

Veterans Independence Program



The Veterans Independence Program (VIP) helps you remain independent and self-sufficient at home or in your community. Depending on your circumstances and health needs, Veterans Affairs Canada (VAC) can offer financial assistance to obtain a wide range of services, including: housekeeping; grounds maintenance, such as snow removal or lawn mowing; personal care; care and support from a health professional; home adaptations; access to nutrition; and ambulatory health care.

Who qualifies for the Veterans Independence Program?

You may qualify if you have a health need for any of the VIP services and you:

- have a VAC disability benefit; or
- are a low-income Veteran; or
- are in receipt of the Prisoner of War Compensation; or
- are eligible for VAC's Long Term Care program, but are on a wait list; or
- have been the **primary caregiver** for an eligible Veteran or **civilian**; or
- are the low-income or disabled survivor of an eligible Veteran or civilian.

How to apply

Important information

- VIP services can include funding for care in a facility when remaining at home is no longer practical and a greater level of nursing and personal assistance is required.
- VIP services for survivors and primary caregivers are limited to housekeeping and/or grounds maintenance.
- VIP can only be provided for services within Canada.

Key terms

Primary caregiver is any adult who lived with the Veteran; and was the primary provider of care to the Veteran; and was not receiving a wage from the Veteran for this care; and was maintained by or maintained the Veteran for a continuous period of at least one year when the Veteran passed away or was admitted to a long term care facility.

Civilian refers to individuals who served in support of the military during wartime, such as civilian air crew members, fire fighters, overseas welfare workers, etc.
