

### PREFACE

This is the third edition of the Standard Commodity Classification which was first published in 1955 and later revised in 1959.

Standardization of definitions and techniques in the gathering and compilation of statistics is an important function of a central statistical office such as Statistics Canada. Standard classification systems are vital instruments for co-ordinating data obtained from different sources. The Standard Commodity Classification is the second in a series of standard classifications published by Statistics Canada.


The revised manual provides new commodity classes which reflect the technological developments and product innovations which have accumulated since 1959. Obsolete classes have been deleted and a number of commodity descriptions have been updated. The basic structure of the 1959 Standard Commodity Classification, however, remains unchanged.

The more detailed companion references, Volume II, Numerical Index and Volume III, Alphabetical Index, will be issued at a later date. These volumes list a large number of commodities which in numerical order help to define the commodity classes and in alphabetical order help to code individual commodities.

The present revision has been carried out under the direction of the Central Classifications Staff following consultations with subject-matter specialists involved in collecting data and commodity analysts within Statistics Canada. Officials in other Federal departments, provincial governments, trade associations, and individuals in private business also contributed. The assistance of everyone involved in the revision is gratefully acknowledged. Responsibility for the final contents of the manual, however, rests with Statistics Canada.



# INTRODUCTION

This revised Standard Commodity Classification is the result of work over the last four years by a committee of Statistics Canada personnel. It is intended to serve as a standard for all statistical work related to commodities, such as; external trade statistics, statistics of shipments, production and materials used, transportation (freight), inventory statistics, retail sales, price series, and any others to which it is applicable. It is so designed that the resulting data can be converted easily to the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification. It should be noted that, particularly in certain sections of the list, the classification as drafted does not contain as detailed a listing of classes as may be required for some purposes. Some 5,900 separate classes are specified and the working committee felt that this degree of detail would meet present requirements for comparable commodity data from the various sources in Canada.

#### Structure of the Classification

A brief description of the classification structure and the main reasons underlying the choice of this structure may assist in its application. All commodities are grouped under five main sections: I. Live Animals; II. Food, Feed, Beverages and Tobacco; III. Crude Materials, Inedible: IV. Fabricated Materials, Inedible: and V. End-products, Inedible. Some codes have been reserved at the end of the Classification for the special needs of operating agencies.

Live animals were assigned a separate section because of their unique character as commodities. The practice commonly followed is to divide animals into two main categories: those chiefly for food (included with food) and those not chiefly for food (a category very difficult to place and which usually ends up in some ''Miscellaneous' category). Such a classification presents a number of difficulties, the principal one being the arbitrary nature of the distinction according to purpose (i.e., principally for food and other) when like animals must be included in the same group. Such animals as sheep, poultry and horses may be used for food or otherwise and, particularly in trade statistics, the end use of a shipment of animals may be somewhat obscure. The individual user of the data may decide whether or not for his particular purposes, some live animals should be included with the food total. (For obvious reasons live fish and other seatoods, except those for propagation and those commonly sold as pets. are classified with food.)

Food, Feed, Beverages and Tobacco are established as a separate section because of the continuing interest in this category as a separate entity in trade statistics, production and related statistical series, and price series. The further sub-division of the commodities in this section provides groupings easily convertible into crude materials, fabricated materials, and end-products. The creation of a separate section for foods involves some difficulties but on the whole the consequences are not serious. For example, some products such

as grains may be used for purposes such as the manufacture of industrial alcohol, while some oils and fats not classified with food in this classification may, when refined, be incorporated in a food product. Beverages and tobacco are not large categories and are traditionally associated with food in a classification such as this.

Commodities other than live animals, food, feed, beverages and tobacco are grouped into three main sections: Crude Materials, Inedible; Fabricated Materials, Inedible; End-products, Inedible. This three-way split should not be identified with the customary stage of production grouping into raw materials simply transformed and more elaborately transformed articles. The three-way classification serves a number of purposes, the most important being:

- (a) It is a framework within which the various principles of classification can be utilized to the best advantage in a logical and consistent manner. The main criteria by which commodities can be classified are: "chief component material", "'purpose" and "origin" (in that order of importance, although the first two are of approximately equal value to the classifier). Ignoring "origin" as being of considerably less significance, the criterion of component material is most applicable to crude materials and materials in process. In the case of end-products, however, the component material criterion has become increasingly less useful in recent years as alternative materials and mixtures of materials have been incorporated into finished articles. There is every indication that this tendency will continue with new uses being discovered for old materials, new materials coming into use and technological changes resulting in new combinations of materials. Thus, in the body of this classification the principle of component material has been used mainly in classifying crude materials and fabricated materials whereas endproducts are classified principally on the basis of their use or function.
- (b) It provides a framework that is not subject to fundamental change because of the introduction of new materials or new uses for old materials. Regardless of changes in processes or materials there will always be crude materials, fabricated materials, and end-products. This should result in stability in the structure of the classification over a long period of time.
- (c) For many analytical purposes the distinction between crude materials, fabricated materials, and finished articles is useful. This is particularly true because of the flexibility introduced into the "end-products" section by the application of the principle of "purpose" to a much greater extent than heretofore, resulting in smaller "n.e.s." (not elsewhere specified) classes and more meaningful division and group headings. At the same time, crude materials represent mainly the products of extractive industries while fabricated materials and end-products are a result of manufacturing activity.

The nature of the three-way split mentioned above may be more fully understood with a few words of explanation. The concept of "crude materials" is fairly clear. It includes raw products and those that have been subjected to preliminary processing for the purposes of cleaning or ease in shipping, e.g., cotton ginning, wool scouring, ore milling. In addition, waste and scrap materials which are used mainly as crude materials are included in this section.

Similarly, the identification of "end-products" is not too difficult. This section consists of articles rather than materials, i.e., finished commodities that are usually dealt in and thought of in terms of units, dozens and similar measures as against the pounds, tons, barrels and similar quantity designations usually applied to materials. In practice, of course, a great deal of controversy could develop regarding the proper allocation of specific items but if it is accepted that anything which forms a part of something else (except machine parts and accessories which are most usefully classified with the appropriate machine) or is commonly incorporated into something else in a further production process is a material, and that anything which retains its individual identity (even though it may be used for further production) is an endproduct, little serious difficulty is found in allocating items. The working committee found it useful at this stage to refer back again and again to the difference between a nail and a needle. The nail is of no use by itself; it becomes useful only in connection with other materials and then it has lost its identity as a nail by being incorporated with those other materials into something quite different from any of them. The needle, on the other hand, is used with other materials but emerges from that function as a needle useful again for the same purpose. In this sense the nail is a fabricated material and the needle an end-product.

When crude materials and end-products have been identified, fabricated materials remain. Under this definition there are fabricated materials (such as sawn lumber and cotton yarn) which have undergone rather simple processing, and others (such as metal windows and nylon fabrics) which are the result of complicated industrial processes. Yet they have in common the characteristics of materials, i.e., they will be involved in further processing before reaching the form in which their end use is served.

For some purposes it may be desirable to classify commodities in a different manner from that shown in the main body of the classification. For example, in the case of ores, statistics on their metallic content are needed for most purposes and so in the main classification it is the metallic content of ores which is classified. For transportation statistics, however, it is the ore itself which is classified and to meet this need the AppendixI of this classification provides an alternative classification, the letter A has

been included in the code for each class. The classes in the alternative classification have not been included in the alphabetical index.

#### **Coding System**

The coding does not adhere strictly to a decimal system because this would have required more than the five digits used. Limiting the code to five digits reduces the risk of error in using numbers and decreases the work involved in punching and otherwise transcribing code numbers. Insofar as possible, however, the code number consisting of five digits distinguishes sections, divisions, and groups by unique combinations of the first three digits with the additional two digits identifying the commodity class. Thus the first digits 0 and 1 identify Live Animals and Food, Feed, Beverages and Tobacco; 2 indicates Crude Materials; 3 and 4 Fabricated Materials; and 5 to 9 End-products.

In general, logically contiguous classes within a group have been listed consecutively regardless of alphabetical considerations. Where there is sufficient space related items within a group are assigned the same fourth digit, so that, in effect, sub-groups are created. Where no other arrangement seems preferable, the classes within a group are arranged alphabetically. Wherever possible, code numbers are reserved so that classes can be added.

## Implementation of the Classification

The intention of the first Committee on Commodity Classification was that the Standard Commodity Classification would be used as it stood, with coders assigning the 5-digit codes of the Standard to the commodity descriptions that were encountered. This turned out to be impractical because of disclosure problems, coding resource restrictions, inadequacy of some source documents and the fact that certain commodities are rarely encountered in any given source of data (exports of bananas and other tropical fruit for example).

What has evolved is that users create classifications from the Standard to meet a particular situation. Thus one finds a commodity classification for exports, for example, which provides about 1,200 categories for the commodities exported from Canada. There categories are drawn from the 5,900 classes of the Standard. In the commodity fields where Canadian exports are very important the categories match the classes of the Standard or even subdivide other classes. Where Canadian exports are not particularly significant the categories are defined as a condensation of the classes in the Standard. In a similar way, commodity classifications related to the Standard have been created for imports, cargo loaded and unloaded from ships, rail freight, and the materials used and shipments by manufacturers.

An advantage in these related classifications is that they provide an opportunity to test the viability of new commodity categories before they

are incorporated into the Standard. On the other hand, the condensation and sub-division of the Classes in the Standard can create confusion when the code numbers in a related classification do not agree with the code numbers in the Standard for the same commodities.

#### Companion Volumes

Two companion volumes will be published later. A classified index, Volume II, Catalogue 12-515 will provide lists of examples of commodities included under each class. All of the commodity classes and examples are arranged alphabetically in Volume III, Catalogue 12-516. In the longer range it is intended to publish a set of explanatory notes which will provide the rationale behind the structure of each group and definitions in narrative form to supplement Volumes I and II.

The Committees on Commodity Classification have been fortunate in receiving the ready cooperation of a large number of different individuals, industry and trade associations, and representatives of business firms. It would not be possible to list

all of those who have contributed to some degree in the development of this classification. The preparation or revision of a standard commodity classification for a rapidly developing economy, such as that of Canada, is no easy task. In addition to the requirements for commodity data in general economic analysis, the increasing use of statistics by industrial and trade associations and business firms must be taken into account. For many of these purposes detailed information is required on relatively small groups or classes of commodities, while for others the broad picture is most appropriate. At the same time the structure of the classification must be such that it can be expanded where necessary and can be adapted otherwise to changing technological and other circumstances. In order that all of these considerations could be taken into account, and the views of a wide variety of users be brought to bear on the classification, various drafts were given wide circulation. At the same time it must be made clear that the Committees made the final decisions as to what classes could or could not be separately designated. Thus, omissions or errors in the classification are the responsibility of the Committees.



#### APPENDIX I

#### ALTERNATIVE CLASSIFICATION FOR DIVISION 25

### METALLIC ORES, CONCENTRATES AND SCRAP METALS

Note: For statistics of tonnages mined, transported, etc.

Division 25 of the Standard Commodity Classification is intended for use in cases where the primary interest is in the metallic content of the ore. For some purposes, such as statistics of tonnage of ore mined or quantities of ore transported, the primary interest is in the ore itself and for such purposes this alternative classification may be used.

This takes a different approach to the classification of metallic ores, dealing with the ore itself rather than with its metal content. For example, if an ore bears both nickel and copper, it would be classified under the alternative code as "25A 2 13, nickel-copper ore". Under the main code, the nickel content would be classified as "25 5 10, nickel in ores and concentrates" and the copper would be classified as "25 3 10, copper in ores and concentrates".

The whole of division 25 is rearranged, with the result that different code numbers have been given to some classes, such as steel scrap, which are not directly affected by the change in definitions. It is assumed that those who work with the alternative classification would probably use it for the whole of division 25. Since the numbers in the alternative classification are identified by the letter A, it would be possible to continue to use the standard code numbers for classes which have the same definitions under both classifications. These are indicated by giving the standard code reference in parentheses after the class designations.



Note: Volumes 1 and 2 of the Standard Commodity Classification were published as official documents for general application in 1959. In the following 4 years a few minor amendments were made. These amendments were printed as insert pages for Volume 1 and were available on request but relatively few of the manuals that had been distributed were updated. In 1963, Volume 3, an alphabetical index, was published and it included all of the amendments. In 1966 Volume 1 was reprinted and all of the changes up to 1963 were incorporated in the reprinted manual. Actually, no more than 1 % of the 1959 codes were affected by the amendments up to 1963. There were no amendments after that date. For comparison in this table the 1959 edition amended to 1963 was used.

(2) Photographic chemicals, 91700 in the 1959 Standard Commodity Classification have been deleted from the revised classification on the grounds that a relatively insignificant portion of photographic chemicals are traded in retail sized packages, identified as photographic chemicals. The bulk of the photographic chemicals are traded under their chemical names. The 1959 class will be covered by a variety of classes in divisions 40, 41 and 42 of the revised classification.

(3) A new group was created for engine filters because of a significant volume of trade in these commodities. Furthermore, a great similarity exists between filters used on different engines, even to the extent of a certain interchangeability of the same type of filter among different engines. Engine filters were formally classified as engine parts, however, and therefore the new group must be drawn from whatever classes included engines or engine parts. Because these classes are so widespread in the classification the references to former classification were restricted to group codes.
