

NET INCOME OF FARM OPERATORS FROM FARMING OPERATIONS, 19551

Farm net income from farming operations in Canada is estimated at 1,454.3 million dollars for the year 1955. This represents an increase of about 22 per cent over the revised estimate of 1,189.9 million dollars for 1954. The record high level of 2,154.5 million dollars was reached in 1951 and the average for the post-war years (1946-1954) was 1,564.4 million dollars.

Larger crops in the Prairie Provinces resulted in an increase in December 31, 1955 farm-held grain inventories over 1954 year-end holdings. This factor had a marked effect on the increase in farm net income in 1955. Also contributing to the increased net income were larger inventories of livestock and a minor rise in the value of income in kind; the latter item includes the value of that produce grown by farm operators and consumed in the farm home plus an imputed rental value of the farm dwelling. Offsetting these increases to some extent were lower returns from the sale of farm products and increased farm operating expenses and depreciation charges.

During 1955, farm cash income from the sale of farm products and from participation payments on previous years' grain crops amounted to 2,352.6 million dollars as compared with 2,395.3 million for 1954 and the all-time high of 2,849.3 million dollars established in 1952. On a commodity basis the more important reductions in cash income were recorded for oats, barley, rye, clover and grass seed, hogs and total participation payments. The more important increases occurred in the case of wheat, flaxseed, corn, potatoes, tobacco, cattle, poultry and dairy products.

Income from wheat rose from 322.0 to 330.8 million dollars as a result of increased marketings. On the other hand, wheat participation payments totalling 25.7 million dollars in 1955, were well below the 1954 payments of 97.4 million dollars; oats and barley payments provided a partial offset to the decline in wheat payments when they rose from 15.5 million in 1954 to 21.5 million in 1955. The greatest proportional increase in cash income for any commodity occurred in the case of flaxseed when the combination of a very substantial increase in marketings and higher prices provided total returns of 40.4 million dollars as against 20.0 million in 1954. Higher marketings of corn and higher average prices for potatoes provided increased returns from these two commodities.

Total cash receipts from livestock, at 703 million dollars for 1955, almost equalled those of a year earlier. A substantial decline in the returns from hogs was balanced by an equal increase in income from the sale of cattle. An increase of both marketings and prices in 1955 over 1954 accounted for the enhanced returns from cattle. Although the marketings of hogs were above the 1954 level, prices averaged much lower. Income from dairy products was up in 1955 as a result of increased production. Little change was indicated for eggs with higher prices being counterbalanced by smaller marketings.

Farm operating expenses and depreciation charges in 1955 were estimated at 1,547.2 million dollars, about 4 per cent above the revised 1954 estimate of 1,485.5 million dollars, but slightly more than 2 per cent below the peak level of 1,582.2 million dollars established in 1952. Increased expenditures were recorded for nearly all commodities and services used in the farm business. Rental payments, particularly share-rent payments in the Prairie Provinces. contributed more than any other single item to increased farm operating expenses. Property taxes continued their steady upward climb, rising from 120.5 million dollars in 1954 to 127.6 million in 1955. Additional borrowing on the part of farmers increased their outlay in the form of interest payments. Higher prices and larger purchases of prepared livestock feeds were reflected in total expenditures for feed of 257.5 million dollars in 1955, as compared with 250.7 a year earlier. Tractor expenses reached an estimated 132.4 million dollars as against a revised figure of 127.7 million in 1954. Present estimates indicate that farmers curtailed expenditures for hired labour and fertilizers during 1955. The wage bill, including the value of board and lodging, amounted to 161.7 million dollars, slightly below the revised estimate of 163.4 for the previous year. Smaller purchases of fertilizer and slightly lower prices accounted for the reduction in farmers' outlay for this item.

In Table 1 below is summarized the preliminary estimate of farm net income, by provinces, for the calendar year 1955, and revised estimates for 1953 and 1954. It should be noted that, in the process of rounding, the provincial estimates in Table 1 may not add to the total for Canada in all years. These estimates represent a continuation of the farm income series contained in the Handbook of Agricultural Statistics, Part II. No information is available for Newfoundland.
