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# GUIDE TO THE INDUSTRIAL STATISTICS OF THE INDUSTRY AND MERCHANDISING DIVISION

JANUARY, 1959

This guide was designed to assist users of the Division's publications who may wish to compile annual data according to the sub-groups of the standard industrial classification. This classification is laid down in the *Standard Industrial Classification Manual* published in 1948, and it is currently being revised.

The Industry and Merchandising Division compiles statistics in a number of major groups of the standard industrial classification. These consist of all major groups in the divisions of mining, manufacturing and trade, together with the major groups, logging, fishing, business service and personal service. All industries within these groups are listed in this guide. Information is given on any annual reports which give statistics for these industries individually. In the case of the merchandising and service trades, monthly publications are also listed, and in addition to the material outlined in this memorandum, this sector is covered fully in the Decennial Census of Distribution.

In the case of mining or manufacturing, an industry is recorded as covered individually if the principal statistics of the industry are published as such, or can be built up from published material. The principal statistics of a manufacturing industry consist of data on the number of establishments, the number of employees and their earnings, the cost of fuel and electricity used, the value added by manufacture, and the selling value of factory shipments. In the case of mines, the principal statistics consist of data on the number of establishments, the number of employees and their earnings, the cost of fuel and electricity used, the cost of process supplies and containers, the net value added by processing, and the gross value of production. The fact that principal statistics are prepared for an industry does not, of course, necessarily mean that any other statistics are.

In the case of the merchandising and service trades, an industry is recorded as covered individually if the value of sales is available. Other relevant information available for the industry as such is also recorded in some cases.

Some industries are not covered individually in publications. In some cases, such as photography, there are no statistics collected. In other cases, such as rubber footwear, the statistics for the industry may be merged with those of another; in this case, tires, tubes and other rubber products.

This guide replaces *Guide to Publications of the Industry and Merchandising Division which Delimit Sub-Groups of the Standard Industrial Classification*, which was issued as a working manual in July, 1957. It is designed to be used in conjunction with *Guide to the Commodity Statistics of the Industry and Merchandising Division*. In that manual, the contents have been arranged so that the principal products of different industries follow each other, so far as is practicable, in approximately the same order as the industries concerned follow in the standard industrial classification.

The presentation of data in this manual is based on individual industries and publications. The first column of each line gives the standard industrial classification code for an industry. This is a three-figure number in all cases. In the "remarks" column, some four-figure industry codes are given. These are from a more detailed breakdown of the S.I.C. which is used within the Industry and Merchandising Division. With one exception (noted on page 21 of this text) the first three figures are those of the S.I.C., and the fourth indicates a sub-group made by the Division.

The second column gives the name of the industry, and also gives the names of main groups of industries as headings. The third column states whether significant data covering the whole industry can be obtained from published material.

The fourth column gives the list number used in *Current Publications* for the publication containing the data. This pamphlet, which is obtainable free of charge from the Information Services Division, gives the prices of publications and explains how to order them. Reference to *Current Publications* might also reveal the existence of monthly or other relevant series listed near the item concerned.

The fifth column gives the title of the publication containing the data. Where a publication covers more than one industry, the portion of it relevant to the industry concerned is indicated in column six. Publications which are referred to more than once are marked with an asterisk.

The seventh column contains any necessary remarks. It also indicates in which of the Division's subject-matter fields the statistics concerned are included. Against the title of the major group is given the name of the field primarily concerned. Unless otherwise stated, all industries within a major group are handled in the field so named.



Within the Industry and Merchandising Division there is a statistician responsible for each subject-matter field.

*Guide to Publications of the Industry and Merchandising Division Which Delimit Sub-Groups of the Standard Industrial Classification* contained references to the nine sections by which the Division was organized. The field previously covered by the Animal Products Section has since been distributed between two other fields—Foods and Beverages, and Textiles and Miscellaneous Products. The field previously covered by the Merchandising and Services Section has been divided into two new fields—Retail Trade, and Wholesale Trade and Services. The field previously covered by the Forestry Section has been divided into two new fields—Forestry, and Wood and Paper Products. Of the present fields, four are the responsibility

of sections which handle both the subject-matter and the operation of the surveys. These are Forestry, Fisheries, Minerals and Inventories. The remaining six fields each have a statistician responsible for subject-matter, the operations being pooled. These six fields are Foods and Beverages, Metal and Chemical Products, Textiles and Miscellaneous Products, Wood and Paper Products, Retail Trade, and Wholesale Trade and Services.

The use of this manual by anyone who is working from the standard industrial classification is self-explanatory. It can also be used by the reader of an annual publication to find out how its contents are related to the S.I.C. Care is, however, necessary in this case, because one publication may be mentioned several times in connection with different industries. The asterisk indicates the need for caution in such a case.
