BILATERAL AGRICULTURAL TRADE = \$170 MILLION IN 2017

ALABAMA EXPORTED \$55 MILLION TO CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$15M in fresh, chilled or frozen chicken
- \$9M in prepared meat
- \$8M in animal feed
- \$7M in ground nuts
- \$3M in chocolate products



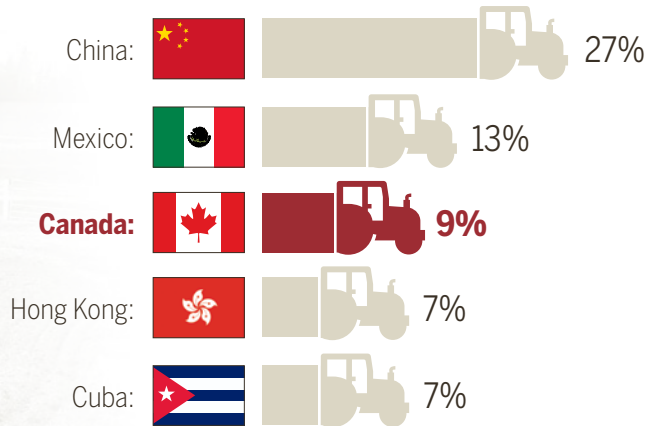
ALABAMA IMPORTED \$115 MILLION FROM CANADA, INCLUDING:

- \$72M in canola oil
- \$17M in baked goods
- \$6M in food preparations*
- \$5M in vegetables
- \$4M in beverages, spirits and vinegar

* The category "food preparations" includes products such as tea substitutes, vegetable preparations, flavoring extracts, powders and essences, milk or cream substitutes, jelly powders, and juices from concentrate.
