in rare cases handwritten copy are the modes used to provide the data referred to in this Directory. Microdata are provided exclusively on magnetic tape. Information under this heading specifies which modes are available for a particular file and supplies, where available, CANSIM matrix or table numbers identified with the file. Outputs from CANSIM are available in the form of computer printout, magnetic tape or fiche as well as directly through computer terminal. A brief note on the Canadian Socio-Economic Information Management System (CANSIM) is provided later in this introduction.

Reference Materials

This space records, where available, sources of material that could be helpful in the understanding, interpretation and use of data derived from a particular file. Included are such things as technical documentation particularly relating to magnetic tapes, concepts and definitions, survey methodology and research papers germane to the subject content of the file.

Related Publications

Publications listed here contain data related to the subject content of a particular file and in many cases produced from the same survey or other collection vehicle. The items listed are mainly publications either of Statistics Canada or of other federal government departments. Publications of Statistics Canada are listed with their title, originating division, language, frequency and 5-digit catalogue number.

Related publications will be found of value in determining what data have already been published on a particular subject and helpful in terms of technical notes, concepts and definitions, and examples of how data may be tabulated. Some of the Statistics Canada publications listed are not current and therefore do not appear in the most recent edition of the *Statistics Canada Catalogue* (described later under "Other Guides and Indexes").

Contact

Information under this heading provides for each file an address and telephone number to be used in requesting data or to obtain additional information. Names supplied will change but are felt to be useful nevertheless; up-to-date lists of names are available from the regional reference centres listed at the end of this introduction. The Statistics Canada divisions and sections are, of course, more permanent points of contact.

Canadian Socio-Economic Information Management System(CANSIM)

CANSIM is Statistics Canada's computerized data bank and information retrieval service. It provides detailed and timely statistical information to economists, statisticians, planners, analysts and academics in private and public sectors.

CANSIM contains the latest as well as historical statistical information. For example, Labour Force Estimates and the Consumer Price Index are available in electronic form on CANSIM on the same day they are released to the public and may be accessed simultaneously anywhere in Canada by terminal.

Business and economic statistics are available in a time series format, while social statistics and Census summary data have a cross-classified format showing various relationships at different points in time.

Secondary Distributors across Canada disseminate CANSIM data according to Statistics Canada guidelines. They offer a choice of software, telecommunications networks and technical support services. Also, CANSIM Division and the regional offices of Statistics Canada provide consulting and over-the-counter services on a cost recovery basis.

Recent CANSIM initiatives utilizing advanced technologies make access possible via TELIDON terminals for graphic display and charting, for instance with the dynamic

TELICHART system, via micro computer and via electronic messaging systems.

Other Guides and Indexes

The annual Statistics Canada Catalogue describes all current publications available for purchase from the agency, as of January 1, each year; it excludes publications with data more than 10 years old, titles discontinued prior to the reference year of the Catalogue and out-of-print items. A Supplement updating the Catalogue is released in mid-year. One set of the Catalogue and Supplement (one English copy and one French copy) is provided to an organization at no cost. The Catalogue can be ordered from Statistics Canada, Ottawa, K1A OT6, or from any Statistics Canada regional reference centre.

Statistics Canada publishes numerous other guides and indexes to assist users. A companion to the *Statistics Canada Catalogue* is the *Historical Catalogue of Statistics Canada Publications*, 1918–80 (Cat. No. 11 – 512E). Other valuable publications are, 11 – 513E, the *Bibliography of Federal Data Sources Excluding Statistics Canada*, 1981 and 11 – 515, *Index to Municipal Data*, 1982.

A number of publications listed in the Statistics Canada Catalogue may also assist users in locating needed statistics and in keeping up-to-date with new releases. They include the Statistics Canada Daily (11 – 001E), Infomat (11 – 002E), New Surveys (11 – 006), Listing of Supplementary Documents (11 – 207), The Standard Industrial Classification (12 – 501E), The Standard Occupational Classification, 1980 (12 – 565E), The Standard Geographical Classification, 1981 (12 – 567), The Canadian International Trade Classification (65 – 502E) and Guide to Federal Government Labour Statistics, 1979 (72 – 512).

Other reference aids include: Statistical Information on Transportation Available from Federal and Provincial Governments, Statistical Information on Municipalities Available from Provincial and Territorial Governments, and the Directory of Health Division Information. For further information on these products, please contact any Statistics Canada regional reference centre.

Statistics Canada also publishes a number of materials designed to assist in the accessing and use of data. Among these are Finding and Using Statistics, How a Manufacturer Can Profit From Facts, How a Retailer Can Profit From Facts, How Contractors and Builders Can Profit From Facts, How Communities Can Use Statistics,

Understanding Labour Force Data, and Your Guide to the Consumer Price Index. Each is available from regional reference centres.

Statistics Canada Advisory Services

The agency has nine regional offices and a Central Inquiries Service in Ottawa. Offices offer the following services:

Inquiry Service: Answers requests for statistical data by telephone, letter and from visitors; provides a collection of all Statistics Canada's recent publications as well as certain historical ones for public reference; offers tabulations of certain unpublished data and other selected government statistical publications for public reference; provides visitors with study areas.

Professional Consultation Services: Assists both experienced and inexperienced users with data problems; advises on arranging direct access to CANSIM and other machine-readable systems; provides feedback to Statistics Canada on the statistical needs and problems of users.

Data Distribution and Promotion Service: Takes orders for all Statistics Canada publications and related material such as census maps and microfiche; retrieves data directly from CANSIM; provides public copying facilities for printed materials and microfiche; arranges displays to promote the use of statistical data.

Education Service: Provides booklets on finding and using statistics and distributes copies of the *Statistics Canada Catalogue* of publications; holds workshops and seminars for users on subjects of special interest on request; visits educational institutions to speak on statistical subjects, on request; arranges local training courses on statistical subjects, such as basic questionnaire design, and sampling techniques.

Data Collection Service: Arranges for the design, management and implementation of surveys for governments, institutions and private agencies; advises on all aspects of information gathering.

13.1 Income, Assets and Debt – Microdata

Source

The sample Survey of Consumer Finances conducted by Statistics Canada in 1977.

Universe

Economic families and unattached individuals living in private dwellings in Canada, excluding the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Indian reserves.

Subject Content

Data are shown for 11 component sources of family assets, including total bonds, cash on hand, registered retirement savings plans (RRSPs), registered home ownership savings plans (RHOSPs), market value of passenger cars and owner-occupied homes. Nine component sources of family income are also presented, including earnings and total income for family head and spouse; family characteristics such as status vis-à-vis low income cutoffs, number of earners, life cycle and tenure; and personal and labour-related characteristics of family head and spouse, including age, education, labour force status and occupation. In addition, data are provided for three component sources of family debt – consumer debt, personal debt and mortgage outstanding on owner-occupied home – as well as data on total net worth.

Geographic Coverage

Codes are given for regions and size of area of residence categories with the following populations: 100,000 or more, 30,000 – 99,999, 15,000 – 29,999, urban less than 15,000, and rural areas.

Frequency and Time Span

The tape covers income received in the 1976 calendar year and assets and debts in the spring of 1977.

Size of File

12,734 records.

Mode of Dissemination

Tape only.

Extensive documentation is provided with each tape, including a questionnaire facsimile, a description of each variable, the non-catalogued report *Evaluation of Data on Family Assets and Debts* and the record layout.

Consumer Income Divisional Master File – Special request tabulations

Source

The sample Survey of Consumer Finances conducted by Statistics Canada.

Universe

Economic families, census families and income recipients 15 years and over are surveyed. Each universe is derived from a sample of Canadian households living in private dwellings, excluding the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Indian reserves.

Subject Content

For each universe 16 component sources of income are available as well as total income and income after tax. Personal and labour-related characteristics of individuals and family members are shown including age, sex, education, immigration status, occupation and weeks worked. Family characteristics such as tenure, life cycle, number of earners and number of children are also included.

Geographic Coverage

Provinces and five size of area of residence categories: over 500,000, 100,000 to 499,999, 30,000 to 99,999, less than 30,000 and rural. Specific large urban areas can be tabulated individually or in groups depending upon their sample size.

Frequency and Time Span

Biennial data, from 1965 to 1969; annual data, from 1971. The sample sizes for 1980, 1978, 1976, 1974, 1972, 1969 and 1965 are smaller than for other years.

Size of File

Approximately 65,000 income recipients, 37,000 economic families and 39,000 census families are on file. For each family or income recipient, there are about 50 variables available for cross-classification.

Mode of Dissemination

Computer printout and tape.

Massaging of Data

A variety of services are available, including data transformations and regressions.

Source

A sample survey conducted by Statistics Canada.

Universe

Economic families, census families, individuals 15 years of age or older with income and individuals with earnings. Each universe is derived from a sample of Canadian households living in private dwellings, excluding the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Indian reserves.

Subject Content

These tabulations show percentage distributions of each universe by major source and composition of income; by demographic characteristics including number of persons, age of head, sex of head and mother tongue; by labour force characteristics, including unemployment of family members, wives' earning status, full-time or part-time status by age, sex, province, education, occupations, etc.; by incidence of low income; and by special analysis runs containing quintiles and Gini coefficients.

Geographic Coverage

Provinces and size of area of residence categories with the following populations: urban with 500,000, urban with 100,000 – 499,999, urban with 30,000 – 99,999, urban with 15,000 – 29,999, small urban areas and rural areas; and one table on selected metropolitan cities, including St. John's, Halifax, Hamilton/Burlington, London, Kitchener/Waterloo, Winnipeg, Calgary, Edmonton, Vancouver and Victoria.

Additional Information

Most of the information in this file appears in Statistics Canada publications but with fewer income groupings (see Related Publications listed below).

Frequency and Time Span

Biennial data, from 1965-69; annual data, from 1971.

Size of File

Approximately 140 tabulations.

Mode of Dissemination

Computer printout.

Universe

Census families and persons not in families living in private dwellings in Canada, excluding the Yukon, the Northwest Territories and Indian reserves.

Subject Content

Data are shown for 14 component sources of family income and for earnings, transfers and total income of head of family and spouse. Family characteristics such as number of family members, number of children, number of earners, life cycle and tenure are also given. In addition, personal and labour-related characteristics of the head and spouse, including age, education, mother tongue, labour force status and occupation are provided.

Geographic Coverage

Codes are given for provinces and size of area of residence categories with the following populations: 100,000 or more, 30,000 – 99,999, urban less than 30,000, and rural areas.

Frequency and Time Span

Biennial data, from 1971. Income is that received in a calendar year.



The census is taken every five years, on the years ending with a one or a six. The censuses taken on the one years (e.g. '61, '71, '81) have included more questions than those on the six years (e.g. '56, '66, '76). These differentiations may change as society's need for data expands. Only the 1971, 1976 and 1981 data bases are accessible for special tabulations.

The 1971 file contains some 145 variables, the 1976 file – 55 and the 1981 file – 224. Each of these files contains in excess of 20,000,000 separate records.

The following geography tape files are available:

The "Enumeration Area Conversion File, 1976 – 1981" lists "geographically equivalent" 1976 and 1981 Census of Canada enumeration areas (EAs) by province and has been prepared to aid users in the comparison of 1976 and 1981 Census data at the EA level. An "Enumeration Area Conversion File, 1971 – 1976" is also available.

The 1981 "Geography Tape File" assigns each collection unit (namely enumeration areas) to all higher geographic levels by code and name for Canada. It includes EA centroids (in Universal Transverse Mercator, Lambert,

latitude and longitude co-ordinates), the standard geographical codes, the population and household counts. Also available for 1971 and 1976 censuses.

The "Land Area Files" including 1976 and 1981 population are available at the following geographic levels: census subdivision (CSD), census division (CD), census tract (CT), and provincial census tract (PCT). Land area refers to area measurement in square kilometres and excludes, whenever feasible, large bodies of water. Also available for 1976 with 1971 and 1976 population data.

The 1981 "Place Name Master File" lists census division, census subdivisions and all unincorporated places for which 1981 population was reported. Information given includes Standard Geographical Classification codes, census codes, type of place, location in latitude and longitude, census map number and population. For unincorporated places, a breakdown of population by enumeration areas is also given. Also available for the 1976 Census.

The "CARTLIB Files" are digital cartographic libraries of the boundaries and related features of various geostatistical areas, stored on magnetic tape for use by computer mapping programs.

A CARTLIB file for 1981 is available at the census tract (CT) level for 12 census metropolitan areas (CMAs): Calgary, Edmonton, Halifax, Hamilton, Montréal, Ottawa-Hull, Québec, Regina, St. John's, Toronto, Vancouver and Winnipeg. One type of tape file defines the boundaries of these areas, and another acts as an index for the boundary files and lists additional information for each area, such as land area, population, geographic codes, names, and centroids. The index file is included with the boundaries, or can be purchased separately. Similar files are available for the 1971 and 1976 censuses.

A CARTLIB file is available at the census division (CD) level (including counties, regional municipalities, regional districts, etc.). The file contains the boundaries of the 266 CDs, as well as the provincial and territorial boundaries.

A CARTLIB file will be available at the federal electoral district (FED) level, based on the 1976 Representation Order. The file contains the boundaries of the 282 FEDs, as well as the provincial and territorial boundaries.

The 1981 "Area Master Files" (AMFs) contain a logical representation of all city streets and other selected features (such as railroad tracks, rivers, and municipal boundaries) in machine-readable form. The AMFs geographically reference every street, address range, block-face and centroid co-ordinate in the coverage area. An AMF is available for most centres with a population of 20,000 or more. Also available for 1971 and 1976 censuses.

The 1981 "Street Index File" links address ranges to enumeration areas for large urban centres. The file includes street name, type, direction and odd and even address ranges, as well as Standard Geographical Classification codes. Also available for 1971 and 1976 censuses.

The "Postal Code Conversion File" links the postal code to the Standard Geographical Classification code for selected urban centres.
