Sir,-I hare the honour to submit to you the Public Accounts for the Fiscal Yeur ended March 31, 1914.

The receipts on account of Consolidated Fund for the year amounted to $\$ 163,1$ it,394.56 and the expenditure on the same account to $\$ 127,384,472.99$. The surplua of receipts over expenditure on this account was therefore $\$ 35,789,921.57$.

## SAVINGS BANKIS.

It the close of the fiseal year, the balance at the credit of the depositors in the Post Office and Government Savings Banks amounted to $\$ 55,567.603 .42$, a deerease of $\$ 1,572,879.97$ as compared with the balance held on Mareh 31, 1913. The withdrawals during the year exceeded the deposits by $\$ 3,200,218.22$, while $\$ 1,627,338.25$ was added for interest acerued, thus making a net decrease of $\$ 1,572,879.97$.

## INVESTMENTS.

Investments on account of the Sinking Funds of the various loans were made during the year to the amount of $\$ 1,371,428.61$. The 4 per cent Guaranteed Loan of 1578 , of $£ 1,700,000$, which matured on the 1st Oetober; 1913, carried a Sinking Fund of $\$ 5,964,001.05$ consisting wholly of 3 per cent 1888 stock. On the maturity of this loan the $\$ 5,964,001.053$ per eent stock was cancelled, thus reducing the amount at the credit of the Sinking Funds to that extent. The total of the Investments at the eredit of the Sinking Fuuds, which stood at $\$ 13,737,567.42$ on Mareh 31st, 1913, at the conclusion of the fiscal year 1914 was consequently reduced to $\leqslant 9,144,994.98$.

Advances were made under statute to the Montreal Harbour Commissioners and t) the Quebec Harbour Commissioners amounting to $\$ 5,56 \because, 000.00$ as under :-

Under authority of Chapter 24, 3 and 4 George Y. (1913), "The Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Bond Purehase Aet," £2,645,000, or $\$ 12,872,333.27$, Grand Trunk Pacific Railway 3 per eent mortgage bonds were purchased during the fiseal vear 1913-14.

The total of 3 per cent mortgage bonds purchased under authority of above Act amounts to $£ 6,800,000$ or $\$ 33,093,333.23$ as follows :-

Under authority of the "Grand Trunk Pacific Railway Company's Loan Act, 1913 ," $\$ 3,500,000.00$, of the total amount of $\$ 15,000,000.00$ authorized, was advaneed to that Company, being seeured by the pledging of an equal amount of 4 per cent bonds of said Company deposited with the Minister of Finance and Receiver General. Since the berimning of the fiseal year 1914-15, further adrances on this amount hase
been made to the Company amounting to $\$ 0,500,000$ making the total of $\$ 15,000,000$ authorized by ahove mentioned Act．This Loan of $\$ 15,000,000$ ，together with the Loan of $\$ 10,000,000$ ，made in 1909－10 under authority of Cap． 19 of Acts of 1909， makes a total of $25,000.000$ ，adrance by war of Loans to above Company．
