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PREFACE

A series of occasional reports under the general title of $Health\ Manpower\ in\ Hospitals$ have been produced by the Institutions Section, Health and Welfare Division, DBS. These reports form part of the over-all Institutions Section series of surveys and reports on Health and Welfare Manpower including the Annual Salary Surveys series relating to Hospital Nursing Personnel and Public Health Nurses.

These reports which are based upon published and unpublished tabulations of the Institutions Section and upon other DBS data are designed to provide an in-depth study on many of the various professional and technical categories of personnel in Canadian hospitals. The data are drawn from the detailed information collected on the Annual Returns of Hospitals (HS-1 and HS-2) from 1961 onwards and reflect such items as changes in employment patterns, workloads, turnover rates, etc., for each province and Canada.

Contained in these reports are brief textual highlights and tables of historical comparisons, as well as definitions of terms (where required). The volume of data presented varies according to the availability of detail on each professional or technical group. The reports will be up-dated periodically.

In addition to a general publication, i.e., *Health Manpower in Hospitals-General*, 1961-68 (Catalogue No. 83-507), which gives the reader a general background of trends in hospital manpower, there are a number of publications dealing with a particular group of hospital personnel (see back cover of this report).

EXPLANATORY NOTES AND GLOSSARY

Hospital

An institution which is operated for the medical, surgical and/or obstetrical care of in-patients, and which is licenced or approved as a hospital by the federal and/or a provincial government, or by a municipality duly authorized under the laws of the province. Specifically excluded are institutions primarily for tuberculosis, mental disease, and mental defect.

Public Hospital

Recognized by the province as a "private hospital" which generally restricts its admissions to patients paying for the care provided at rates determined by the management.

Federal Hospital

A hospital owned and operated by the Government of Canada; operation will either be by the Department of National Health and Welfare, the Department of National Defence, or the Department of Veterans Affairs.

General Hospital

A hospital which provides for the treatment and care of all types of diseases or at least a wide range of conditions.

Allied Special Hospital

Includes chronic, convalescent, rehabilitation and "other" hospitals.

Rated Bed Capacity

The number of beds that the hospital is designed to accommodate as at December 31 of the reporting year, on the basis of established standards of floor area per bed.

Size of Hospital

The size of a hospital in this report is determined by the rated bed capacity on December 31 of the reporting year.

Full-time Staff

Persons employed on a full-time basis at December 31, i.e., regularly employed throughout the full hospital workweek.

Part-time Staff

Persons employed on a part-time basis at December 31, i.e., regularly employed on selected days or partial days in the hospital workweek.

Staff Separation

The departure of an employee from employment within the hospital.

Paid Hours

Accumulated during the year, paid hours include full-time and part-time regular employees of the hospital who have had salaries and wages payable to them by the hospital.

Revenue Fund

The Revenue Fund is set up to record monetary activities associated with the day-to-day operations of the hospital in providing services to patients. It is sometimes called the Operating Fund.

Revenue Fund Expense.—Revenue Fund Expense is the cost, on an accrual basis, of operating and maintaining the hospital during the year, regardless of the amounts of disbursements made during the year.

Salaries and Wages.—Included are the gross salaries and wages earned during the year by all hospital personnel whether or not actually paid during the year. Gross salaries and wages comprise the following:

- (1) Salaries, wages and other remuneration earned by paid personnel, including special allowances paid and perquisites supplied to such personnel; includes also any earned fees or other remuneration perquisites, and special allowances to physicians or therapists for services rendered to the hospital.
- (2) The value of contributed services of regular staff members working without pay, and of perquisites supplied to such personnel, calculated on the basis of salary scales of similar services in the community and supported by regular payroll records.

In-patients

Patients who are duly admitted to the hospital and to whom a bed or bassinet has been allocated. (This category excludes stillbirths as well as patients attending a day or night centre attached to the hospital).

Adults and children. - All in-patients except newborn.

Admission. — The formal acceptance and reception of a person as an in-patient (including newborn).

Patient-day.—The period of service to an inpatient between the census-taking hours on two successive days; the day of admission is counted as a patient-day but the day of separation is not.

Population

June 1 population figures as enumerated in Census years or estimated for inter-censal years.

Qualified Pharmacists

Pharmacists who have graduated in a course in pharmacy from a recognized university; or registration under the Pharmacy Act of the Province.

Pharmacy Department

Refers to a service area designed and equipped for the preparation, compounding and dispensing of medecine and drugs.

INTRODUCTION

This report pertaining to qualified pharmacists is one in the DBS Institutions Section's occasional series of reports dealing with health manpower in the hospital fields' for the time period 1961-68. In addition to these reports which deal with specific professional and technical groups, the publication Health Manpower in Hospitals—General, 1961-68 contains data on the total manpower of Canadian hospitals for the years 1961-66, as mentioned in the Preface.

Qualified Pharmacists Employed

Table 1 shows that in 1963, some 335 hospitals signified the employment of at least one qualified pharmacist by reporting paid hours due to qualified pharmacists. By 1968, some 470 hospitals indicated in this manner that they retained the services of at least one pharmacist on a full or part-time basis. Over the period 1962-68 the ratio of full-time pharmacists employed per reporting hospital was consistently 1.6.

From Table 5 it can be seen that the number of pharmacists employed by reporting hospitals has almost doubled from 525 in 1961 to 1,007 in 1968. Over this period full-time pharmacists have increased by 76 per cent or from 447 to 786 while part-time pharmacists have grown proportionately much faster going from 78 to 221 for a percentage increase of 183 per cent. Part-time pharmacists have increased from 15 per cent of total pharmacists employed in 1961 to 22 per cent of the total employed in 1968.

Generally speaking, 85 per cent of the pharmacists reported in any given year were employed by public general hospitals and approximately 90 per cent of these pharmacists were employed by hospitals of 100 or more beds. Regionally, some 60 per cent of reported pharmacists in 1961 were employed in Quebec and Ontario hospitals. By 1968 this proportion had increased to almost 65 per cent.

Table 2 shows that in 1961, full-time pharmacists made up 0.24 per cent of total full-time hospital personnel while part-time pharmacists made up 0.40 per cent of all part-time personnel. Over the period 1961-68 these proportions have increased to 0.30 and 0.56 per cent, respectively. Regionally Manitoba and Saskatchewan ratios tend to be higher than other provinces while New Brunswick ratios are relatively low.

Pharmacists employed per 100,000 population have increased from 2.9 in 1961 to 4.9 in 1968 (Table 3). Manitoba and Saskatchewan evidenced the largest rates over the period while Newfoundland and New Brunswick rates tended to be low.

In this report, pharmacist means qualified pharmacist. See glossary for definition.

Staff Separations

Staff separations for full-time pharmacists are listed in Table 6. These separations were used in calculating the turnover rates for full-time pharmacists as shown in Table 4. Inspection of this table reveals that the turnover rates for public general hospitals as a whole were higher in any given year than the rates for all hospitals. Within the public general hospitals the turnover rates for pharmacists tended to be highest in the larger hospitals. Provincially, Saskatchewan and Manitoba had relatively high turnover rates in many years while Prince Edward Island and Nova Scotia tended to have low rates.

Paid Hours

Table 7 contains selected paid hour ratios for hospitals as a whole and the pharmacy department in particular. Again, it can be seen that these ratios for total public general hospitals were higher in any given year than the corresponding ratios for hospitals as a whole. Generally speaking, these ratios tended to be larger each year and tended to increase with bed size in the public general sector. Paid hours for pharmacists are listed in Table 8. The data exhibit the trends mentioned above with the added feature that while the paid hour ratios of Table 7 have increased in the order of 10 per cent from 1964 to 1968, paid hours for qualified pharmacists have increased by more than 35 per cent over the same period, indicating a trend towards more utilization of the services of pharmacists.

Average Number of Patients per Day

Table 9 which represents the average number of patients (adults and children) in a given hospital on a given day is presented in each of these special reports as a form of back-drop against which the reader may compare any trends in personnel movement against a measure of the change in patient load. The table shows that the average number of patients in all hospitals on a given day has increased by more than 12 per cent from 83.7 in 1961 to 94.1 in 1968, while in public general hospitals the increase was almost 16 per cent. Regionally, Nova Scotia (21 per cent) and Newfoundland (20 per cent) experienced the largest gains over the period.

Salary Cost

Revenue Fund expenditure per patient-day for all public hospitals increased by 95 per cent from \$23.07 in 1961 to \$45.01 in 1968, while in public general hospitals the increase was 99 per cent to

\$48.44 (Table 11). At the same time salaries and wages per patient-day for all hospital personnel increased at an even greater pace (102 per cent for all hospitals and 105 per cent for general hospitals) to \$30.16 and \$32.31, respectively (Table 10).

Pharmacy department salary cost per patient-day for all hospitals rose by 59 per cent from \$0.22 in 1964 to \$0.35 in 1968, comparing favourably with the total hospital salary cost rise of 60 per cent over this period. From 1964 to 1968 pharmacy

department salary costs per patient-day have consistently accounted for 1.2 per cent of total hospital salary costs. Table 10 shows that over the years 1964-68 pharmacy department salary cost in public general hospitals tended to be lowest in the 1-9 and 25-49 bed groups, and then rose with hospital size. Regionally, Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island perennially have reported low salary costs for the pharmacy department while Quebec and Saskatchewan have tended to record high salary costs in this area.
