


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FARM NET INCOME, 1951

NET INCOME OF FARM OPERATORS FROM FARMING OPERATIONS, 1951

Preliminary estimates indicate that during 1951, Canadian farm operators (ex. Newfoundland) realized a net income from farming operations of 2,221,2 million dollars. This figure, the highest yet to be recorded, is 53 per cent above the revised estimate of 1,451.7 million dollars for 1950 and 32.1 per cent above the previous high of 1,681.6 million dollars realized in 1948. This significant increase in 1951 over 1950 was the net result of a substantial increase of 32 per cent in the gross farm income and a lesser increase of 8 per cent in the farm operating expenses, including depreciation charges. Gross farm income in 1951 reached an all-time high of 3,608.6 million dollars as a result of new high records being established for returns from the sale of farm products and income in kind and a near record for the value of year-end changes in farm-held stocks of grains and live stock. Income in kind includes the value of that produce grown by farm operators and consumed in the farm home plus an imputed rental value of the farm dwelling.

Cash income from the sale of farm products at 2,825.5 million dollars for 1951 was 27.3 per cent above the 1950 level and 13.6 per cent higher than the former record of 2.486.6 million dollars set in 1949. Contributing to the high level of cash receipts were very large grain participation and adjusting payments made on previous years' western grain crops. During the year the record total of 312.9 million dollars was paid to prairie farmers in connection with the final payment on the 1945-50 Canada - United Kingdom wheat pool and the interim and final payments on the 1950 crops of wheat, oats and barley. Spring deliveries of grains in the prairie provinces were also unusually high in 1951 as a result of the larger crops in 1950 and the unfavourable weather conditions which hindered harvesting and normal deliveries during the fall months. The monthly index of farm prices of agricultural products was consistently and substantially higher in 1951 than in 1950. It rose almost without interruption for the first seven months of the year until it reached the all-time high of 307.7 in July. Although it gradually declined for the remainder of the year, it was still about 18 points above the 1950 level in December.

The value of year-end inventory changes of farm-held grains and live stock amounted to 353.7 million dollars as compared with the estimated value of 130.7 million dollars for 1950 and the record high of 353.9 million for 1942. The enlarged year-end inventories for 1951 resulted from a general build-up of the live-stock population and a huge carry-over of grains in the Prairie Provinces. Bumper grain crops in the prairie provinces coupled with adverse harvesting conditions and delayed marketings provided a substantial accumulation of both threshed and unthreshed grains on western farms at the end of the year. Estimates of grain inventories at the end of 1951 include both threshed and unthreshed grains.

All items included in farm operating expenses were higher in 1951 than in 1950 and total expenses including depreciation charges, were estimated at 1,397.7 million dollars as compared with 1,296.0 million dollars for 1950. Larger crops and higher values per acre of farm land contributed to increased rental payments, both cash and kind. Although 1951 wage rates were about 13 per cent

higher than in 1950, the labour force employed in agriculture was smaller than a year ago. Larger interest payments on indebtedness have resulted in part from an increase in mortgages and the larger amounts of money made available to farmers under the terms of the Farm Improvement Loans Act. Continued mechanization of farms, especially with power equipment, has meant further rises in farmers' total outlay for operation and maintenance of machinery. Increased expenditures for fertilizers reflect larger quantities used at higher prices.

Farm net income in 1951 was higher in all provinces. The greatest gain both on a percentage basis and in absolute terms occurred in Saskatchewan. On a percentage basis the increase over 1950 was 113 per cent, and in absolute terms it amounted to 399.2 million dollars. This tremendous increase is largely attributable to very large grain participation and adjustment payments and to greatly expanded stocks of grains on farms at the end of the year.

In Table I below, is summarized the preliminary estimate of farm net income, by provinces, for the calendar year 1951, and revised estimates for 1949 and 1950. These estimates represent revisions to and a continuation of the farm income series contained in the Handbook of Agricultural Statistics, Part II. The scope and sources of data used in farm income estimates are outlined in the Handbook. No information is available respecting Newfoundland.
