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# BIBLIOGRAPHY OF CANADIAN STUDIES IN EDUCATION, 1929-33.

Education as a subject of post-graduate study in Canadian universities assumes an increasing importance annually, and a growing number of educationists appear to be doing original research individually. It is primarily to aid people of these types that the following bibliography has been undertaken, though it should also serve a useful purpose for others who may need it for more casual reference. Unpublished theses, presented for post-graduate degrees in education, are included as well as published works, for it is frequently possible to arrange for borrowing these on an inter-university library loan. Printed abstracts of others (e.g. those in the University of Toronto for the degree of D. Paed) may be obtained from the authors.

It is hoped that it may be possible to carry the bibliography on from year to year. In this, the first, an attempt has been made to go back a few years, and to include published works appearing as early as 1929. Unpublished theses, however, are included only for the last three years, 1931-33. It will be appreciated if the Education Branch of the Bureau of Statistics is advised of any omissions noted in the list, in order that they may be included next year.

The bibliography does not attempt to include text books. Nor does it attempt to include articles on education in periodicals. It may be possible at a later date to begin an index of the Canadian education periodicals, a list of which also appears in this Bulletin. Such a service is not available at the present time. The Canadian Periodical Index published by the Public Library at Windsor, Ontario, does not include any of these magazines but it does include several of a more general nature that carry occasional articles on education. The School is included in the Education Index published in New York.

In addition to including studies done in Canada, the bibliography includes studies made in other countries (chiefly the United States) concerning Canadian education. For a record of those in the United States the Bureau is indebted to the annual <u>Bibliography of Research Studies in Education</u>, published by the Office of Education, Washington, D.C. The latest of these drawn upon is the one for 1930-31.
