FARM CASH RECEIPTS, 1965(1) (Formerly Farm Cash Income)

An advance preliminary estimate indicates that, in 1965, cash receipts received by farmers from farming operations (excluding supplementary payments set forth on page 2) totalled 3,741.1 million dollars, 8.3 per cent above the previous record high of 3,455.6 million dollars established in 1964. These estimates include cash receipts from the sale of farm products, Canadian Wheat Board participation payments on previous years' grain crops, net cash advances on farm-stored grains in Western Canada, and deficiency payments made by the Agricultural Stabilization Board. No deductions are made for the cost of production of commodities sold.(2)

The gain in total cash receipts in 1965 reflects higher Canadian Wheat Board participation payments and increased returns from the sale of cattle, hogs, poultry and dairy products, potatoes, barley, rapeseed, and vegetables. On the other hand, a substantial drop in the marketings of wheat resulted in a marked decline in total receipts from this commodity at the time of delivery. Declines of somewhat lesser importance were also recorded for flaxseed, fruit and tobacco.

⁽²⁾ Estimates of all farm income from farming operations as well as costs incurred in farm production are published in the spring of each year in the DBS publication entitled Farm Net Income (Catalogue No. 21-202 and 21-204).



Under the provisions of the Prairie Farm Assistance Act(1) farmers also received, in 1965, supplementary payments amounting to 11.4 million dollars as against 8.5 million in 1964. When added together, farm cash receipts from farming operations and supplementary payments totalled 3,752.6 million dollars, 8.3 per cent above the previous record of 3,464.1 million dollars set in 1964.

A complete revision of estimates of farm cash receipts based on data from the 1961 Census of Agriculture and the 1958 Farm Expenditure and Income Survey is nearing completion and will be published in the spring in place of our regular detailed estimates. This revision will extend from the late forties to 1965.
