
As part of the spring 2013 Report of the Auditor General of Canada, Chapter 8, Spending on the Public Security and Anti-Terrorism (PSAT) Initiative, the Auditor General noted that between 2001 and 2009, \$12.9 billion was approved for department and agency programs to fund activities related to public security and anti-terrorism. The Auditor General also noted that departments and agencies reported on about \$9.8 billion in spending to the Treasury Board Secretariat and that information on how departments used \$3.1 billion in initiative funding was not available.

The Auditor General did not recommend a reconciliation of the difference. However, the Treasury Board Secretariat decided to do a retroactive reconstruction of the financial elements of the PSAT initiative to provide greater clarity. The following documents provide more information:
