## STOCKS OF CANADIAN GRAIN, MARCH 31, 1951

Ottawa, April 19, 1951 (3 p.m.) - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics today issues its report on stocks of Canadian grain in all positions at March 31, 1951. The data are obtained from the Bureau's annual March-end survey of grain held on farms, from mill returns and from data supplied by the Board f Grain Commissioners relative to stocks of grain in commercial positions 1/. The statistics on total stocks as presented below differ from the weekly visible supply figures by the inclusion of farm stocks and certain mill stocks. Farm stocks include seed held for the 1951 crop and grain required for live stock and poultry feed until new-crop grain becomes available.

Wheat - Total stocks of Canadian wheat in all North American positions at March 31, 1951 were estimated at 353 million bushels, some 103 million bushels more than last year's total. Only 370 thousand bushels of this year's March 31 stocks of Canadian wheat were held in the United States. The estimated amount held on Canadian farms at March 31 this year was 161 million bushels as against 112 million a year ago. Of the 191 million bushels in Canadian commercial positions 133 million, or 70 per cent, were held in country elevators, interior private and mill elevators, and interior terminal elevators. Stocks at Fort William-Port Arthur and Vancouver-New Westminster were 36 million and 3.5 million bushels respectively. The remaining 19 million bushels were either in transit or held in mill bins, in eastern elevators and at Churchill.

The estimated quantity of wheat remaining on farms in the Prairie Provinces at March 31 amounted to 152 million bushels, with the provincial distribution as follows: Manitoba, 17 million; Saskatchewan, 100 million; and Alberta, 35 million bushels. From these stocks will be taken seed for the 1951 crop and such amounts as may be required for live stock and poultry feed during the remaining one-third of the crop year, leaving the balance to be divided between deliveries until July 31 and carryover stocks at that date.

The estimated quantities of wheat for use as feed in the provinces where it was produced during the crop year 1950-51 are up by approximately one-third from the 1949-50 level, with all provinces except Manitoba and British Columbia indicating increased feeding of home-grown wheat. Estimated quantities fed or to be fed in the Prairie Provinces are up from 17.1 million to 22.6 million bushels. For all Canada (excluding Newfoundland) the estimate of wheat fed or to be fed in the province where grown amounts to 41 million bushels as against 31 million in 1949-50. These quantities do not include wheat moved interprovincially under the Federal Freight Assistance Plan.

Coarse Grains and Flaxseed - Stocks of Canadian oats at March 31, 1951 amounted to 230 million bushels of which 193 million were on farms. At

This year's barley stocks, at 111 million bushels, were also well above last year's level of 66 million. Farm-held stocks this year were 73 million as compared with 46 million a year ago.

Rye stocks at March 31, estimated at 10.9 million bushels, were up only slightly from last year's total of 10.4 million. Farm stocks of rye in both years were approximately 4 million bushels. The quantity of flaxseed in store this year was only 3 million bushels, less than half the March 31, 1950 stocks of 6.8 million.

## Stocks on Farms at March 31, 1951

At March 31, 1951, the quantity of wheat remaining on farms amounted to 161,450,000 bushels or 35 per cent of the total 1950 wheat crop of 461,664,000 bushels. At the same date last year 111,665,000 bushels or 30 per cent remained from the 1949 crop of 371,406,000 bushels.

Of the other crops, the proportions and the quantities in bushels remaining on farms at March 31, 1951, with corresponding figures at the same date last year within brackets, were as follows: Oats 46 per cent or 193,138,000 (39 per cent or 124,814,000); barley 42 per cent or 72,550,000 (38 per cent or 46,349,000); rye 30 per cent or 4,075,000 (39 per cent or 3,952,000); flaxseed 31 per cent or 1,390,000 (28 per cent or 633,000); buckwheat 34 per cent or 1,346,000 (28 per cent or 1,009,000); shelled corn 37 per cent or 5,127,000 (26 per cent or 3,543,000); potato es 35 per cent or 34,051,000 (29 per cent or 25,955,000); hay and clover 24 per cent or 3,079,000 tons (23 per cent or 2,784,000 tons).

## STOCKS OF CANADIAN GRAIN AT MARCH 31, 1951 1/

The Dominion Bureau of Statistics in cooperation with the Board of Grain Commissioners for Canada has collected and compiled data showing stocks of Canadian grain as of March 31, 1951. The quantities on farms are estimated from the reports of crop correspondents. Stocks in flour mills are estimated from monthly returns made by mill operators.
