



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TRENDS IN CANADIAN AGRICULTURE

This bulletin supersedes a supplement published in March, 1960 to the Handbook of Agricultural Statistics, Reference Paper No. 25 - Part III, Trends in Canadian Agriculture, issued in August, 1955 by the Economics Division, Canada Department of Agriculture, in co-operation with the Agriculture Division, Dominion Bureau of Statistics, Department of Trade and Commerce.

The statistics presented in this supplement include the latest data available at the time of publication.

Certain definitions have changed during the periods covered by statistics contained in this publication. The definition of a farm was altered in the 1951 and 1961 census from that previously used. The 1941 census counted as farms all holdings one acre or more in size, if the 1940 production was valued at \$50 or more and it counted as separate farms parts of farms lying outside the municipality in which the farm headquarters were located. The 1951 census defined a farm as a holding on which agricultural operations were carried out, (a) if three acres or more in size, or (b) from one to three acres in size with a value of agricultural production of \$250 or more, in the preceding year. In the 1961 census, a farm was defined as a holding of one acre or more with the sales of agricultural products valued at \$50 or more. The change in definition has affected the statistics related to numbers of occupied farms and other data derived from these statistics. The number of farms in Canada in 1941 was 733,000 according to the definition then used but would have been 678,000 using the 1951 definition. The number of farms in Canada in 1961 was 481,000 but would have been 522,000 using the 1951 definition. It should also be noted that a farm as here defined is a classification made for census purposes. It includes many small units which would not necessarily conform to what is commonly considered a farm.

The definition of the term "urban" was also changed in both the 1951 and 1961 census. In earlier censuses the urban population statistics included all people living within the boundaries of incorporated cities, towns and villages, regardless of size. In 1951, the urban statistics included all those living in cities, towns, and villages, whether incorporated or unincorporated, with a population of 1,000 or more, plus the population of all parts of census metropolitan areas. The 1961 definition differed from that of 1951 in that any non-urbanized fringes within metropolitan areas was excluded from urban population and urbanized fringes adjoining certain smaller cities (if the city together with its urbanized fringe was 10,000 population or over) was included.
