The Local Government Program in the Manitoba Region has the major responsibility for the development of "Local Government" in Indian communities in Manitoba along with all other programs.

This report is a summary of the accomplishments during the 1976/77 fiscal year.

There continues to be significant progress by Indian communities in Manitoba in the development of their Local Government units. This report indicates that progress is taking place, however, it also indicates areas where there is room for improvement.

With the continued co-operation of Chiefs and Councils and a strong effort by our staff, we will move closer to achieving total local control by Bands in Manitoba in 1977/78.

When reading the following pages, one must remember that while there were significant gains in 1976/77, the advances in one year must be measured against the long term objectives and be recognized as being steps toward a number of goals.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS 1976/77

The purpose of the Local Government Program is designed to foster the development of self-reliance by assisting Chiefs, Councils, Band staff and Band members at their request and commensurate with their ability to assume greater responsibility for the management of programs and services which are required in their communities through support and encouragement of evolving forms of Local Government and physical improvements of Indian communities.

The Local Government Section of the Local Government Program consists of one Regional Supervisor of Local Government Programs at a WP5 level, 8 Local Government Advisors at the WP4 level, and 6 Local Government Advisors at the WP3 level (including Thompson District and Island Lake District with 2 each.)

The main roles and functions of this section through the Local Government Advisors are the following:

- Act as Local Government Team leader by co-ordinating a number of Departmental Program staff in regular Team meetings with Chiefs and Councils.
- Liaise with Band Councils, Band members and Band staff.
- Provide technical and consultative services to Band Councils, staff and membership on Local Government.
- Assist Bands through advice and guidance to participate in non-branch program.
- Provide advice and guidance at local level on elections, by-laws, and all other aspects of Local Government legislation rules and regulations.
- Co-ordinate the delivery and interpretation of all Department programs at the local level.
- Assist Band Council with development of Community budgets and internal financial and administrative control systems.
- Analyse and report on the development of Local Government at the Band level.
- Report on and assist Band Council staff and Department staff to resolve problems.

- Provide advice, guidance and participate in training programs for Band Councils, Band staff, and members of Bands.
- Assist Band members, Band Councils, and Band staff to establish contact with a multitude of Government public and private agencies, Departments and firms to obtain professional, technical advice and access to programs and services.





- the recording and administration of triennial clothing.

2) <u>Band By-Laws</u>

- information to Bands regarding proper procedures related to by-laws.
- the recording and filing of all information connected to Band by-laws.

3) Band Policing Program

- the recording of terms of appointment for all the Supernumerary Special Constables.
- the arranging of Constable Training Programs.
- maintain a liaison role with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Manitoba Police Commission, and Dakota Ojibway Tribal Council Police Commission.

4) Other Duties

- maintains and provides statistical information for Band budget submissions.
- allocate funding to Bands for the policing program, core fund, recreation program, and Band membership.
- assists in annuity payments and the distribution of treaty obligations.

- -There were 14 Bands which directly handled the Band membership program responsibilities during 1976/77.







COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT

This section was comprised of a Regional Community Improvement Advisor and then two additional positions were approved early in the fiscal year. One as a Community Improvement Officer for Off and On-Reserve housing (C.M.H.C.) and a Community Improvement Officer for Subsidy Housing and Infrastructure. The staff was involved in the following programs:

1) Capital Programs

- a) Obtaining five year capital plan with priorities from Bands.
- b) Equitable allocation of capital funds to Bands.
- c) Encourage Bands to administer capital projects and process Resolutions for approval.
- d) Control of capital funds and expenditures.
- e) Provision and planning for construction of;
 - subsidy housing
 - C.M.H.C. On-Reserve housing
 - roads
 - sewer and water
 - sanitation
 - electrification
 - community buildings
 - plans and studies
 - fire protection

2) Maintenance and Repair Programs

- a) Reviewing Band budgets and allocating of O&M funds to Bands for;
 - repair and maintenance of roads
 - sewer and water facilities
 - sanitation
 - fire protection equipment

3) Off-Reserve Housing

 interviewing, screening, and processing of applications for Off-Reserve housing

- Regional mortgage management of the Off-Reserve housing program.
- liaison with the Department of Justice and C.M.H.C. for successful management of program.
- providing conditional forgiveable second mortgage to qualified applicants.
- providing a \$1,000 furnishing grant to qualified applicants.

4) Manitoba Northlands

- provision and control of funds for qualified infrastructure projects to Bands within the designated Northlands area.
- liaison with Federal and Provincial agencies.

5) F.L.I.P. and L.I.P. Programs

- obtain projects from Bands that would qualify for funding under F.L.I.P. and forward to Ottawa for approval.
- control of funds and reporting
- allocation and control of funds to support L.I.P. projects approved by manpower.

There were 30 fewer subsidy housing starts in 1976/77 compared to the 1975/76 fiscal year due to some changes in Band Council priorities. However, there is a significant improvement the percentage of housing units completed in the 1976/77 fiscal year. Band Councils are more experienced in handling their Capital Housing Programs.

Stackwall - Experimental Housing

Brokenhead Band

Five foundations constructed. One unit has walls and roof on.

Materials prepared for the project and target of five homes.

Brokenhead Band had some differences with University of Manitoba at the Band level concerning overseeing of the project which caused delays.

Fort Alexander Band

Did not sign a contract with the University of Manitoba. Project did not get underway. New Chief and Council elected.

Garden Hill Band

Band Council representatives advised they would prepare material this winter and build their experimental unit in 1977.

The Administration staff is engaged in the following activities:

- Typing of all correspondence and reports;
- Maintaining all Band files;
- Maintaining and reporting on travel for Local Government personnel;
- Payment of all Operation and Maintenance accounts;
- Capital Recording and keeping all capital program records;
- Maintaining records on Off-Reserve Housing Program;
- Preparation of computer input sheets for Operation and Maintenance budgets;
- Preparation of variance reports and corrective action for Operation and Maintenance and capital budgets.

To improve the efficiency of the Local Government Program, administration reviewed and redesigned a number of forms for better internal control. The main area being quarterly payments to Bands and staff travel.

The new Band budget format was adopted by the Bands during the latter part of 1976/77 and will be used for the 1977/78 fiscal year. This was a progressive step.

The Band budgets and the Financial and Administrative Regulations adopted by the Bands in Manitoba are set up in Band budget binders more commonly referred to as our "red binder file".

They contain the approved Operation and Maintenance, capital, Social Services, Education, and core funding budgets approved for the 1977/78 fiscal year.

The Band budget binders are used by Program Managers and Section
Heads for ready reference to approved budgets in the various activities
indicated above. They also contain approved copies of Band Council
Resolutions indicating an enrichment to a particular activity.

Further improvements are being undertaken in 1977/78 as a result of continued review of administrative practice in the Local Government program.
