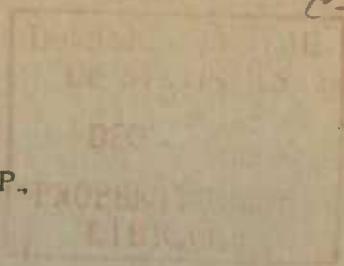

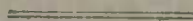

SUMMARY TABLES RELATING TO THE FOREIGN TRADE OF GERMANY(a)

The object of this report is to set forth in concise form the principal features of Germany's foreign trade.

German exports converted into Canadian currency at the official rate of exchange amounted to over two billion dollars in 1938. A substantial part of this total was with neighbouring countries or with countries reached by land transport. So far as the war is concerned these markets are still open to Germany. The present release is mainly concerned with German trade with the British Empire and Latin America, which made up the greater part of its sea-borne trade.

The following tables have with one exception been compiled from the German official trade reports of the past two and a half years. In the lists of commodities no attempt is made to present a comprehensive detailed breakdown and only summary items are shown.

Quantities are given in metric quintals equal to 220.46 pounds. Values are taken as given in the original reports and are in Reichsmarks with a nominal value in 1938 of \$.4039. As is well-known, German trade has been transacted on the basis of other exchange values than the official ones, rates quoted early in September in New York for the various species of mark running as low as \$.13.

The tables show that exports from Germany are comprised predominantly of highly fabricated articles, while imports into Germany are mainly foodstuffs and unfinished goods. The most important commodities sold abroad are machinery, including power tools and other goods of iron and steel, and chemicals including dyestuffs. The one raw material exported in considerable quantity is coal. Leading the list of imports is iron ore, followed in order by wool, oil, cotton, oil seeds, and copper, all six being industrial raw materials. Almost 40 per cent of imports are foodstuffs.

(a) German trade with Austria is included in the reports for 1937, but not included for 1938. From April 1st, 1939, Germany, Austria, and Memelland were considered as one statistical unit for foreign trade purposes, and Bohemia and Moravia were not considered as foreign countries.

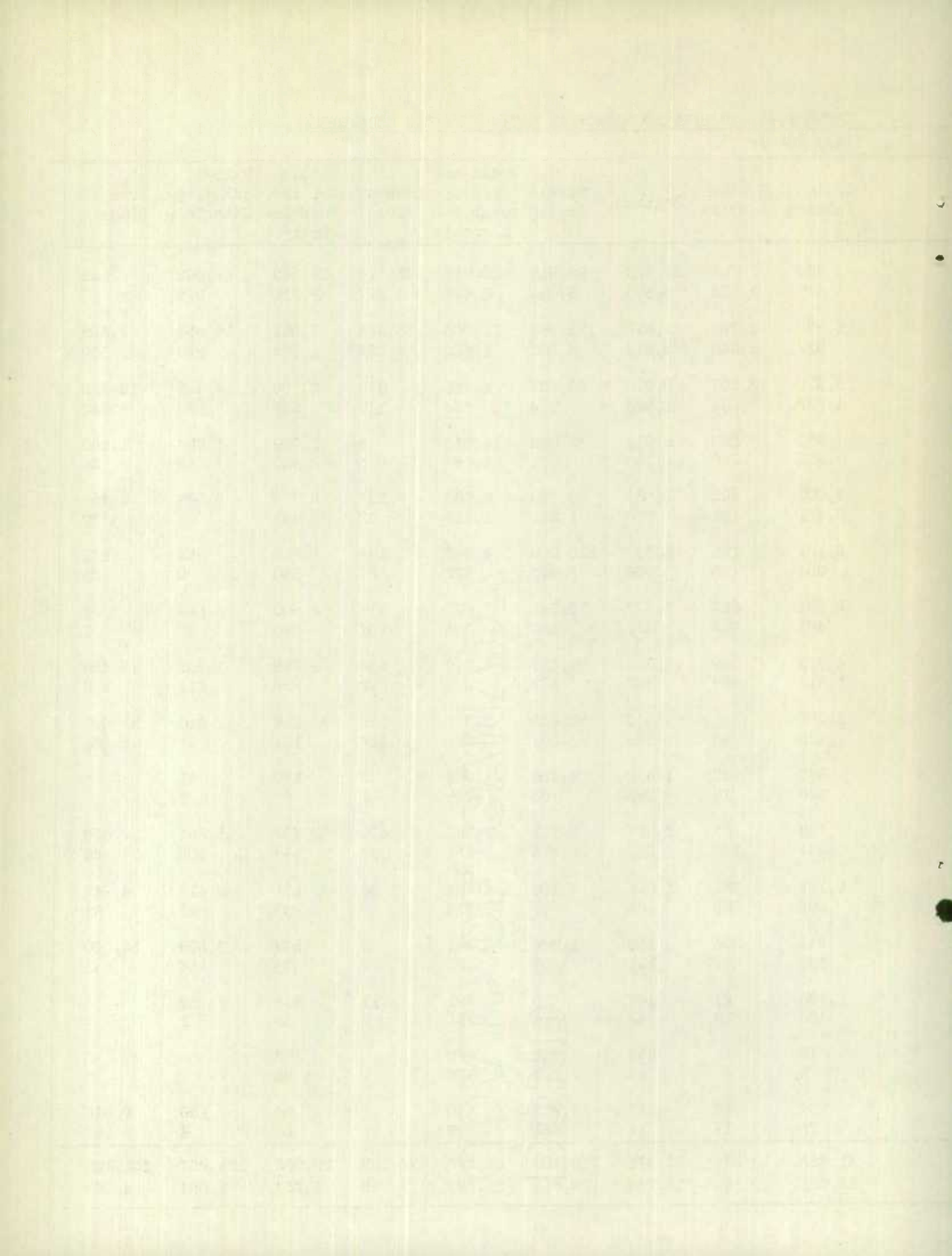
