CENSUS OF MEKCHANDISING AND SERVICE ESTABLISHMENTS, 1931.
HOTEL OPERATIONS IN CANADA, 1930
This bulletin presents the final results of the Census of Merchandising and Service Establishments, covering the operation of hotels during the year 1930. This Census is confined only to hotels and does not include apartment houses, boarding houses, clubs, Y.M.C.A.'s, Y.F.C.A.'s, tourist camps, etc. Separate statistics are given in the tables for the Dominion for hotels operating the entire year and those operating only part of the year, and also in the provincial tables for Quebec and Ontario. Statistics concerning the operation of restaurants not in hotels, or located in hotels but not under hotel management, will be found in the reports on retail trade published as a part of the Census of Merchandising and Service Establishments.

Plan of Operation.-- All hotels have been classified as to plan of operation: European, American and mixed (European and American), and data given for each classification. Hotels classified as European plan are those which make separate charges for room and meals. American plan hotels are those having a fixed combined rate for room and meals. Mixed plan hotels are those operating partly on the European plan and partly on the American plan. Statistics of hotels in the principal cities are for hotels operating the entire year only, as the cities in question have no hotels of the resort type in operation part of the year.

Keceipts. - While the questionnaire called for receipts from rental of rooms and sale of meals to be shown separately, American and mixed plan hotels in many cases were unable to make the required segregation and so reported these receipts in one amount. Receipts from meuls for hotels which did not report separate figures have been estimated on the basis of the figures reported by those hotels which were able to make the segregation.

Employees.-- The total number of paid employees and the number of dining roorn, lunch room and kitchen employees was reported for the months of January, April, July, October and December; also the number of employees as of the date on which the report was made, classified according to sex. The average number of employees for these specific months for hotels operating the entire year is shown, and the sex ratio reported at the time the questionnaire was prepared was applied to this average to obtain the classification by sex. As hotels of the resort type, operating only part of the year, employ practically no help during the off seasons, the average number of employees for such hotels computed in a manner similar to that used for hotels operating the entire year would not be significant. The number of employees for the months of January, April, July, October and December is shown, and the number of dining room, lunch room and kitchen employees reported for the month of July.

Salaries and Wages Paid, - This report shows the total amount paid in salarics and wages during the year 1930 for all paid employees, and separately for dining and lunch room and kitchen employees.

Proprietors and Firm Members.-- Proprietors and firm members receiving a stated salary were requested to report the amounts so received during the year. Figures are based on the replies to this query, but it is realized that the data contain some errors and omissions due to various interpretations of the question.

Summary
Hotels in operation the entire year numbered 4,176 for the Dominion, and their total receipts were $\$ 83,732,700$. The number of hotels in operation only part of the year (generally in the summer months) was 782 , and their total receipts were $\$ 6,786,270$. Thus, the total number of hotels for both groups was 4,958 and the combined receipts $\$ 90,518,970$. Guest rooms numbered 107,674 for the 4,176 hotels in operation the entire year - an average of 25.78 guest rooms per hotel - and 21,788 for the 782 hotels operating only part of the year - an average of 27.86 guest rooms per hotel.

Of the 4,176 hotels in operation the entire year, 1,306, or 31 per cent, were European plan, l,565 American plan, and l,305 were mixed plan. Of the 782 hotels in operation only part of the year, 56 were European plan, 556 American plan, and 170 mixed plan.

Receipts from sales of meals in European plan hotels, both full-time and seasonal, were $\$ 12,755,929$, and it is estimated that receipts from the same source in American and mixed plan hotels were $\$ 15,368,279$. Thus, of the total receipts of $\$ 90,518,970, \$ 28,124,208$ - almost one-third - were derived from sales of meals.

The amount of capital employed in land, buildings, furnishings, fixtures, etc. was reported as $\$ 252,527,500$ for all hotels, including those in operation only part of the year.

## Hotels Operating the Entire Year

Of the total receipts of $\$ 83,732,700$ reported for the 4,176 hotels in operation during the entire year, receipts from European plan hotels were $\$ 49,600,149$ - more than half of the total for all hotels in this group. The province of Quebec, with 1,172 hotels of all types and receipts of $\$ 24,344,207$, led both in number of establishments and volume of business, while Ontario, with I, 044 hotels and receipts of \$21,579,099, was second. A comparison of hotel operations by cities shows that Vancouver, with 95 hotels, had the greatest number but was third in amount of business done, with hotel receipts of $\$ 6,084,364$. Montreal was second in number, with 71 hotels, but was first in amount of business, with hotel receipts of $\$ 9,460,453$.

Feceipts from the sale of meals, as reported by European plan hotels and estimated in the case of those American and mixed plan hotels which did not give separate figures, amounted to $\$ 25,045,040$, thus constituting 29.9 per cent of the entire revenue of all hotels which operated throughout the whole year. The value of beer sold in the four provinces in which its sale was permitted, and of wine in the province of Quebec, was $\$ 23,607,817$, or 28.2 per cent of the total revenue. Feceipts from other sources - such as tobacco counters, news-stands, etc. - which amounted to $\$ 7,459,018$, were 8.9 per cent of the total, the remaining 33.0 per cent, or $\$ 27,620,-$ 825 , being derived from rental of rooms.

The average number of employees for the months of January, April, July, October and December was 26,833 , of which 14,417 are taken as male employees and 12,416 as female employees. The total amount paid for the year to these employees
was $\$ 18,821,514$. Dining room, lunch room and kitchen employees averaged 11,046 , of which 4,845 are taken as male and 6,201 as female, and the total amount paid these employees was $\$ 6,6 \kappa 8,683$. (The value of board and lodging furnished employees was not reported.)

There were 580 proprietors and firm members who reported receiving a stated salary, and their incomes from this source totalled $\$ 853,887$.

The total number of guest rooms in hotels operating the full year was 107,674 and of bathrooms 25,586 , while the total seating capacity of dining rooms was 114,795.

The total amount of capital employed was $\$ 214,183,300$. European plan hotels, which numbered 1,306 , or 31 per cent of all hotels in operation the entire year, had capital employed amounting to $\$ 147,091,200$, or 68.68 per cent of the total.

## Hotels Operating Part of the Year

Hotels in operation only part of the year numbered 782 , with total receipts of $\$ 6,786,270$. Of this number, 56 were operated on the European plan and their receipts were $\$ 790,830$. Ontario, with 360 hotels of all three types of operation and receipts of $\$ 2,551,392$, led both in number of establishments and volume of business; Quebec, with 240 hotels and receipts of $\$ 1,617,310$, was second.

As most of the seasonal hotels operated on the mmericun and mixed plans, separate figures for receipts from meals were not reported in all cases. However, on the basis of information submitted by those hotels which were able to show this amount separately, it is estimated that receipts from this source amounted to $\$ 3,079,168$, or 45.4 per cent of the total revenue。 Beer and wine sales, which were $\$ 334,640$, were 4.9 per cent of the total, and receipts from other sources - such as tobacco counters, news-stands, etc. - which amounted to $\$ 839,569$, accounted for 12.4 per cent, the remaining 37.3 per cent being made up of receipts of $\$ 2,532,893$ from rental of rooms.

The number of employees reported for the month of July was 8,113, of which 4,437 were employed in the dining room, lunch room and kitchen. The total amount paid in salaries and vages to employees was $\$ 1,579,149$, of which $\$ 632,674$ were paid to dining room, lunch room and kitchen employees. This amount covers only the period of employment and does not include any estimate of the value of board and lodging furnished employees.

Only 58 proprietors and firm members reported receiving a stated salary, the amounts so received totalling $\$ 52,037$.

The total number of guest rooms reported by the 782 hotels was 21,788, batarcons 4,757 , and the total seating capacity of dining rooms 38,888 .

The total amount of capital reported by hotels in operation part of the year was $\$ 38,344,200$.
