The Consumer Price Index holds steady in May

The Consumer Price Index rose 2.2% on a year-over-year basis in May, matching the increase in April. All eight major components increased on a year-over-year basis in May, although five of the eight major components grew at a slower rate.

Slower auto sales affect retail sales

Following three consecutive monthly increases, retail sales in April declined 1.2% to \$49.5 billion. The decrease was primarily due to lower sales at motor vehicle and parts dealers. Inclement weather in many parts of Canada may have contributed to lower seasonal purchases.

Treating high blood pressure

Hypertension affects about 1 in 4 Canadian adults, and becomes more common as people age, resulting in many negative health implications. A new study looks at factors that may explain some of the differences in hypertension control between women and men aged 60 to 79.

Canada's correctional population declines

The number of adults and youth being supervised by correctional services in Canada has fallen by almost one-fifth since 2012/2013. There were, on average, 117,645 adults (18 years and older) supervised in either custody or a community program on a given day in the 11 reporting provinces and territories in 2016/2017.
