FOREWORD

The statistics in this brochure of Canada's trade with Australia, Fiji, and New Zealand were compiled specially for the use of the Imperial Economic Conference, 1932. The brochure consists of two parts: the first part sets out in rather complete detail Canada's trade with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, while the second part presents the trade of Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, also in rather complete detail, with the leading countries with which these British Countries have exchange of commodities. The outstanding feature of Canada's trade with the Antipodes in the past decade has been the steady increase during normal conditions not only in exports but in imports as well. The trade of these British countries, especially Australia and New Zealand, has under normal conditions expanded so rapidly, both in volume and value, that they offer undoubted opportunities for trade expansion, and consequently merit careful consideration.

PART I

TRADE OF CANADA WITH AUSTRALIA, FIJI AND NEW ZEALAND

In Table I, herewith, Canada's total imports from and exports to Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, are given for each fiscal year from 1912 to 1932, while side by side are given the corresponding figures for the United States for the calendar years 1911 to 1931, Canada's keenest competitor in these markets. While Canada still does only a small proportion of the trade of North America with the Antipodes, her imports therefrom, in recent years, show a greater increase than the United States imports therefrom, though her exports thereto do not show as great an increase as those of the United States. On account of the general trade depression, which especially affected Australia, and the termination of the Canada-New Zealand Treaty, Canada's trade with these Dominions during the years 1931 and 1932 shows a very marked decline. The trade of the United States also shows a serious decrease with these Dominions, the proportional decline with Australia being greater but with New Zealand not so great as that of Canada. In view of the serious decline of Canada-Australian and New Zealand trade during the past two years, the trade of Canada with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand is contrasted during normal conditions, viz.: the year 1930 with 1925, year prior to the coming into force of the Canadian-Australian Trade Agreement of 1925. In 1930 Canada's total trade with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand amounted to \$60,126,193, imports from amounting to \$24,170,674 and exports to \$35,955,519; while that of the United States totalled \$245,832,829, imports from amounting to \$54,828,616, and exports to \$191,004,168. From 1925 to 1930 Canada's imports from these British countries increased \$19,835,057 (from Australia \$1,576,638, Fiji \$3,166,999, and New Zealand \$15,091,422); while United States imports increased \$7,786,846 (the decrease from Australia totalled \$928,973, while the increase from Fiji amounted to \$1,377,824, and from New Zealand to \$7,337,995). During the same period Canada's exports to these British Countries increased \$8,633,872, (to Australia \$4,294,840, Fiji \$234,597, and to New Zealand \$4,104,435); while United States exports increased \$35,938,643 (to Australia \$24,931,851, to Fiji \$852,316, and to New Zealand \$10,154,476).

Table II presents Canada's total trade with Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, as also the principal commodities imported from and exported to these British countries for the years 1914 (year prior to the war), 1922 (year following post-bellum boom), 1931 and 1932. From 1914 to 1932 Canada's trade with Australia increased from \$5,387,108 to \$11,084,752, imports during this period increasing from \$713,111 to \$5,696,770 and domestic exports to, from \$4,673,997 to \$5,387,982; the trade with Fiji increased from \$359,160 to \$2,729,806, imports increasing from \$249,719 to \$2,606,430, and domestic exports to, from \$118,441 to \$123,376; while Canada's trade with New Zealand decreased from \$5,126,598 to \$4,804,455, imports from decreasing from \$3,192,900 to \$1,080,230, and domestic exports to increasing from \$1,933,698 to \$3,724,225.

It will be noted from Table II that the principal imports from Australia in 1932 were: Raisins (\$1,625,169); sugar (\$1,149,553); worsted tops (\$650,488); canned fruits (\$560,761); dried currants (\$487,839); butter (\$241,241); meats (\$155,007); raw wool (\$144,888); gelatine (\$98,586); hides and skins (\$76,686); alcoholic beverages (\$70,362); articles re-imported (\$65,146); and raw furs (\$11,296); while the principal domestic exports were: Paper (\$2,004,689); fish (\$1,195,843); planks and boards (\$740,923); cottons (\$143,555); square timber (\$116,363); coal (\$109,540); farm implements (\$95,480); automobile parts (\$65,363); pipes and tubes (\$61,651); machinery (\$51,694); electrical apparatus (\$34,442); asbestos (\$27,953); gloves of fabrics (\$20,107); and nails (\$10,549). From 1929 to 1932 there has been a very serious decline in the exports of certain commodities to Australia, viz.: Automobiles, from \$7,204,967 to \$500; paper from \$4,220,493 to \$2,004,689; and farm implements from \$1,487,313 to \$95,480.

The principal imports from Fiji in 1932 were: Sugar (\$2,596,044); canned fruits (\$5,976); and butter (\$3,052). Imports of sugar from 1929 to 1932 decreased from \$5,694,079 to \$2,596,044. The Dominion's leading exports to Fiji in 1932 were: Planks and boards (32,840); fish (\$32,191); rubber manufactures (\$23,632); paper (\$7,314); square timber (\$4,384); automobiles (\$3,842); and socks and stockings (\$2,244).

During the year 1932 Canada's chief imports from New Zealand were: Sausage casings (\$455,921); raw wool (\$304,909); hides and skins (\$140,799); fresh apples (\$42,082); guns (\$23,153); butter (\$17,404); meats (\$11,728); articles re-imported (\$9,558); and onions (\$2,007). From 1929 to 1932 there has been a very marked decrease in the imports of certain commodities, viz.: Butter, from \$8,685,257 (1930, \$13,620,125) to \$17,404; sausage casings from \$1,919,900 to \$455,921; raw wool from \$1,172,947 to \$304,909; and hides and skins from \$447,477 to \$140,799. During the same year the chief exports to New Zealand were: Paper (\$1,028,988); rubber manufactures (\$691,073); socks and stockings (\$284,557); wheat flour (\$241,811); electrical apparatus (\$237,614); fish (\$199,181); wheat (\$114,969); machinery (\$71,547); automobile parts (\$61,182); wire (\$47,728); cottons (\$46,655); farm implements (\$39,815); automobiles (\$34,287); planks and boards (\$30,865); confectionery (\$21,932); vegetables (\$21,493); fruits (\$20,840); corsets and brassieres (\$19,288); leather and manufactures (\$18,598); nails (\$17,680); tools (\$15,223); pipes and tubes (\$13,114); coal (\$11,938); and bars and rods (\$7,681). There have been some notable decreases in Canada's exports to New Zealand from 1929 to 1932, the chief of these being: Automobiles, from \$4,787,504 to \$34,287; rubber manufactures from \$3,848,397 to \$691,073; paper from \$1,799,025 to \$1,028,988; wire from \$470,295 to \$47,728; fish from \$560,292 to \$199,181; and electrical apparatus from \$677,503 to \$237,614.

The statistics in Table III give a more detailed survey of Canada's trade with Australia from 1923 to 1932, detailing (1) Imports from, and (2) Exports to; Table IV, similar information for Fiji for the same years, detailing (1) Imports from and (2) Exports to; and Table V, Canada's trade with New Zealand, from 1923 to 1932, indicating (1) Imports from, and (2) Exports to.

During the latest year for which statistics are compiled, viz.: 1931, Canada's Imports from and Exports to Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, according to degree of manufacture were:—

PART II.

TRADE OF AUSTRALIA, FIJI AND NEW ZEALAND

In Part II of this brochure the imports and exports of Australia, Fiji and New Zealand are presented in rather complete detail for the latest year for which statistics are available, as also the total imports and exports for the past ten years, showing in each instance the amount of the imports and exports for (a) all countries, (b) Empire and foreign countries, and (c) principal countries. The statistics in this part of the brochure present the extent of the import and export trade of these various units of the Empire, as also the sorts of commodities imported and exported.

It will be observed by reference to the following table showing the "Trade of Australia, Fiji and New Zealand, year 1930 compared with 1921", that the total trade of these British countries combined with other portions of the Empire, from 1921 to 1930, decreased from \$1,054,671,048 to \$701,493,146; imports from Empire countries decreasing from \$477,991,140 to \$304,193,573, and exports to, from \$576,679,908 to \$397,299,573. During the same period imports from Canada increased from \$23,839,107 to \$25,502,042, and exports to, from \$4,598,774 to \$18,116,565; imports from the United Kingdom decreased from \$359,969,994 to \$215,868,775, while exports to decreased from \$466,881,392 to \$338,254,468; whereas imports from the United States decreased from \$132,052,463 to \$92,747,305, while exports to the United States decreased from \$41,469,128 to \$22,295,983. The imports, however, from all countries, from 1921 to 1930 decreased from \$716,612,255 to \$508,272,893; and exports from \$806,778,584 to \$583,543,804. Further, it will be noted that in 1921 Canada furnished Australia, Fiji and New Zealand combined with 3.3 per cent of their imports, and in 1930 with 5.0 per cent; that the United Kingdom furnished these same British countries with 50.2 per cent of their total imports in 1921, and with 42.5 per cent in 1930; while in 1921 the United States supplied these British countries with 18.4 per cent of their imports, and in 1930 with 18.2 per cent. With reference to export trade, in 1921 Canada took 0.6 per cent of their total exports, and in 1930 3.1 per cent; the United Kingdom in 1921 took 57.9 per cent of their total exports, compared with 57.7 per cent in 1930; while in 1921 the United States took 5.1 per cent of the total exports of these British countries, and in 1930 only 3.8 per cent.
