#### Introduction.

The following survey shows in statistical tables and diagrams the world trade in barley in the calendar years 1927 to 1934.

The first five pages of the report contain figures taken from the annual reports of the International Institute of Agriculture for the years 1927 to 1933. For the calendar year 1934, the figures were taken from the "Monthly Crop Report and Agricultural Statistics" issued at Rome, Italy and are of a preliminary nature. Tables published from page twelve to the end of this report are based on the Trade Returns of the various countries and show slightly different results, but are fairly comparable.

The gross world exports show a large decline in the years 1932, 1933 and 1934, when compared with the previous five calendar years and the five-year average. Both British Empire and Foreign country exports indicate the same marked reductions. The above decreases were due to the efforts of importing countries to increase production in all grains.

Canada is the leading barley exporting country in the British Empire and Roumania the chief exporter of the foreign countries. The exports from these countries show large decreases in the last three years as compared with the previous five years (1927-31). Argentina is the one country showing consistently increased exports during the last three years,

World imports of barley show large decreases in the last three years, as compared with the previous five years and the five-year average 1927 to 1931. British Empire imports have been fairly consistent amounting to 25,851,027, 39,578,242 and 36,735,000 bushels respectively in the years 1932, 1933 and 1934 as compared with the five-year average (1927-31) of 34,965,486 bushels. Foreign country imports show large reductions, declining from the five-year average of 144,374,930 bushels to 105,424,030 bushels in 1932, 84,019,457 in 1933, and 91,358,000 in 1934.

The Chief importer of British Empire countries is the United Kingdom, averaging 33,601,828 bushels for 1927 to 1931. A large decrease is noted for 1932 in comparison with the previous year, but increases are shown for the years 1933 and 1934. Of the foreign countries Germany is the greatest importer with a five-year average of 74,092,908 bushels. German imports totalled 21,965,643 and 10,806,841 bushels respectively, for the years 1932 and 1933, while in 1934 the total import was 25,352,000 bushels.

The Netherlands, with a five-year average of 18,421,267 bushels is second in rank of importers, while Belgium follows, with an average of 16,495,940 bushels. These two countries increased their imports in the past three years.

Switzerland and Austria show increased barley imports in 1932, 1933 and 1934 over the five-year average. All the other foreign countries, Italy excepted, tended to decrease their imports. Italian imports increased 417,921, 644,774 and 2,167,452 bushels in 1932, 1933 and 1934 respectively over the five-year average 811,548 bushels.





#### GROSS EXPORTS WORLD-180,076,215 BUSH. GROSS




# GROSS IMPORTS WORLD-179,340,416 BUSH.





# GROSS EXPORTS WORLD - 122,974,684 BUSH.




# GROSS IMPORTS WORLD-131,275,057 BUSH.





# GROSS EXPORTS WORLD-124,902,520 BUSH.




GROSS IMPORTS WORLD-123,597,699 BUSH.





#### United Kingdom

The United Kingdom, second largest importer of barley in the five-year period (1927-31), ranked first in the three years following. The five-year average import amounted to 33,605,127 bushels compared with Germany's average of 73,260,155 bushels. British Empire countries contributed only 12.9 per cent of the import into the United Kingdom and foreign countries 87.1 per cent. Canada was the largest exporter among British Empire countries suppling 8.6 per cent of the total import. The largest contributions among foreign countries came from the United States, Russia, Roumania and Persia which supplied 29.7, 16.7, 8.3 and 8.1 per cent respectively.

The total imports of barley in 1932 decreased from 33,605,127 bushels, the five-year average (1927-31) to 23,742,939 bushels. British Empire countries supplied 28.4 per cent of this total, Canada being the chief contributor. Foreign countries supplied 17,008,-409 bushels or 71.6 per cent, Russia, United States, Persia and Roumania supplying the largest quantities.

In 1933 barley imports into the United Kingdom increased, the total quantity amounting to 37,297,822 bushels. At the same time British Empire imports decreased from 28.4 in 1932 to 8.9 per cent in 1933. Canada contributed only 5.2 per cent. The imports from foreign countries amounted to 33,981,638 bushels or 91.1 per cent, of which 24.5 per cent came from Russia, 19.5 per cent from Roumania, 17.4 per cent from the United States, 9.8 per cent from the Argentine and 8.9 per cent from Persia. Minor amounts were received from other foreign countries.

According to preliminary figures for 1934 total barley imports into the United Kingdom were slightly below those of 1933, amounting to 36,317,393 bushels. Imports from British Empire countries totalled 5,493,387 bushels or 15.1 per cent and imports from foreign countries 30,824,006 or 84.9 per cent. Canada contributed 8.8 per cent of the total import and the other principal countries were Persia, United States, Roumania, Russia and Chile, the percentages supplied being 21.4, 15.4, 7.6, 5.1 and 5.0 respectively.

The average production in the United Kingdom during the five years 1930 to 1934 was 37,572,048 bushels. The estimated production in 1935 was 32,545,000 bushels.

The British Preferential Tariff is accorded to goods which are Canadian or British Empire products within the meaning of the Imperial preference regulations of the United Kingdom and which are consigned direct from a part of the Empire to that country.

The General Tariff applies to products of all countries outside the British Empire. It would also apply to Empire products not fulfilling the Imperial preference regulations.

#### Irish Free State

The five-year average imports of barley into the Irish Free State amounted to 773,668 bushels, of which 367,627 bushels were received from British Empire countries. Average contributions were from Canada, 138,260 bushels and British Africa, 140,827 bushels. Minor amounts were shipped from the United Kingdom, Northern Ireland and other British Countries. Foreign imports averaged 406,041 bushels. The United States contributed 258,996 bushels, while Argentina, Chile, Roumania and the Netherlands forwarded smaller quantities.

In 1932, 898,800 bushels were imported. This amount came almost wholly from British Empire countries. British Africa forwarded 714,756 bushels and Canada 153,486 bushels. Foreign countries' imports were only 11,587 bushels. The total import of barley for 1933 receded to 412,764 bushels. The British Empire is credited with shipments of 272,764 bushels. Canada contributed 158,666 bushels and Northern Ireland 101,682 bushels. The foreign country import amounted to 140,000 bushels received from the United States. Imports for 1934 are not available to date.

The average production of barley in the Irish Free State for the five-year period 1930 to 1934 was 5,374,656 bushels.

Barley entering the Irish Free State is free from all countries, but a license is required for the importation of barley.

#### Malta.

Importation of barley into Malta is rather small. The average import for the five-year period, 1927 to 1931 was 293,312 bushels. The greatest contributors were Roumania, Tunis and Syria. Imports from foreign countries averaged 284,090 bushels for the above-mantioned period. Barley imports for 1932 totalled 300,586 bushels received from Roumania, Syria and Turkey. In 1933 imports into Malta amounted to 498,974 tushels supplied, for the most part, by Turkey, Roumania and the Soviet Republics. Decreases in barley imports were noted in 1934, and totalled 391,762 bushels. Turkey was the largest exporter in that year.

Production of barley in Malta averaged 267,133 bushels for the five-year period, 1930 to 1934. Estimated barley crop in 1935 was 136,000 bushels.



#### Palestine

Imports of barley into Palestine were small until 1931 when 775,905 bushels were imported, the bulk of which came from Syria. During the five-year period, the average imports were 170,873 bushels. Foreign countries contributed 167,150 bushels viz., Syria.

In 1932 barley imports increased to 608,896 bushels, practically all of which came from foreign countries, Turkey and Roumania being the largest exporters.

In 1933 imports amounted to 1,140,638 bushels, of which 767,397 bushels came from Turkey, 124,285 bushels from Egypt and 123,029 bushels from Syria.

The average production of barley during the period of 1927 to 1930 amounted to 1,831,448 bushels.

#### Germany.

Germany is next to the United Kingdom in the quantity of barley imports, and is the third largest producer exceeded by Russia and the United States. During the five-year period 1927 to 1931 an average of 73,260,155 bushels was imported. The German imports of barley decreased considerably in the year 1932 amounting to only 21,965,643 bushels. In 1933 imports receded to 10,806,841 bushels, but increased to 25,354,532 bushels in 1934.

Foreign countries supplied most of Germany's import. For the five-year period (1927-31) 60,156,522 bushels were received from countries outside the British Empire. The chief countries were Roumania, 22,836,780 bushels; United States, 13,286,937 bushels; Soviet Republics, 7,785,206 bushels; the Argentine 6,575,380 bushels; and French Africa including Morocco, 3,649,431 bushels.

The British Empire contributed an anverage of 13,103,633 bushels in the five-year period (1927-31). Of this total, Canada averaged 11,640,789 bushels, while British India was credited with 1,099,592 bushels. Minor amounts were shipped from United Kingdom, Australia, Irish Free State and other African countries. In the year 1932 only 503,422 bushels came from British Empire countries comprised of 233,938 bushels from British India, 220,127 bushels from Canada and a small amount, 49,357 bushels, from Australia. In 1933 British Empire contribution receded to 109,159 bushels, all of which came from Australia. Only 9,783 bushels were received from Australia and Canada in 1934. Foreign country imports were reduced from a five-year average of 60,156,522 bushels to 21,462,221 bushels in 1932, and 10,697,682 bushels in 1933. Imports in 1934 increased to 25,344,749 bushels. The chief countries forwarding barley to Germany for the past three years were the Soviet Republics, Argentina and Roumania. Minor amounts were received from Poland - Danzig, Czechoslovakia, Denmark, United States, the Netherlands and Persia.

The average production of barley in Germany during the five years 1930 to 1934 was 144,819,897 bushels. The barley crop for 1935 has been estimated at 155,524,000 bushels.

#### The Netherlands.

The average imports of barley into the Netherlands amounted to 18,436,636 bushels for the five-year period from 1927 to 1931. Of this quantity 4,522,388 bushels came from British Empire countries. Canada was the chief contributor totalling 4,230,191 bushels. Imports from foreign countries averaged 13,914,298 bushels, of which Roumania supplied 4,122,638 bushels; Soviet Republics 2,807,124 bushels; United States 2,356,512 bushels and the Argentine 1,861,563 bushels. Minor amounts came from Germany, Belgium-Luxemburg and Other countries.

During the year 1932, 18,095,036 bushels were imported. A total of 3,584,423 bushels came from British Empire countries and 3,539,780 bushels from Canada. Foreign countries contributed 14,510,613 bushels, received chiefly from Roumania, Soviet Republics and the Argentine.

In 1933, total imports into the Netherlands amounted to 22,652,472 bushels of which 22,632,211 bushels were received from foreign countries. Argentina supplied 8,087,642 bushels, Roumania 7,611,852 bushels; the Soviet Republics 5,187,794 bushels and smaller amounts were received from the United States, Germany, Belgium-Luxemburg and Other countries.

In 1934, barley imports were 16,020,977 bushels, of which only 574,956 bushels came from Canada and an equal quantity from British Empire countries. Imports from foreign countries were 15,446,021 bushels. Argentina supplied 11,149,598 bushels, Roumania 1,559,697 bushels and the Soviet Republics 591,285 bushels. Minor amounts were received from Germany, Belgium-Luxemburg and Other foreign countries.

The average production of barley during the five years 1930 to 1934 was 3,301,897 bushels. The estimated production for 1935 has been placed at 5,094,000 bushels.

#### Belgium - Luxemburg

Imports of barley for the five-year period 1927 to 1931 averaged 16,484,974 bushels, of which British Empire countries contributed only 1,964,563 bushels. The amount received from Canada was 1,503,311 bushels. Foreign countries forwarded on an average 14,510,411 bushels. The largest amounts were received from Roumania, Poland-Danzig and the United States. Smaller quantities were received from the Netherlands, French Morocco, France, Chile, Argentina and Algeria.

In 1932, Belgium-Luxemburg increased her imports of barley over the five-year average (1927-31) of 16,484,974 bushels to 19,540,489 bushels. Imports from the British Empire amounted to 2,940,780 bushels, while 1,023,366 bushels were exported from Canada and 1,917,414 bushels from Australia. Imports from foreign countries totalled 16,599,709 bushels. Chief contributors were Roumania, Poland-Danzig, Republics of the Soviet and United States.

The 1933 total import of barley was 18,805,646 bushels, of which 2,033,715 bushels came from the British Empire (viz., Australia), No imports were recorded from Canada. The amount imported from foreign countries was 16,771,931 bushels, chiefly from Roumania, Poland-Danzig, the Argentine and Soviet Republics.

The total import in 1934 amounted to 17,367,797 bushels, only 708,268 bushels received from Australia and British Empire countries. Imports from foreign countries were 16,659,529 bushels. The largest quantity was shipped from Poland-Danzig, amounting to 6,170,501 bushels. Imports from the Argentine and Chile were 2,890,743 and 2,103,539 bushels, while smaller quantities came from Roumania, the Netherlands, the Soviet and other countries. The average production of barley in Belgium for the five-year period (1930-34) was 4,397,872 bushels, while the estimated production for 1935 has been placed at 4,887,000 bushels.

#### France.

The five-year average importation of barley into France was 8,064,558 bushels. Australia was the only British country from which France imported barley. Imports from this country for 1930 and 1931 amounted to 127,577 and 637,801 bushels respectively. In 1932 barley imports into France amounted to 20,467,805 bushels, a substantial increase over the five-year average. Most of this large import came from foreign countries as follows:- French Morocco, 6,290,614 bushels; Roumania, 3,764,105 bushels; Tunis, 2,957,274 bushels; Belgium-Luxemburg, 2,631,240 bushels; and Poland, 1,781,313 bushels; and other countries 2,651,325 bushels. A small amount, 183,262 bushels, was received from Algeria. In 1933, 11,101,572 bushels of barley were imported of which only 197,515 bushels came from Australia. Imports from foreign countries amounted to 10,904,057 bushels forwarded chiefly from French Morocco, Poland and Tunis. In 1934 the barley imports decreased to 6,895,207 bushels. Only 6,871 bushels were received from Australia. The foreign country importation amounted to 6,888,336 bushels, supplied in the main by French Morocco, Algeria, Argentina and Poland.

The average production of barley in France during the period 1931 to 1934 was 49,004,877 bushels. Estimated barley production in 1935 was 49,288,000 bushels.

The import of barley into France and Algeria is subject to quota restrictions established September 16, 1932. Canada, under the Additional Protocol to the Franco-Canadian Trade Agreement signed February 26, 1935, is guaranteed an allotment of 1 per cent of the total French quota on barley. The total quota on barley for brewing purposes in the first quarter of 1935 was fixed at 100,000 metric quintals of which 1,000 metric quintals (4,583 bushels) was allotted to Canada. The total for the second and third quarters combined was 10,000 quintals of which Canada obtained 100 quintals (458 bushels). Provision is made for increasing the quota up to four times. No quota was accorded to any country for barley other than for brewing in this period.

#### Denmark.

Denmark imported barley averaging 10,264,238 bushels in the five years 1927 to 1931. Of this amount 679,178 bushels came from British Empire countries, the United Kingdom being the chief contributor. In 1932 imports dropped to less than one-half of the five-year average. A further decrease took place in the years 1933 and 1934, the total import amounting to 3,906,236 and 2,450,659 bushels respectively. British Empire imports also decreased in the last three years.

Imports from foreign countries during the five years 1927 to 1931 averaged 9,585,059 bushels, the largest quantities coming from Germany, Russia, Roumania and Poland-Danzig. In 1932 foreign imports were reduced to almost one-half the five-year average, while in 1933 and 1934 imports were further decreased to 3,774,732 and 2,340,793 bushels respectively. The four countries mentioned above were the chief sources of import. Poland-Danzig was the only country increasing barley imports into Denmark during the last three years. The average production of barley in Denmark during the five year period(1930-34) was 45,251,776 bushels.

Free under ordinary tariff but under Grain Law of August 3,1935, an import tax may be imposed based on domestic fixed prices and foreign prices. Under this law 3.50 kroner per 100 kilogs (43½ cents per 100 lbs. at par) was at first imposed on imported barley. On August 19, 1935, the tax was increased to 4.45 kroner per 100 kilogs (54 cents per 100 lbs. at par).

Krone is converted at 26.8 cents.

A law of December 6, 1932, restricting general imports to control exchange was made applicable on April 6, 1933 to barley, thus it is necessary for Danish importers of barley to obtain an import exchange permit.

#### Switzerland.

The average imports of barley into Switzerland during the five-year period (1927-31) were 4,312,971 bushels, of which 470,919 bushels were received from the British Empire countries. Canada contributed 380,967 bushels, Australia 60,995 bushels and other British countries 28,957 bushels. Imports from foreign countries amounted to 3,842,052 bushels. The chief contributors were Roumania with 1,831,143 bushels, Hungary 472,691 bushels, Poland 285,422 bushels, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics 258,136 bushels and United States 220,565 bushels. Other contributors were Argentina, Czechoslovakia, France, Austria, Yugoslavia.

In 1932 barley imports increased to almost double the five-year average amounting to 8,224,402 bushels with only 670,219 bushels coming from British Empire countries. Canada forwarded 610,059 bushels and Australia 60,160 bushels. The greater amount, 7,554,183 bushels, came from foreign countries. The chief countries forwarding barley were Roumania with 3,797,432 bushels, Argentina 1,027,697 bushels, Czechoslovakia 966,518 bushels, Hungary 838,343 bushels and Union of Soviet Socialist Republics 694,599 bushels. Smaller amounts were received from France, Poland, Syria and United States.

In 1933 imports decreased to 5,659,215 bushels, 31,867 bushels coming from Canada and Australia. Foreign countries supplied 5,627,348 bushels. Roumania forwarded 3,038,254 bushels, Hungary 1,768,622 bushels, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics 371,987 bushels and Czechoslovakia 339,395 bushels. Smaller amounts were received from Argentina, Poland, and France.

During 1934 barley imports amounted to 5,995,601 bushels all coming from foreign countries. Roumania was the chief contributor with 3,307,622 bushels, while Yugoslavia forwarded 715,148 bushels, Czechoslovakia 460,744 bushels and Poland 337,755 bushels. Other foreign countries forwarding barley were Argentina, Hungary, Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, France and Austria.

The average production of barley in Switzerland was 550,471 bushels. The estimated production for 1935 was 459,000 bushels.

#### Austria

Austrian imports of barley were comparatively small in the five-year period (1927-31) averaging only 3,451,313 bushels. In 1932 imports increased to 3,669,758 bushels with a further increase to 4,114,679 and 5,521,910 bushels in the years 1933 and 1934, supplied entirely by foreign countries.

British Empire imports average only 1,655 bushels during the five-year period, all of which came from Canada, while foreign countries averaged 3,449,658 bushels. Czechoslovakia, Hungary, and Roumania were the chief foreign contributors. In 1932, the increased import came from Czechoslovakia. In 1933 Czechoslovakia, Hungary and Roumania contributed almost equal quantities, while in 1934 the total import came from Roumania.

The Tariff on barley imports into Austria is as follows:-

Graded seeds (called elite and original seeds) for obtaining sowing seeds, may be imported free or partly free of duty, on an authority to be granted in each case by the Federal Minister of Finance in concurrence with the Federal Minister of Agriculture.

Gold krone (1.83 schillings) is converted at 35 cents.

There is a turnover tax of 2 per cent and a rrises tax of 2 per cent both calculated on official average values.

Importations of all kinds of barley are prohibited entry into Austria except under license.

There is a license tax of 9 schillings per 100 kilogs (80 cents per 100 lbs.) on barley for cattle feed.

#### Norway.

Norway imported an average of 1,517,491 bushels of barley during the five years 1927 to 1931, and the British Empire contributed only 134,193 bushels of this import. Canada's contribution was 130,943 bushels. Foreign countries forwarded 1,383,298 bushels, Russia contributing 412,597, Denmark 272,037 and Germany 200,149 bushels while smaller amounts came from Argentina, United States and other countries. In the years 1932, 1933 and 1934 barley imports showed a decided falling off owing to increased home production. The amounts were 872,360, 573,719 and 409,334 bushels respectively in these years. The bulk of these imports came from foreign countries, chiefly from the Argentine, Denmark and Russia.

The average production of barley during the five-year period 1930 to 1934 was 4,893,160 bushels.

According to the tariff, barley imports are admitted free, but a Norwegian Grain Law of June 22, 1928, placed the importation of grains, including barley, under Government control.

#### Italy.

Barley imports into Italy have increased in the last three years. The average import for the five-year period (1927-31) amounted to 811,548 bushels, practically all of which came from foreign countries. The chief sources of these imports were Czechoslovakia, Roumania, Hungary and Turkey. For 1932, barley imports increased to 1,299,469 bushels. The chief exporters were Turkey, Roumania, Czechoslovakia and the Soviet Republics. Increases in barley imports were also noted in 1933 and totalled 1,456,322 bushels. The sources, in order of importance, were Turkey, Roumania, the Soviet Republics, Tripoli, Hungary and Czechoslovakia. In 1934 barley imports were double those of the previous year and amounted to 2,978,278 bushels. Imports were forwarded from Turkey, Tripoli, Soviet Republics, Belgium, Czechoslovakia and Hungary.

The average production for the five years 1930 to 1934 was 10,675,729 bushels. The estimated production for 1935 has been placed at 9,356,000 bushels.

There is a Sales tax of 2.5% levied on the c.i.f. value of the goods.

An Italian Royal Decree Law effective February 19, 1935, placed practically all imports into Italy on an import quota basis. A circular of the Superintendent of Foreign Commercial Exchanges effective July 1, 1935, fixed the quotas for import during the period from July 1 to September 30, 1935. In the case of barley the quota is fixed at 30% of the imports during the corresponding period of 1934. Importers must obtain permits from the Italian authorities before they can import.

An Italian Law of May 13, 1935, provides for a license tax of 3% ad valorem on all goods whose importation is subject to a license or import permit.
