Anyone using opioids can overdose.

Fentanyl and other dangerous substances are being mixed with other drugs.

Signs of an Opioid Overdose



Blue lips or nails



Dizziness and confusion



Can't be woken up



Choking, gurgling or snoring sounds



Slow, weak or no breathing



Drowsiness or difficulty staying awake

Suspect an Overdose?

CALL 911 or **Emergency Services**

Administer naloxone if you have it Stay with the person until help arrives
