FPCC September meeting

Council members met on September 11, 2018, and discussed a number of files, including the development of FPCC's future Strategic Plan, as well as the administration of the *Agricultural Products Marketing Act* (APMA). They discussed upcoming public hearings for the inquiry into the merits of restablishing a promotion and research agency for industrial hemp. Members also had the opportunity to attend an Egg Farmers of Canada orientation session.

Additionally, during this meeting, the FPCC approved the foillowing agencies proposed regulatory and by-law amendments:

Canadian Hatching Egg Producers

- The Canadian Hatching Egg Producers Quota Regulations to Schedule 1 (final allocation for 2018) and to Schedule 2 (initial allocation for 2019).
- CHEP's *By-Law NO.1* (being the General By-law of the Agency) thereby increasing the Chair and Directors fees and stipends for travel and meeting attendance, and the Chair, Vice-Chair, second Vice-Chair and Directors monthly stipends, as well as the meals and incidental allowances, effective January 1, 2019.

• The Canadian Turkey Marketing Agency Quota Regulations, 1990 amending the national quota for the 2018-19 control period (April 29, 2018, to April 27, 2019).



• The Canadian Chicken Marketing Quota Regulations for the allocation periods A-153, which runs

from October 28 to December 22, 2018, and A-154, which runs from December 23, 2018, to February 16, 2019.



• The Beef Cattle Research, Market Development and Promotion Levies Order adding an additional

category of 'fed cattle' for the province of Quebec. This will allow the *Fédération des producteurs de bovins du Québec* to collect a levy on fed cattle marketed in interprovincial and export trade. The proposed Levies Order comes in effect on the date of registration, and expires on June 29, 2019.

A Panel was appointed by Brian Douglas, FPCC Chairman, to examine the merits of establishing a PRA under Part III of the Farm Products Agencies Act (FPAA).
