CANADA'S TRADE WITH AUSTRALIA, FIJI AND NEW ZEALAND

The statistics in this brochure of Canada's trade with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand were specially compiled for use at the Imperial Conference, 1930. The statistics present the most essential features of that trade in detail as well as in general outline. The outstanding feature of Canada's trade with the Antipodes in the past decade has been its steady increase not only in exports but in imports as well. The trade of these British countries, especially Australia and New Zealand, has expanded so rapidly in volume and offers such undoubted potentialities for the future as to merit careful consideration.

In Table I, herewith, Canada's total imports from and exports to Australia, Fiji and New Zealand are given year by year back to 1912, while side by side are given the corresponding figures for the United States, Canada's keenest competitor in these markets. While Canada still does only a very small fraction of the trade of North America with the Antipodes, relatively speaking her recent progress has been more rapid than that of the United States. In 1930 Canada's total trade with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand amounted to \$60,126,193, imports from amounting to \$24,170,674 and exports to \$35,955,519; while that of the United States totalled \$245,832,829, imports from amounting to \$54,828,-616, and exports to \$191,004,168. From 1926 to 1930 Canada's imports from Australia, Fiji and New Zealand increased \$15,836,181 (from New Zealand \$13,557,484, Australia \$1,169,297, and Fiji \$1,109,400), while United States imports decreased \$20,640,143 (the decrease from Australia totalled \$23,171,315, while the increase from Fiji amounted to \$1,401,797, and New Zealand \$1,129,-375); whereas Canada's exports to these British countries increased \$3,685,491 (to New Zealand \$2,607,942, Australia \$916,727, and Fiji \$160,822), while United States exports increased \$3,052,293 (to Australia \$1,585,568, New Zealand \$1,098,175, and Fiji \$368,550).

Table II presents Canada's total trade with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, as also principal commodities imported from and exported to these British countries, for the years 1914 (year prior to the war), 1922 (year following post-bellum boom), 1929 and 1930. From 1914 to 1930 Canada's trade with Australia increased from \$5,387,108 to \$20,534,122; imports during this period increasing from \$713,111 to \$4,211,351, and domestic exports from \$4,673,997 to \$16,322,-771; the trade with Fiji increased from \$359,160 to \$4,107,815; imports increasing from \$240,719 to \$3,676,604, and domestic exports from \$118,441 to \$431,211; and the trade with New Zealand from \$5,126,598 to \$35,449,207; imports increasing from \$3,192,900 to \$16,282,719, and domestic exports from \$1,933,698 to \$19,166,488.

It will be noted from Table II that the principal imports from Australia in 1930 were: meats (\$718,894), raisins (\$717,544), sugar (\$530,543), dried currants (\$454,959), butter (\$357,893), hides (\$297,630), wool (\$266,052), canned and preserved fruits (\$251,007), worsted tops (\$218,686), and grease (\$101,022); while the principal domestic exports were: paper, chiefly newsprint (\$4,402,476), automobiles (\$3,483,301), fish, largely canned salmon (\$2,327,417), farm implements (\$969,304), planks and boards, chiefly Douglas fir (\$701,442), automobile parts (\$652,355), pipes and tubes of iron (\$345,329), square timber, largely Douglas fir (\$322,615), electrical apparatus (\$307,478), cutlery, chiefly

razors and razor blades (\$280,052), rubber (\$265,431), coal (\$193,645), gloves, textile (\$176,645), asbestos (\$146,184), musical instruments (\$142,836), and machinery (\$102,392).

The principal imports from Fiji in 1930 were: sugar (\$3,669,572) and butter (\$2,544); while the chief domestic exports were: Douglas fir lumber (\$126,990), fish, largely canned salmon and canned pilchards (\$96,483), and automobiles (\$61,044).

During the year 1930 the main imports from New Zealand were: butter (\$13,620,125), sausage casings (\$1,326,817), wool (\$618,936), meats (\$211,384), and hides (\$195,372); while the chief domestic exports were: automobiles (\$5,506,791), rubber, mainly tires and footwear (\$3,631,284) paper, largely newsprint (\$1,875,052), electrical apparatus (\$764,070), fish chiefly canned salmon (\$633,457), socks and stockings (\$565,500), wire (\$447,724), automobile parts (\$441,558), wheat flour (\$391,840), bars and rods of iron (\$375,736), farm implements (\$307,553), pipes and tubes of iron (\$295,903), planks and boards, principally Douglas fir (\$256,404), machinery (\$251,424), musical instruments (\$186,473), confectionery (\$181,815), leather (\$152,055), nails (\$149,357), cutlery (\$132,076), and tools (\$107,478).

The statistics in Table III give a more detailed survey of Canada's trade with Australia from 1921 to 1930, detailing (1) imports from and (2) exports to; table IV similar information for Fiji for the identical years detailing (1) imports from and (2) exports to; and table V, Canada's trade with New Zealand, from 1921 to 1930, detailing (1) imports from and (2) exports to.

During the latest year for which statistics are compiled, viz., 1929, Canada's imports from and exports to Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, according to degree of manufacture were:—

Table VI gives principal commodities imported into Australia, 1928-29; Fiji, 1928; and New Zealand, 1929; with imports from the United Kingdom, the United States and Canada. In the case of Australia the principal commodities listed represent about 80 per cent of the total imports; Fiji 70 per cent; and New Zealand 76 per cent, while the proportions of these commodities of the total imports from Canada were: Australia 96 per cent; Fiji 89 per cent, and New Zealand 90 per cent.
