OTTAWA, January 26, 1949 - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics issues to-day a report containing estimates of farm cash income from the sale of farm products and from supplementary payments for the months of January to September 1946, 1947 and 1948. These estimates are based on reports of marketings and prices received by farmers for the principal farm products. The estimates are subject to revision as more complete data become available.

CASH INCOME FROM THE SALE OF FARM PRODUCTS

A preliminary estimate indicates that during the first nine months of 1948 cash income of Canadian farmers from the sale of farm products amounted to \$1,762,814,000. This amount compares with cash returns of \$ 1,147,300,000 and \$1,282,112,000 for the corresponding periods of 1946 and 1947 respectively. With the inclusion of supplementary cash payments (i.e. cash payments made under the provisions of the Prarie Farm Assistance Act in 1946, 1947 and 1948; the Wheat Acreage Reduction Act in 1946 and 1947 and the Prairie Farm Income Act in 1946.) cash receipts during the first nine months of 1948 amounted to \$1,778,635,000 as against \$1,292,306,000 for the same period a year ago and \$1,163,566,000 in 1946.

The 37 per cent increase in the 1948 figure over that of 1947 can be attributed in large part to a significant increase in the prices paid for farm products and the substantial sums paid out as grain equalization and adjusting payments by the Canadian Wheat Board and western grain companies. During the first nine months of 1948, the Canadian wheat Board paid out in the form of equalization and adjusting payments \$153,560,000 on wheat, \$3,762,000 on oats and \$4,684,000 on flaxseed. In addition western grain companies paid out a total of \$7,625,000 on oats and barley delivered to them by farmers during the period August 1 to October 21, 1947. According to the index of farm prices of agricultural products the general level of farm product prices during the first nine months of 1948 was approximately 20 per cent higher than for the corresponding period a year earlier. Generally higher prices for grains together with increased marketings of wheat and flaxseed have more than offset smaller deliveries of the coarse grains to give an increased cash income from this source in 1948. Total cash income of \$968,496,000 from the sale of livestock and livestock products during the first nine months of 1948 was 36 per cent higher than for the corresponding period of 1947. While increases in the marketings of some classes of livestock were evident, the overall increase in prices was the more important factor. The sale of dairy products was the top contributor to the 1948 total followed by wheat and cattle and calves.

Without exception gains in the cash income from the sale of farm products occurred in all provinces. In absolute terms, the largest gain in cash returns was registered in Saskatchewan. On a percentage basis the greatest increase took place in Manitoba,
