

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
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

This publication, the Guide to Statistics Canada's Programs and Products 1991, describes Statistics Canada's survey activities and statistical programs. It will be useful to respondents of Statistics Canada's surveys and to users of the agency's statistical output.

The publication draws upon information supplied by the various Divisions of Statistics Canada and maintained by Standards Division in a data base described as the Statistical Data Documentation System. This is the first time that selected information from the data base has been published. The information provided includes the frequency, coverage, contents and products of the various programs. The publication covers surveys or statistical programs, undertaken in 1990, most of whose outputs will have been released during 1990 and 1991. It also provides some information about new surveys undertaken in 1991. The majority of Statistics Canada's programs are ongoing, and more recent information can be obtained from the contact names provided.

This guide has been published by Standards Division, Shaila Nijhowne, Director. 




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#### INTRODUCTION

#### BACKGROUND

Statistics Canada assembles a vast array of statistical data for which it carries out a number of activities. Surveys are conducted, statistical data are assembled, analysed and compiled and information is disseminated in a variety of ways. For the most part, Statistics Canada's users are aware of only a fraction of its programs or who to contact for general or detailed information about these programs.

For some years, the Standards Division of Statistics Canada has maintained an information data base, the Statistical Data Documentation System (SDDS), detailing the over 400 surveys and statistical programs of Statistics Canada. For each of these, there is available a standard set of descriptive information.

It is from the SDDS that some items of information have been extracted for this publication, Guide to Statistics Canada's Programs and Products 1991. The content of the data base is extremely detailed. For this publication it has been possible to reproduce only a few items of description of the surveys and statistical programs, to indicate some of the main topics covered by them and to list the products through which the data compiled by them are disseminated. The information selected for inclusion gives an indication of the nature and content of the different statistical programs and the availability of data produced by them. The name and telephone number of a contact person is provided from whom additional information about the program can be obtained.

#### CONTENTS OF THIS PUBLICATION

The information contained in this publication is about Statistics Canada's surveys and statistical programs, that is, the activity of collecting or assembling, processing and disseminating statistical information.

The information in this publication is organized into six major subject area groups. Related statistical programs are grouped together under broad types of information themes such as national accounts programs or institutional and social statistics programs. Within each of the six major subject area groups, information is again grouped by subjects, each of which has been given a two digit number. The activities are described in terms of surveys or statistical programs, each of which has a unique four digit SDDS identifier.

The subject area groups bear a relationship to the organisational structure of Statistics Canada; however, though they might appear to do so, the six broad groups do not correspond precisely to the higher level organisational structure of Statistics Canada. For example, the activities of Public Institutions Division are described under the subject area, Institutions and Social Statistics, rather than the System of National Accounts, to which the Division belongs in the organisation structure.

At the next level there are four Divisions within the organisational structure of Statistics Canada whose programs can be found in more than one of the subject areas. The programs carried out by the National Accounts and Environment Division are described under three subject areas, National Accounts, Financial Flows and Environment. Similarly, the surveys undertaken by the Industry Division are described under the subject areas Manufacturing, Energy, Construction, Wholesale and Retail Trade. The programs described under the subject areas Education, Culture and Tourism are carried out by one Division of that name. The activities of the Services, Science and Technology Division are described separately: Services under the higher level group called Business Statistics, by Industry, and Science and Technology under Business Statistics, Total Economy. The name of the Division responsible for the survey or statistical program is provided in the documentation.

#### LIST OF SURVEYS AND STATISTICAL PROGRAMS

The surveys and statistical programs described in this publication are listed under the two digit subject area to which they belong in a table on page xix. The list provides an overview of the surveys to be found under the various subject areas. The most important surveys in the subject area are usually listed first. The remaining surveys are generally ordered or grouped by the main topics covered by them.

For ease of reference, the title of each survey or statistical program carries the identification number by which information relating to it can be found in the publication. A full description for surveys carried out during 1990, can be found in the section Survey Documentation. Titles of new surveys carried out for the first time during the latter half of 1990 or in 1991, are preceded by an asterisk and listed in italics at the end of each two digit subject area. For these, more limited information can be found in the separate section at the end entitled Survey Documentation - New Surveys.

#### SURVEY DOCUMENTATION

This section of the publication contains the description of the surveys and statistical programs. The contents have been arranged in numerical order, in a structured format. The table of contents shows the six major subject groups. The two digit numbers, also shown in the table of contents, indicate the order in which the surveys or statistical programs have been grouped into subject areas for the publication. Each survey or statistical program has a unique four digit SDDS number which has been appended to the two digit number. In the publication, the surveys and statistical programs are arranged consecutively by SDDS number under each subject area to which they belong.

The Division which is responsible for the program is shown with the name of the contact person. The use of the structure codes for information retrieval will be discussed further, below.

#### SURVEY DOCUMENTATION - NEW SURVEYS

A limited number of items of information are provided for these surveys. Again the surveys are arranged consecutively by SDDS number under the subject area to which the survey belongs.

#### SURVEY DOCUMENTATION - DEFINITION OF CONTENT

The items of information about each survey or statistical program, which are provided in the publication are identified and defined in this section. The definitions enable the user to understand what information has been provided about Statistics Canada's surveys and statistical programs. An asterisk indicates which items of information have been provided for new surveys. It should be noted that when an item does not appear in the description of the statistical activity it is because that item of information is not applicable or has not been reported for that program.

In the documentation, after the description of the survey or statistical program, the main topics covered by the program are listed in order of importance. The phrases, "by data detail" or "data detail", are used to indicate that data on this topic are available for many more categories than it has been possible to mention in the list of topics. For further information, the user can look up the publications or get in touch with the contact person.

#### INDEX

An important feature of this publication is the alphabetical index. The index allows the user to identify a survey or statistical program by its title (in italics) or by the main topics covered by the surveys or statistical programs. The six digit structure code, shown after the title or topic in the index, guides the user to information on the statistical program through which data are collected, compiled, analysed and disseminated.

### Example:

#### Eggs, production, stocks and sales; 31-3421

The first two digits of this entry from the Index direct a user interested in information on eggs, whether production, stocks or sales to section 31 of the Guide. The remaining four digits are the SDDS identification number for the survey or statistical program. In section 31 of the Guide, the user will find the entry:

## 31-3421 Egg Production Report

The header, Agriculture, in the upper left hand corner, identifies the information grouping. The number 31 identifies the information section within the guide and represents the two digit structure code. The six digit code combines the structure code and the SDDS identifier and is followed by the name of the survey or statistical program. The applicable information for the survey Egg Production Report would be found here.

The index allows the user to identify the survey, program, or group of programs that collect and compile data relating to the subject in which the user may be interested. Whereas the index does not list every element or topic for which data may be available within Statistics Canada, by making it possible to find a survey program or group of programs within which the users interests lie, further enquiries can be addressed to the contact person and Statistics Canada Division responsible for the programs.

Survey titles that carry an asterisk (\*) are new surveys for which the more limited information is carried in the section entitled Survey Documentation - New Surveys.

#### **USERS AND USES**

This publication is intended to assist users in identifying the various statistical programs of Statistics Canada and their outputs. The Guide contains selected information about surveys and statistical programs conducted by Statistics Canada in 1990 and some information about new surveys undertaken in 1991. The majority of Statistics Canada's statistical programs remain the same from period to period, except for minor modifications to the questionnaires; however, each year there are a certain number of occasional surveys that are taken only once and a few surveys may be discontinued and new ones started.


The publication, Overview of Special Surveys, is a source of up to date information about occasional surveys taken by the Special Surveys Group of the Household Surveys Division and described in section 62 of the Guide under Household Surveys. It is produced by and available from the Manager, The Special Surveys Group, Household Surveys Division, Statistics Canada, 5 D5 Jean Talon Building, Tunney's Pasture, Ottawa, Ontario, K1A 0T6.

Surveys and statistical programs collect data directly from respondents with the help of questionnaires, they draw upon data collected for administrative purposes and they derive new data by bringing data from various sources together. Information provided under the item entitled Data Collection Method(s) identifies the surveys that use questionnaires to collect data. For more precise information with respect to the data items collected by the survey, and to examine what changes have occurred in the data collection program of the survey, this Guide can be used in conjunction with the publications entitled Index to Statistics Canada Surveys and Questionnaires (QI) Catalogue no. 12-205 to identify the questionnaires used by the statistical programs and Statistics Canada Questionnaires on Microfiche, Catalogue no. 12-205M to examine their content. For ongoing surveys, examination of the questionnaires in subsequent years allows the user to remain abreast of the subject matter content of the surveys and therefore of the possible availability of data. The questionnaires reproduced on microfiche can be related to a survey by means of the SDDS identifier and survey title to be found in the Index (QI).

This guide to statistical programs and products does not include all of Statistics Canada's catalogued publications. It does not, as yet, cover the programs that produce certain compendia, classifications and reference products nor many of the analytical papers and studies published by Statistics Canada. For a complete listing of catalogued publications and an index to their contents, readers are referred to the Statistics Canada Catalogue, Catalogue no. 11-204. Used in conjunction with one another, the Guide provides general information with respect to the main topics covered by the survey or statistical program and its products and the Catalogue provides specific information with respect to the content of each catalogued publication, mentioned in the Guide. In reverse, for the catalogued publications mentioned in the Guide, the Guide enables readers to find the statistical program or survey from which the information contained in the catalogued publication is derived.





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

This statistical program produces annual and quarterly estimates of the National Income and Expenditure Accounts consisting of consolidated production and capital finance accounts and detailed Income and Expenditure Accounts for sectors of the Canadian economy - households, businesses, governments and non-residents.



# 13-1201 Environment Statistics

This program produces a core set of statistics relevant to the analysis and assessment of the national state of the environment. These data are compiled largely from secondary sources and include socio-economic statistics on physical changes in the environment.

#### MAIN TOPICS:

Environmental stress and response statistics

Environmental geography, biophysical statistics on physiography, vegetation, soils and surface materials, climate, and area, by drainage basin and by ecozone

Population and population density by major drainage area, and by ecozone

Population, socio-economic profile, by ecozone, by demographic and labour force characteristics

Renewable resources: harvesting, exploitation, environmental stress and response statistics on agriculture, forestry and fisheries, by major drainage area and by ecozone

Non-renewable resources: exploration, extraction, depletion and human response statistics on metals and non-metallic minerals, and on fossil fuels, by ecozone

Flora and fauna species, by designated status of survival

Environmental restructuring and development of land, water systems, transport networks and major economic resources, by major drainage area and by ecozone

Waste residual generation: pollution loading, environmental quality and human response statistics, by activity category as source of environmental stress, by major drainage area and by ecozone

Wildlife and natural resources: biotic state and environmental stress and human response statistics, by type of contaminants in biota, by ecozone

Environment, collective and individual perceptions, attitudes and responses, and government actions to improve, protect and conserve the quality of environment and natural resource base in Canada

#### NOTES:

The system is being expanded to include an environmental data base reference system for the Federal Government. Information on approximately 400 data bases will be held in the system. Data are extracted from various sources - Census surveys, Electrical Power Producer Statistics, Air quality information. The system will also contain new environmental data coming from new surveys collected in conjunction with the following: Household Surveys, Public Institutions, Industry, and Capital Expenditures.

#### **ID NUMBER \***

A unique 6-digit identifier. The first and second digits identify the Major Information Groups and the Divisional/Sectional groups. The final 4-digits identify the survey or statistical program.

### TITLE \*

The name of the statistical activity including common abbreviations in parentheses (e.g. LFS, SEPH).

#### DESCRIPTION

A brief descriptive overview of the statistical activity.

### MAIN TOPICS

A list of some of the principal data or categories of information covered by the survey or statistical program.

#### NOTES

Any additional information regarding the activity which has not been covered elsewhere.

## START DATE \*

The first period for which the statistical activity produced data.

#### DATA COLLECTION METHODS

The percentage of respondents by type of data collection method used: self completion; interview; other methods.

### TYPE OF SURVEY

Census: the collection of information about every unit of the target population (e.g. Census of Population).

Sample: the collection of information on a statistically selected representative subset of the target population.

### **REFERENCE PERIOD \***

The period for which the data are collected and/or compiled (e.g. calendar year, fiscal year, quarter, month, specific day of the month).

### **FREQUENCY** \*

The frequency of the statistical activity.

### **COLLECTION PERIOD**

The period during which the survey is in the field. This field does not apply to information collected from administrative sources.

### TARGET UNIVERSE

The coverage of the statistical activity in terms of its target population.

### POPULATION SIZE

The number of statistical units in the target population (i.e. universe).

#### STATISTICAL UNITS

The unit of observation, the name of the entity about which statistical observations are made. Note that it is not necessarily the same as the entity from which data are collected or for which statistics are tabulated.

### GEOGRAPHIC COVERAGE

The geographic area(s) covered by the statistical activity.

### GEOGRAPHIC CODING OF MICRO DATA

The geographic codes assigned to the micro record of each statistical unit (unit of observation).

### SIC COVERAGE

The industry(ies) covered by the statistical activity, identified in terms of the Standard Industrial Classification and its vintage.

### OTHER COVERAGE CLASSIFICATION(S)

The coverage in terms of other recognized classification(s) or standard(s).

#### RELEASE TIME

The period of time following the reference period of the data that is usually required before the data are released to the public.

### GEOGRAPHIC UNITS DISSEMINATED

The geographic units used for the dissemination of statistics.

### CANSIM MATRICES

Indicates that data produced by the statistical activity are available on CANSIM.

#### CANSIM CROSS-CLASSIFIED

The CANSIM cross-classified data base numbers which contain data produced by the statistical activity.

### PUBLICATIONS (CATALOGUED)

The catalogue number of the Statistics Canada publication(s) used in disseminating data.

### PUBLICATIONS (NON-CATALOGUED)

The titles of any non-catalogued publication(s) which are issued under the responsibility of Statistics Canada and which contain data and/or data interpretation related to the statistical activity, e.g. research papers, reports, analytical studies, etc.

### OTHER PUBLICATIONS

The titles of any publications of departments and agencies other than Statistics Canada, including non-government organizations, through which data and/or data interpretation related to the statistical activity are regularly disseminated.

### REFERENCE DOCUMENTS

The names of any documents which give information about the concepts, definitions and methodology of the statistical activity which can be made available to data users. When such a document is catalogued, only the catalogue number is indicated.

### MICRO DATA PRODUCTS

Indicates the availability of micro data.

### OTHER STATISTICAL DATA PRODUCTS

Indicates the availability of other unpublished statistical data.

## SOURCES FOR CUSTOMIZED PRODUCTS

Indicates the availability of <u>customized</u> products and some information relating to the variables available.




