Bulletin préliminaire RECENSEMENT DU CANADA 1971

POPULATION BY LANGUAGE MOST OFTEN SPOKEN AT HOME AND BY OFFICIAL LANGUAGE

This report presents final population counts of the 1971 Census, showing a distribution by language most often spoken at home and by official language. Figures are shown for Canada, provinces, census divisions, incorporated cities, towns and villages of 10,000 and over, as well as for census metropolitan areas.

More detailed classifications of the language most often spoken at home and of official language by sex, age group, etc., will be issued at later dates as part of the regular volume series of final reports of the 1971 Census. This advance report is released to make available at an earlier date, complete data on official language as well as totals for the numerically large languages most often spoken at home.

The language most often spoken at home refers to the language used by the person most frequently in the home at the time of the census. In the case of infants, this is the language most often spoken in the home. The official language concept is formed from the following question: "Can you speak English or French well enough to conduct a conversation?". In the case of infants, this is the language most often spoken in the home (if English or French is the language of the home). Otherwise, the answer is marked as being "Neither English nor French".

The information in this report was collected on a sample basis. As a result, the population for a given geographic area may differ from that shown in reports containing data collected on a 100 p.c. basis. The latter figures, of course, represent the official population counts (See Catalogue Nos. 92-704 to 92-707).

The 1971 figures in this report have been subjected to the confidentiality procedure introduced in the 1971 Census to prevent the possibility of associating small figures with any identifiable individual. Briefly, it involves the random rounding of all last or unit digits. Since totals are independently rounded, they do not necessarily equal the sum of rounded figures in distributions. Also there may be slight differences between comparable figures in this report and those in other census bulletins. This technique will be described in the reports of the 1971 Census volume series. Each bulletin of the 1971 Census volume series will include measures of reliability in the form of estimates of the mean square error for sets of characteristics covered in that bulletin. The user interested in obtaining an indication of the reliability of these advance data should refer to the appropriate bulletin in the volume series.

POPULATION SELON LA LANGUE D'USAGE ET LA LANGUE OFFICIELLE

Ce bulletin présente les chiffres définitifs de population, au recensement de 1971, du Canada, des provinces, des divisions de recensement, des cités, villes et villages constitués de 10,000 habitants et plus et des régions métropolitaines de recensement, selon la langue d'usage et la langue officielle.

Des classements détaillés de la langue d'usage et de la langue officielle selon le sexe, le groupe d'âge, etc., paraîtront ultérieurement dans le cadre de la série des volumes du recensement de 1971. L'objet de ce bulletin préliminaire est de communiquer le plus tôt possible les données complètes sur la langue officielle ainsi que les résultats concernant les langues d'usage les plus fréquentes.

La langue d'usage est la langue le plus souvent parlée à la maison au moment du recensement. Dans le cas des enfants en bas âge, c'est la langue d'usage des autres membres du ménage. La langue officielle est déterminée à partir de la question suivante: "Connaissez-vous assez bien l'anglais ou le français pour soutenir une conversation?". Dans le cas des enfants en bas âge, la langue officielle est la langue d'usage des autres membres du ménage, s'il s'agit de l'anglais ou du français. Autrement, la réponse donnée était "Ni l'anglais ni le français".

Les renseignements de la présente publication ont été recueillis par échantillonnage. Il s'ensuit que les chiffres de population pour une région géographique donnée ne sont pas forcément les mêmes que ceux des publications dont les données avaient été recueillies à 100 p. 100. Bien entendu, c'est ce dernier chiffre qui représente le dénombrement officiel de la population (voir les publications n°s 92-704 à 92-707 au catalogue).

La confidentialité des données de 1971 présentées ici est assurée par la méthode utilisée au recensement de 1971 pour interdire la possibilité d'associer des chiffres de faible importance à une personne en particulier. En un mot, cette méthode consiste à arrondir au hasard tous les derniers chiffres, c'est-à-dire les chiffres représentant les unités. Ainsi, tous les chiffres ayant été arrondis individuellement, leur somme ne donne pas nécessairement les totaux indiqués. Il peut également y avoir de légères différences entre des chiffres comparables de ce bulletin et ceux d'autres bulletins du recensement. Une description de cette technique figurera dans les bulletins de la série des volumes du recensement de 1971. Chaque bulletin de la série des volumes du recensement de 1971 renfermera des mesures de fiabilité sous forme d'estimations de l'erreur quadratique moyenne relativement aux groupes de caractéristiques observées. L'utilisateur désireux de connaître le degré de fiabilité de ces données préliminaires devra consulter le bulletin approprié de la série des volumes.



OFFICIAL LANGUAGE BY CENSUS DIVISIONS LANGUE OFFICIELLE PAR DIVISION DE RECENSEMENT




