## INTRODUCTION

This report gives final figures for persons included in the labour force population during the week prior to enumeration, classified by occupation and sex, for census metropolitan areas and their cities proper, and by occupation division and sex, for other major urban areas, as reported at the June 1, 1961 Census.

The 1961 Census labour force includes all persons 15 years of age and over, who were reported as having a job of any kind, either part-time or full-time (even if they were not at work) or were reported as looking for work, during the week prior to enumeration. In urban localities the major portion of the enumeration extended over the first two weeks in June, and in rural areas over the first three weeks.

Inmates in institutions at the date of the Census, even though employed at some productive work within the institution, were not included in the labour force population. Unlike the 1951 Census, however, Indians on reserves are included, rather than treated as a special group. The comparability of certain occupations, especially that of hunters and trappers, may be affected by this change.

**Occupation inquiry.**—Persons in the labour force who had a job during the week prior to enumeration were asked to state the kind of work in which they were engaged in this period. Those with two or more jobs were asked to report the occupation at which they worked the greatest number of hours. Persons looking for work exclusive of those looking for their first job, were asked to give the occupation followed when last employed.

**Occupational classification.**—Occupations are classified under group titles, mainly according to the kind of processes performed and the material worked upon, though certain classes take into consideration training and skill, tools and equipment used and/or working environment, etc. All persons are classified according to the nature of their work regardless of the kind of establishment in which it is carried on or their status in that establishment. For example, a motor vehicle repairman is classified to the occupation class "Mechanics and repairmen, motor vehicle" whether he works for a motor vehicle repair shop, a trucking firm, a factory, or a store, and whether he owns his own repair shop or works for someone else. The group of "Labourers, n.e.s." includes workers in "unskilled" occupations except those engaged in farming, fishing, logging or mining (except in quarries and petroleum and gas wells) operations. The "Labourers, n.e.s." class also excludes other specified categories such as "Longshoremen and other Freight Handlers"; and "Sectionmen and Trackmen". This residual group of "Labourers" is subdivided by industry groups as are the residual groups of "Owners and Managers, n.e.s." and "Foremen, n.e.s.". Occupation divisions only are shown for other major urban areas.

**Comparability with earlier censuses.**—Due mainly to differences in definition and the revision of the occupational classification, certain of the figures published in this report are not directly comparable with the occupation statistics of earlier censuses. A special trend report will be issued in the intercensal period to provide comparable data.

**Census metropolitan and other major urban areas.**—Metropolitan areas as defined for the census relate to groups of urban communities in Canada which are in close economic, geographic and social relationship. Those urban communities classed as other major urban areas possess characteristics of metropolitan areas, but in most cases the cities proper are smaller in size.

Le présent rapport donne le chiffre définitif de la population qui faisait partie de la main-d'oeuvre durant la semaine précédant le recensement. La population est répartie suivant la profession et le sexe pour les zones métropolitaines de recensement et leurs cités proprement dites et par division professionnelle et sexe pour les autres grandes agglomérations urbaines, d'après le recensement du 1er juin 1961.

La main-d'oeuvre recensée en 1961 comprenait toutes les personnes âgées de 15 ans et plus qui ont été inscrites comme ayant un emploi quelconque, à temps partiel ou de plein temps (même si elles n'étaient pas au travail) ou comme ayant cherché du travail la semaine précédant le dénombrement. Dans les localités urbaines, le dénombrement a été fait en majeure partie durant les deux premières semaines de juin, et, dans les régions rurales durant les trois premières.

Lors du recensement, les pensionnaires des institutions, même s'ils étaient employés à quelque travail productif dans l'institution, n'étaient pas censés faire partie de la main-d'oeuvre. Contrairement au recensement de 1951, où ils faisaient partie d'un groupe spécial, les Indiens des réserves ont été comptés parmi la main-d'oeuvre. Cette modification influera peut-être sur la comparabilité entre certaines professions, surtout parmi les chasseurs et les trappeurs.

**Question sur la profession.**—Les personnes qui faisaient partie de la main-d'oeuvre et avaient un emploi la semaine précédant le dénombrement ont été priées de déclarer la nature de leur travail durant cette semaine. Les personnes qui avaient deux emplois ou plus déclaraient celui auquel elles avaient consacré le plus grand nombre d'heures. Les personnes cherchant du travail, sauf celles qui étaient en quête de leur premier emploi, devaient déclarer leur dernier emploi.

**Classement des professions.**—Les professions sont classées sous des rubriques de groupe d'après la nature du travail accompli et des matières employées, bien que certaines classes tiennent compte de la formation, de la spécialisation, des outils et de l'équipement employés et (ou) du milieu du travail, etc. Toutes les personnes sont classées d'après la nature de leur travail indépendamment du genre d'établissement qui les emploie ou de leur état d'emploi dans ce même établissement. Par exemple, un réparateur d'automobiles est placé dans la classe professionnelle "Mécaniciens et réparateurs d'automobiles", qu'il travaille dans un atelier de réparation de véhicules automobiles, pour une entreprise de camionnage, dans une usine ou un magasin, qu'il possède son propre atelier de réparation ou qu'il travaille pour autrui. Le groupe des "Manoeuvres, n.c.a." comprend les ouvriers dans les "professions non spécialisées" sauf ceux qui sont engagés dans des travaux relatifs à l'agriculture, à la pêche, à l'abattage du bois ou aux mines (sauf les carrières et les puits de pétrole et de gaz naturel). La classe des "Manoeuvres, n.c.a." exclut aussi certaines autres catégories telles que "Débardeurs et autres ouvriers de la manutention" et "Cantonniers et poseurs de rails". Ce dernier groupe de manoeuvres se subdivise en groupes industriels comme les groupes restants "Propriétaires et administrateurs, n.c.a." et "Contremaires, n.c.a.". Les divisions professionnelles seulement sont indiquées pour les autres grandes agglomérations urbaines.

**Comparaison avec les recensements antérieurs.**—A cause des définitions différentes et de la révision apportée à la classification des professions, certains chiffres du présent rapport ne sont pas rigoureusement comparables avec ceux des recensements antérieurs. Un rapport spécial sur les tendances intercensales sera publié qui contiendra des données comparatives.

**Zones métropolitaines de recensement et autres grandes agglomérations urbaines.**—Les zones métropolitaines de recensement sont des groupes d'agglomérations urbaines étroitement liées par leurs intérêts économiques, géographiques et sociaux. Les centres urbains classés comme autres grandes agglomérations urbaines possèdent les caractéristiques propres aux zones métropolitaines mais, dans la plupart des cas, la ville proprement dite est moins populeuse.


