Expenditures by Canada's mineral industries on capital equipment, process supplies and certain other items, such as electric power, outgoing freight, insurance, advertising, engineering fees, patents and royalties amounted to about $\$ 234.4$ millions in the calendar year 1949. The more important items were as follows, in millions of dollars: coal and coke, 22.7; outgoing freight and express, 22.3 ; mine and mill machinery except electrical equipment, 21.5 ; lumber and timber, 12.6; pipe and plumbers'supplies, 11.6; explosives, 10.1; electric motors, batteries, etc., 9.2; workmen's compensation, 7.6; building materials 6.6; and fuel oil, 5.3.

The base metals industry, including mining, smelting and refining, reported expenditures amounting to $\$ 105.1$ millions, which was 45 per cent of the total for the entire mining industry. Gold mines spent \$42.1 millions for these specified purposes and coal mines, oil wells and gas wells spent \$41.1 millions. The structural materials producers, including cement mills, stone quarries, lime kilns, brick plants and sand and gravel pits, showed disbursements of $\$ 26$ 'millions and other non-metal industries, such as asbestos, gypsum, etc., reported expenditures at $\$ 6.9$ millions. Purchases by iron ore mines totalled \$13. 2 millions.

Expenditures by mines in Ontario totalled $\$ 104.8$ millions in the period under review; this was 45 per cent of the total for all Canada. Corresponding disbursements by mines in other provinces were as follows, in millions of dollars: Quebec, 38.5; British Columbia, 27.6; Alberta, 24.2; Manitoba, 17.4; Nova Scotia, 14.5; Newfoundland, 2.3; Yukon and Northwest Territories, 2.0; Saskatchewan, 1.9; and New Brunswick, 1.1.

These figures represent the results of a spectal survey made by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the mining industry. Late in 1948 all mining firms were sent a copy of the proposed questionnaire and were requested to endeavour to keep accounts of expenditures in 1949 for each of the 53 items on the schedule. The response was good for the metal mining section of the industry, but a few important concerns in the fuels and nonmetals sections failed to submit reports. It is estimated that the specified expenditures as given in this report should be increased by five per cent to allow for amounts spent by non-reporting mines. Disbursements, amounting to $\$ 6.7$ millions, by contract drillers are not included in this report.

The last survey of this nature was made in 1937, when total expenditures for machinery and process supplies totalled $\$ 130.3$ millions.
