SPECIAL BULLETIN on the CONSUMPTION OF SUPPLIES BY THE CANADIAN GOLD MINING INDUSTRY, 1937.

Canadian gold mining companies paid over 40 millions of dollars in 1937 for consumable stores, equipment, electric power, fuel, freight, and insurance, according to a bulletin just issued by the Mining, Metallurgical and Chemical Branch of the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. This is an increase of 40 per cent when compared with the figure for 1935, the last year in which a similar survey was made.

The following table gives details of the purchases made in the various provinces and indicates clearly the market for the countless items required by this growing Canadian industry.
