Homicide rate hits nearly a 10-year high

Homicide in Canada hit its highest rate in almost a decade in 2017. Much of the increase was the result of more firearm-related and gang-related incidents. The firearm-related homicide rate increased 18% from 2016 to 0.72 per 100,000 population—the highest rate since 1992.

Over 400,000 people have unmet homecare needs

An estimated 1.2 million Canadian adults reported having home care needs in the previous year, with one-third of them (433,000) not having their home care needs met. A new study in *Health Reports* uses data from the 2015/2016 Canadian Community Health Survey to describe unmet home care needs.

Combined Canadian governments' deficit falls by almost half

The net operating deficit of the consolidated Canadian General Government—federal, provincial–territorial and local governments combined—was \$8.9 billion in 2017, down from \$16.9 billion in 2016. That deficit equalled 0.4% of the gross domestic product in 2017.

Airfares drive up the Consumer Price Index

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) rose 2.4% on a year-over-year basis in October, following a 2.2% increase in September. Month over month, the CPI increased 0.3% in October with prices for airfares, passenger vehicles and travel tours accelerating the most.
