Wholesale sales rise in March

Wholesale sales rose 1.1% to \$62.8 billion in March, more than offsetting the decline in February. The motor vehicle and parts subsector contributed the most to the gain. Excluding this subsector, wholesale sales rose 0.2%.

March sees more visitors from the US

US residents made 2.1 million trips to Canada in March, up 2.7% from February and 7.4% higher compared with March 2017. After accounting for normal seasonal variation, the number of same-day car trips rose 5.1% from February 2018 to 702,000, up 6.8% from March 2017.

Residential building prices climb in the first quarter

Prices for the construction of new residential buildings rose more than those for new non-residential buildings in the first quarter of 2018. Increases for both building types were driven, in part, by higher costs for masonry work, as well as for materials including steel, lumber and concrete.
