POPULATION

by official language and mother tongue

Final population totals from the 1951 Census are shown in the following table distributed according to (a) official language and (b) mother tongue. Figures are given for the counties and census divisions of each province as well as individual cities, towns and incorporated villages of 5,000 population and over.

This table contains only a very abbreviated classification of mother tongues, i.e. English, French, and all other. A detailed classification showing other mother tongues separately will appear as one of the regular series of census bulletins being released as the information becomes available. This special compilation makes available data in summary form at an earlier date. Tables in the regular series of bulletins, in addition to providing more detailed classifications, will also be classified by sex.

Under the caption "official language" is shown the number of persons who can speak either one or both of the official languages of Canada. It should be noted that persons indicated as speaking "English only" or "French only" may also speak other languages and have a mother tongue other than English or French. By "mother tongue" is meant the language the person first spoke in childhood and still understands. In the case of infants, this refers to the language commonly spoken in the home.

Le tableau qui suit donne les chiffres définitifs de la population au recensement de 1951 classée selon (a) la langue officielle et (b) la langue maternelle. Les chiffres sont donnés pour les comtés et les divisions de recensement de chaque province de même que pour chaque cité, ville et village constitué de 5,000 habitants et plus.

Ce tableau ne contient qu'une classification très succincte des langues maternelles, i.e. anglais, français, toutes autres. Une classification détaillée des autres langues maternelles fera l'objet de l'un des bulletins réguliers du recensement qui sont publiés au fur et à mesure que les renseignements deviennent disponibles. La présente compilation spéciale devance les bulletins réguliers et présente les chiffres sous une forme sommaire. En plus de classifications plus détaillées, le bulletin de la série régulière contiendra une répartition par sexe.

Sous le titre "langue officielle" est donné le nombre de personnes qui peuvent parler l'une ou l'autre des deux langues officielles du Canada ou les deux. Il faut remarquer que les personnes indiquées comme parlant "anglais seulement" ou "français seulement", peuvent aussi parler d'autres langues et avoir une langue maternelle autre que l'anglais ou le français. On entend par "langue maternelle" la première langue qu'une personne a parlée dans son enfance et qu'elle comprend encore. Dans le cas des bébés, c'est la langue ordinairement parlée à la maison.
