**Labour Market
 Development Agreement**

\$3.25M is invested annually to help unemployed EI-eligible Yukon residents find and maintain employment

Yukon designs and delivers Employment Benefits and Support Measures

Examined programs and services include Skills Development Employment Benefit (including Apprentices), Targeted Wage Subsidies and Employment Assistance Services

Active Claimants ← Key Results → Former Claimants

Skills Development Employment Benefit is effective at **improving earnings and incidence of employment** among active claimants (compared to non-participants)

Employment Assistance Services are effective at **improving earnings and reducing EI use** among active claimants (compared to non-participants)

For active claimants, the **social benefits of participation exceeded the cost of participation** in both programs over time

Some former claimants participants do not appear to be benefiting from the programs.
 The **proportion of participants employed is lower** after participation.
 This is due in part to local conditions and retirement decisions of older participants.

Former claimants participants showed **higher average earnings and lower average proportions on EI and social assistance** after participation (compared to pre-participation levels)
