



#### INTRODUCTION

#### A. BACKGROUND

The 1981 Census of Population was the twelfth major decennial census taken in Canada since 1871. It has enabled Statistics Canada to collect information on the social and economic characteristics of Canadians and the dwellings in which they live.

Basic information concerning age, sex, relationship to Person 1, marital status and mother tongue was obtained for all persons in Canada. In addition, data were collected for each dwelling, concerning both the persons living there (e.g., the number of usual residents) and the dwelling itself (e.g., type of dwelling).

Certain other information was collected from a sample (one-fifth) of the population including data on demographic characteristics such as fertility and mobility status; on social and cultural characteristics such as ethnicity, religion, education, and language spoken in the home; and on economic characteristics such as labour force activity, occupation, industry, place of work and income. Sample data on additional dwelling characteristics, such as period of construction, number of rooms, type of heating equipment, as well as shelter costs, are also available.

Users of Statistics Canada data should be aware of the fact that all information compiled by the agency is subject to the provisions of the Statistics Act which protect organizations and persons from individual disclosure.

#### B. STRUCTURE OF THIS DOCUMENT

This document informs data users about forthcoming <u>planned</u> 1981 Census products and services, and outlines the arrangement of these products and services. As final products are released, they will appear in the Statistics Canada Catalogue.

Following is a brief description of the contents of each section of this document.

#### 1. Data Products

1981 Census data products will be available in three series: the National Series, the Provincial Series, and the Profile Series.

- (a) <u>National Series</u> This series presents data for Canada and the provinces; bulletins are organized to facilitate comparisons at the national level. More detailed data are provided for both national and provincial levels than for lower geographic levels.
- (b) Provincial Series This series is based on a user-preferred method of data presentation: the data are published in separate bulletins for each province. This eliminates the need to purchase data for all provinces when the user is interested only in data for certain provinces.
- (c) Profile Series This series is based on the same concept as the Census Tract series in 1971 and 1976. A range of population, housing and socio-economic data is presented for specific geographic areas which, for 1981, will be expanded to cover Census Divisions. Previous geographic areas for this series in 1976 included Federal Electoral Districts, Census Metropolitan Areas, Census Agglomerations, and Census Subdivisions of 5,000 population and over.

#### 2. Analytical and Reference Products

Also included in the 1981 Census publication programme are the analytical and reference products, which can be grouped as follows:

- (a) <u>General Reference Products</u> These comprise general reference material such as the 1981 Census Dictionary, the Summary Guides (for 100% and sample data), the Data Quality publications (for 100% and sample data) and the census Tabulation Guide. A more detailed description of each of these products is found in the appropriate section of this document.
- (b) Geographic Reference Products These products provide the necessary geographical information for interpreting and analyzing the data from the 1981 Census and earlier censuses.
- (c) Descriptive Series There are two parts to the descriptive series: (a) the Content Series, which presents analyses of topical socio-economic trends based on data taken from the 1981 Census; and (b) the Metropolitan Atlas Series, which illustrates, via thematic maps, the distribution of various characteristics within 12 census metropolitan areas.

#### Part II - Non-print Products

Unpublished 1981 Census data include User Summary Tapes and Microfiche, Geographic Tape Files, Public Use Sample Tapes and Custom Tabulations. A detailed description of each of these products is found in Part II of this document.

The non-print products were designed to expand the user's access to census data by providing statistical tables on magnetic tape, microfiche or on a custom basis. Some of these products can be transformed into print form for a nominal charge, should the user not have access to either a computer or microfiche reader.

Also included is an appendix containing the Guide to Reference Maps, as well as an order form.

Catalogued publications have a five-digit catalogue number (e.g., 99-901 for the 1981 Census Dictionary) which appears to the left of the title of the product throughout this document, as well as a price <u>estimate</u> which appears to the right of the title. Non-catalogued publications have a four-character alpha-numeric reference number (e.g., E-479 for the Tabulation Guide) which appears to the left of the publication title and a handling charge <u>estimate</u> which appears to the right of the title.

The total current price for a complete set of catalogued 1981 Census print publications is \$1,700.00. Similarly, package prices are available for four subsets of the catalogued bulletins, as follows:

#### USER SUMMARY TAPES AND MICROFICHE

The User Summary Tape programme provides a series of tables pertaining to demographic, housing, household, family, labour and income characteristics. Tapes usually provide more detail than is provided in the printed bulletins. Summary tapes allow users to aggregate the tabulations either on a geographic basis or by combining data cells. The tapes contain tabulated data and not individual census records. Documentation describing the contents of summary tape files will be available in both official languages.

A separate tape series will be produced for the short form questionnaire (2A - 100%) of the total population) and the long form questionnaire (2B - 20%) of the total population). Each of these series will include tables for the following geographic levels:

- (1) Enumeration Area (EA) approximately 41,200 EAs
- (2) Census Subdivision (CSD) 5,710 CSDs
- (3) Census Tract (CT)/Provincial Census Tract (PCT) 3,302 CTs and 1,786 PCTs
- (4) Special Series (SP)

The Special Series has been added for the 1981 Census. It includes tables of varying geographic delineations such as Canada, provinces, urban size groups, urban, rural non-farm and rural farm, census metropolitan areas and census agglomerations, urbanized core and fringe with components, etc. Tables for which there has been widespread demand but which were too detailed to be incorporated in the print products are included in this series.

In addition, the entire Profile Series (Vol.3) of the data products will be repeated on User Summary Tapes.

Information on the geographic organization and tables contained in each file, costs, and how to order will be released at a later date. The detailed breakdown of each characteristic variable in terms of its class interval will be available in the Tabulation Guide. Tabulations provided on User Summary Tapes will also be made available on microfiche, unless the number of microfiche required for a given table is excessive. It is also planned to replicate the majority of the three volumes of data products (the National, Provincial, and Profile Series) on microfiche.

Each tabulation on microfiche will be either bilingual or available separately in English or French.

#### GEOGRAPHIC TAPE FILES

#### Land Area and Population Tape Files

Four tape files (one each for 1981 census divisions, census subdivisions, census tracts and provincial census tracts) present 1981 Census of Canada final population counts and land areas (in square kilometres), as well as the 1976 Census of Canada final population counts adjusted to the 1981 census geographic areas.

# Geography Tape File

This file assigns to each 1981 census enumeration area (the basic geographic unit of census data collection) all higher geographic levels by codes and names. It includes all standard geographic codes, and also locates each enumeration area centroid according to Universal Transverse Mercator (UTM) coordinates and Lambert coordinates, as well as by latitude and longitude. Final population counts for all enumeration areas are also presented.

# Area Master Files

The Area Master Files (AMFs) contain a logical representation of all city streets and other selected features (such as railroad tracks, rivers, and municipal boundaries) in machine-readable form. The AMFs geographically reference every street, address range, block-face and centroid coordinate in the coverage area. An AMF is available for most centres with a population of 50,000 or more.

## User Summary Tape Support Files

These tape files contain the geographic identifiers for all records on User Summary Tapes. The geographic identification of each record on the various User Summary Tapes is obtained from the Geography Tape File and forms an integral part of each User Summary Tape. However, the UST support files are available separately.

# CARTLIBS

CARTLIBS are digital cartographic libraries of the boundaries and related features of various geostatistical areas, stored on magnetic tape files for use by computer mapping programmes. One type of tape file defines the boundaries of these areas, and another acts as an index for the boundary files and lists additional information for each area, such as land area, population, geographic codes, names, and centroids.

# PUBLIC USE SAMPLE TAPES

The Public Use Sample Tapes (PUSTs) are planned as micro-data files along the lines of the 1971/76 tapes. The exact details are still being discussed, but preliminary indications are that the files will consist of three separate universes; that is, persons, families and households. The tapes are expected to be available around April 1984.

Each of the three files mentioned will include as many variables and classes within variables as possible, the major constraint being to safeguard confidentiality. The geographic detail, too, will be determined in conjunction with the confidentiality consideration. Sample size will be subject to considerations of cost, number of tapes needed per universe, and the 1971/76 experience.

## CUSTOM TABULATIONS

Insofar as confidentiality constraints permit, Statistics Canada will produce for users, at cost, custom tabulations from the 1971, the 1976 and the 1981 Censuses of Population and Housing which are not already included in the main tabulation programme. A custom tabulation is defined as any tabulation not in the main tabulation programme which requires accessing one of the census micro-data bases. Types of tabulations which could require this micro-data access are:

- (a) a new variable or a new distribution of an existing variable;
- (b) a new cross-classification of variables;
- (c) a different geographic area;
- (d) a different output medium;
- (e) any combination of the above.

## New Variables on New Distributions

Statistics Canada can create new custom variables for users that are derived from existing data base variables (such as language assimilation, occupation social prestige rating, marketing indices, etc.) and we may create new distributions of existing variables (more detailed distributions or different collapsing).

# New Cross-classifications of Variables

Using an existing tabulation as a guide, a new custom tabulation could be produced where one or more variables have been added or substituted.

# Different Geographic Areas

Any tabulation which has been produced for any given geographic area can be retrieved for any other geographic area, subject to confidentiality and reliability constraints.

We are able to retrieve data from a variety of types of geographic areas:

- (a) standard geographic areas as defined by the census, such as: provinces, census divisions and subdivisions, census tracts, federal electoral districts, enumeration areas, etc.;
- (b) standard geographic areas from other censuses;

- (c) non-standard areas (areas defined by user). These are further broken down into three types:
  - (1) arithmetic manipulation of standard areas (+, -);
  - (2) simple shapes about a point (circle, square);
  - (3) polygons (many sided shapes) which require digitizing.

## Output Mediums

Statistics Canada is able to produce custom tabulations with various output mediums such as print copy, machine-readable magnetic tape, microform (microfiche, microfilm) and thematic maps.

# Confidentiality

In order to maintain the confidentiality of individuals who have answered the census questionnaire, we have implemented a system of random rounding on the last digit of every cell of every tabulation we produce for use outside of Statistics Canada. Additionally, when we are preparing tabulations involving income, individual cells of a tabulation below a given threshold count may be suppressed. Further information on random rounding and data suppression is available from Statistics Canada.

#### Reliability

Statistics Canada will reserve the right to refuse to tabulate or to suppress portions of any tabulation which we feel is not reliable.

#### Costs

Charges for custom tabulations are dependent on the full costs involved in their preparation, both manpower and machine costs. The components of these costs are geocoding costs (for non-standard areas requiring digitizing) and retrieval costs. Requests will be costed individually and could range from about fifty dollars to thousands of dollars.

#### INTRODUCTION

This is a guide to the reference maps of the 1981 Census of Canada. The reference maps show the boundaries of all census geostatistical areas: that is, the geographic areas for which census data are collected and published. The geostatistical areas shown on the reference maps include census divisions, census subdivisions (such as cities, towns and villages), federal electoral districts, enumeration areas, census metropolitan areas, census agglomerations, census tracts, and provincial census tracts. The reference maps are available as individual map sheets, often at a large scale, or are included in published bulletins, generally at a smaller scale with less geographic detail.

These maps are designed as reference tools and permit users to locate and identify census geostatistical areas and relate statistical data to their corresponding geographic area.

If users find the census geostatistical areas insufficient for their needs, then these maps may be used to formulate special requests for census data based on their own specific geographic areas of interest, e.g., school zones, traffic zones, police precincts, health districts, neighbourhoods, etc.

If these special user-defined areas comprise several complete census geostatistical areas (e.g., enumeration areas, census tracts, census subdivisions), then by utilizing these maps, users can identify the relevant groups of census areas in order to tabulate their own data or formulate a special request to have Statistics Canada tabulate census data reflecting these special areas.

If the user-defined areas do not respect any census-defined areas, then users may wish to have Statistics Canada retrieve census data using the Geographically Referenced Data Storage and Retrieval (GRDSR) system or Geocoding as it is also known. For further information regarding this service, users should direct inquiries to Census Customer Services, Statistics Canada, Ottawa, Ontario, KIA OT6.

This guide describes the kinds of census geostatistical areas shown on the map and indicates the map series that can be best used to locate these geostatistical areas. The guide also describes each map series, and the medium(s) in which each series is available, provides users with directions on how to order maps and, as well, furnishes the prices of maps.

#### TYPES OF CENSUS GEOSTATISTICAL AREAS ON REFERENCE MAPS

PROVINCES and TERRITORIES are the major political divisions of Canada. From a statistical point of view they are the basic units for which data are tabulated and cross-classified. Each province is identified by a two-digit code (e.g., Newfoundland 10). The first digit identifies the region. The ten provinces and two territories have been grouped into six regions as follows:

- l Atlantic Provinces
- 2 Quebec
- 3 Ontario
- 4 Prairie Provinces
- 5 British Columbia
- 6 Northern Territories

The second digit identifies the province or territory. They have been numbered 0 to 9 from east to west:

- 0 Newfoundland, Yukon
- 1 Prince Edward Island, Northwest Territories
- 2 Nova Scotia
- 3 New Brunswick
- 4 Quebec
- 5 Ontario
- 6 Manitoba
- 7 Saskatchewan
- 8 Alberta
- 9 British Columbia

The boundaries of provinces and territories are shown on the G81-10 map series.

A FEDERAL ELECTORAL DISTRICT (FED) is any territorial unit entitled to return a member to serve in the House of Commons. There are 282 FEDs in Canada based on the 1976 Representation Order. The boundaries of FEDs need conform to provincial boundaries only. Each FED is subdivided into enumeration areas for the purpose of census-taking.

Each FED is identified by a five-digit code. The first two digits identify the province and the last three digits identify the FED within the province (e.g., 35001 - Algoma - Ontario).

Each map sheet in the G81-18 series illustrates one FED. An index map of FEDs (1976 Representation Order) may be found in the 1981 Census bulletin, Catalogue No. 99-908.

CENSUS DIVISION (CD) refers to the general term applying to counties, regional districts, regional municipalities and five other types of geographic areas made up of groups of census subdivisions. In Newfoundland, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the term describes areas that have been created by Statistics Canada in cooperation with the provinces as an equivalent for counties. The G81-10 map series shows the boundaries of CDs. An index map of CDs is included in the Reference Maps bulletin, Catalogue No. 99-907.

CENSUS SUBDIVISION (CSD) refers to the general term applying to municipalities, Indian Reserves, Indian Settlements and unorganized territories. In Newfoundland, Nova Scotia and British Columbia, the term also describes geostatistical areas that have been created by Statistics Canada in cooperation with the provinces as an equivalent for municipalities.

The CSD boundaries for each province are included in the Reference Maps bulletin, Catalogue No. 99-907. In addition to these index maps, the boundaries of CSDs are shown on the G81-10 series and, for the greatest degree of detail, can also be found on the G81-12 and G81-14 series.

CENSUS CONSOLIDATED SUBDIVISION (CCS) refers to a geographically contiguous group of census subdivisions. Two rules are applied in delineating census consolidated subdivisions: (1) all census subdivisions smaller than 25 square kilometres are grouped with a larger subdivision; and (2) if a census subdivision greater than 25 square kilometres is surrounded on more than half its perimeter by another subdivision, it is included as part of the CCS formed by the other subdivision; if not, the census subdivision forms a CCS on its own.

The boundaries of CCSs are shown in the Reference Maps bulletin, Catalogue No. 99-907 and on a set of maps produced by the Census of Agriculture and available to users on demand. Users wishing greater detail can use the G81-12 series in conjunction with the 1981 Enumeration Area Reference Lists (Catalogue Nos. 99-909 to 99-918).

CENSUS METROPOLITAN AREA (CMA) refers to the main labour market area of an urbanized core (or continuously built-up area) having 100,000 or more population. CMAs are created by Statistics Canada and are usually known by the name of the urban area forming their urbanized core. They contain whole municipalities (or census subdivisions). CMAs are comprised of (1) municipalities completely or partly inside the urbanized core; and (2) other municipalities if (a) at least 40% of the employed labour force living in the municipality works in the urbanized core, or (b) at least 25% of the employed labour force working in the municipality lives in the urbanized core.

CENSUS AGGLOMERATIONS (CAs) are defined using the same criteria as CMAs; however, the urbanized core contains between 10,000 and 99,999 population.

The boundaries of CMAs and CAs are shown in the Reference Maps bulletin, Catalogue No. 99-906, and on the map series G81-15. The CMA boundaries are also shown on maps of the series G81-10.

CENSUS TRACT (CT) refers to a permanent small census geostatistical area established in large urban communities with the help of local specialists interested in urban and social science research. Census tracts are reviewed and approved by Statistics Canada according to the following criteria:

- (a) the boundaries must follow permanent and easily recognized lines on the ground;
- (b) the population must be between 2,500 and 8,000 with a preferred average of 4,000 persons, except for census tracts in the central business district, major industrial zones, or in peripheral rural or urban areas that may have either a lower or higher population;
- (c) the area must be as homogeneous as possible in terms of economic status and social living conditions; and
- (d) the shape must be as compact as possible.

All census metropolitan areas, all census agglomerations with a city having a population of 50,000 or more, and all other cities of at least 50,000 population at the previous census are eligible for a census tract programme.

Reference maps of CTs are included in the Census Tract bulletins (Catalogue Nos. 95-905 to 95-940 and 95-946 to 95-981). These maps are also available as separate map sheets. Detailed maps of each individual CT are available in the C81-13 and C81-13A map series.

PROVINCIAL CENSUS TRACT (PCT) refers to a permanent small census geostatistical area of rural and/or urban type. PCTs exist in the area not included in the Census Tract Programme. Populations of PCTs generally vary between 3,000 and 8,000 with a preferred average of 5,000. Boundaries, as much as possible, follow permanent physical features and/or geographic units suggested by the provinces. The G81-21 map series shows the boundaries of all PCTs.

ENUMERATION AREA (EA) refers to the spatial unit usually canvassed by one Census Representative. It is defined according to the following criteria: (1) Population -- the number of households in an enumeration area varies between a maximum of 375 households in large urban areas to a minimum of 125 in rural areas; (2) Limits -- an enumeration area, being the building block of all geostatistical areas, never cuts across any geographic area recognized by the census. Moreover, enumeration area boundaries are such that the Census Representative will be able to locate them without difficulty as, for example, streets, roads, railways, rivers and lakes. Enumeration areas are normally the smallest geographic unit for which census data are available. Each EA is identified by a three-digit number that is unique within each federal electoral district (e.g., FED 35001 EA 001).

For the 1981 Census, Canada was divided into approximately 41,200 EAs. For those FEDs covered by the G81-18 map series, an overview of the EA boundaries is presented. EAs are shown in greatest detail in the series G81-12 (rural EAs), G81-13 (EAs in CTs) and G81-14 (other urban EAs).

## PUBLISHED MAPS

Most of the different types of census geostatistical areas, except for enumeration areas, are shown on reference maps in published bulletins. These maps are generally at a relatively small scale and show the boundaries of the areas with a minimum of background detail. To find the precise location of boundaries, it is often necessary to refer to the individual map sheets in the series discussed below.

Two Reference Maps bulletins are available showing 1981 Census geostatistical area boundaries. The first bulletin (Catalogue No. 99-907) presents a series of maps showing census divisions, census subdivisions, and census consolidated subdivisions for each province. The second bulletin (Catalogue No. 99-906) presents two series of maps showing the parts and component municipalities of CMAs and CAs.

For each of the 36 urban centres in Canada having a census tract programme, CT bulletins are published presenting general population, dwelling, household, family, social and economic data. Included in each bulletin is a map or maps showing the relevant census tracts.

In the case of those bulletins presenting census data for census divisions or federal electoral districts, the relevant small scale reference maps accompany the data.

## INDIVIDUAL MAP SHEETS BY SERIES

In addition to the small scale reference maps included in the published bulletins, larger, more detailed maps are also available. Eight series of reference maps, at various levels of detail, are available for all the census geostatistical areas of the 1981 Census. These are as follows:

# Series G81-10: Provincial Maps

The maps in this series show the boundaries of census divisions and census subdivisions. Census metropolitan areas are also shown. Figure 1 shows part of one of these maps. Except for Quebec and Ontario, an entire province is shown on one map sheet. In the cases of Quebec and Ontario, seven and five maps, respectively, are required to show all of the CSDs for these two provinces. Map scales range from 1:250,000 in the most densely populated areas, to 1:4,000,000 in the Territories. An index map of all census divisions in Canada, at a scale of 1:5,000,000, is included in this series.

## Series G81-12: Rural Enumeration Areas


The basic purpose of this series is to show the boundaries of EAs in the rural areas of Canada. The National Topographic System (NTS) series of maps, at scales ranging from 1:50,000 to 1:500,000 (and smaller scales for the Yukon and Northwest Territories), are used for this series of census maps. The G81-12 series also shows the boundaries of census divisions, census subdivisions, and federal electoral districts (see Figure 2). A listing of the G81-12 series maps for each province is available on demand (see Supplementary References, page 142).

# Series G81-13: Census Tracts/Enumeration Areas

In this series, each map sheet covers one or more census tracts. Federal electoral district boundaries, enumeration area boundaries and street names, block numbers, and other physical features are identified (see Figure 3). The G81-13 series is available for the 36 tracted centres; i.e., the 24 CMAs and 12 tracted CAs. The published CT maps for each CMA and CA provide an index to the individual CTs available in this series. The scales of maps in this series vary considerably. The base maps of this series without EA boundaries are also available.


# Series G81-13A: Census Tracts/Enumeration Areas

The maps in this series are the same as those in the G81-13 series. However, for selected centres these maps are reduced to a standard size and are available in booklet form. - 129 -





## Series G81-14: Urban Enumeration Areas

The maps in this series show the boundaries of EAs located in the smaller urban centres containing four or more EAs. Most of the urban EAs not shown in the G81-13 series are included in the G81-14 series. The G81-14 series consists of place maps with enumeration area boundaries and street names (see Figure 4). Map scales in this series vary. A listing of the G81-14 series maps for each province is available on demand (see Supplementary References, page 142). Place maps for some small urban centres containing less than four EAs are also available; however, the EA boundaries are not shown. These boundaries can be added on special request.

# Series G81-15: Census Divisions/Census Subdivisions and Federal Electoral Districts/Enumeration Areas

This series is provided by the Geographical Services Directorate, Surveys and Mapping Branch, Department of Energy, Mines and Resources. Complete coverage of the country consists of 41 map sets at 1:500,000, five regional map sets at 1:2,000,000 and one map of the Northwest Territories and Yukon at 1:4,000,000. A set consists of a map showing census divisions and census subdivisions and a map showing federal electoral districts and census enumeration areas.

The 41 sets at 1:500,000 consist of the NTS base maps and two overlays: Overlay No. 1 showing census divisions, census subdivisions, census metropolitan areas and census agglomerations; and Overlay No. 2 showing federal electoral districts and enumeration areas (see Figures 5 and 6).


The 41 sets cover the following areas:

- Atlantic Provinces south of the 50th parallel
- Quebec (excluding Anticosti Island) south of the 50th parallel
- Ontario south of the 48th parallel
- Prairie Provinces and British Columbia south of the 52nd parallel

In the case of the five regional sets, while census divisions, census subdivisions, census metropolitan areas, census agglomerations and federal electoral districts are shown for the entire region, enumeration areas are shown for that portion of each region not covered by the sets at 1:500,000.

The single map for the Northwest Territories and the Yukon shows census divisions, census subdivisions, federal electoral districts, enumeration areas and unincorporated places and, in addition, population figures are given for each geostatistical area shown (see Figure 7).







## Series G81-18: Federal Electoral Districts/Enumeration Areas


All federal electoral districts are covered by this series. Each map sheet covers one FED. All map sheets are produced at a scale large enough to sufficiently depict the EA boundaries. The urban FED map sheets show census tract as well as EA boundaries (see Figure 8). The rural FED map sheets show the boundaries of census divisions, census subdivisions and enumeration areas (see Figure 9). An index map of the FEDs (1976 Representation Order) may be found in the 1981 Census bulletin (Catalogue No. 99-908).

# Series G81-21: Provincial Census Tracts

The purpose of this series is to show the boundaries of all PCTs. Those CMAs and CAs containing census tracts are also shown.

National Topographic System maps are used as the bases for this series. Features such as water bodies, place names, roads and railroads have been retained.

Aside from provincial boundaries and the limits of census tracted CMAs and CAs, no other geostatistical areas (e.g., census subdivisions or enumeration areas) are shown on this series. Users wishing to identify component EAs of PCTs must refer to the 1981 Enumeration Area Reference Lists for Provincial Census Tracts (Catalogue Nos. 99-914 to 99-917) for this information.





#### HOW TO ORDER

Two options are available to users when identifying the maps required. Requested maps may be identified by:

- (i) listing the reference numbers of map sheets using the lists of available maps or using the index maps available; or
- (ii) identifying the area required by place name or code.

The series number and medium desired should be specified for all maps ordered. To help speed the processing of the orders, the maps required should be listed in a logical sequence; i.e., in series order, by province, by NTS map number order, etc. (see sample order, page 144).

The time required to supply maps on demand varies according to the map series, the volume and the media required. When an order is filled, an invoice will be sent to the purchaser. Generally, prepayment will be required for all orders exceeding \$1.000.00.

### SUPPLEMENTARY REFERENCES - AIDS TO ORDERING MAPS

The following will aid users in identifying maps or codes for use in ordering maps:

The 1981 Census Place Name Reference Lists identify all census subdivisions and unincorporated places in Canada and identify, for each, the relevant NTS map number, G81 map series, latitude and longitude, Standard Geographical Classification code, and, in the case of unincorporated places, FED/EA number(s). The Enumeration Area Reference Lists (Catalogue Nos. 99-909 to 99-918) identify the relationship between and among the various census geostatistical areas. These lists identify the enumeration areas found within each CD, CSD, FED, CMA, CA, CT, PCT, urban area, etc.

Users wishing to identify the base maps appropriate to their request may wish to refer to the document "Map Coverage of Provinces with Enumeration Areas for the G81-12, G81-13, G81-14 and G81-18 Series" or to the document "Listing of Base Maps With Enumeration Areas for Each Province by Federal Electoral District".

All the documents mentioned above will be available through the nearest Statistics Canada Regional Reference Centre.


