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## VALUE OF FRUIT PRODUCTION - 1965

The total farm value of the 1965 commercial fruit crop in Canada is estimated at 64.4 million dollars, about 13 per cent below the 1964 total of 74.0 million dollars. The 1965 total figure was comprised of 31.0 million dollars from the sales of apples, 13.1 million dollars from the sales of tender tree fruits and 20.3 million dollars from sales of small fruit crops. The decrease in value of sales from the previous year was associated with a smaller return from sales of all crops with the exception of plums and prunes, raspberries, blueberries and cranberries.

Ontario growers realized an estimated 28.4 million dollars from the sales of fruit crops in 1965, about 11 per cent below the previous year. Returns were smaller for all crops, except plums and prunes, sweet cherries and strawberries. Of the total decrease in value of 3.6 million dollars, 1.9 million was attributable to the apple crop which was less in 1965 than in 1964 and the rest of the decrease was mostly in peaches and sour cherries.

The value of British Columbia-grown fruit reached an estimated 18.6 million dollars in 1965, compared with 25.0 million dollars in 1964. This decrease of about 6.4 million was largely the result of a smaller return from sales of all crops except apples and some small fruit crops. The lower returns were brought about by drastically curtailed production in 1965 as a result of low temperature damage the previous winter.

The value of fruit production in Quebec for 1965 was lower than the previous year by 1.7 million dollars. The total value of sales of fruit crops in the Atlantic provinces was 2.1 million dollars above the 1964 level.

In Table 2, the estimated volume and value of apples sold on the fresh market and those sold for processing for both 1964 and 1965 are shown. Similar estimates for the other fruits in Quebec, Ontario, and British Columbia are also included in this table.

Crop estimates presented in this report refer to commercially grown fruit only. Farm value as indicated in table 1 is an estimate of returns from fruit crop sales, whether for processing or for the fresh market. Table 2 includes a breakdown between the fresh market and processing sales. Except where otherwise noted the data were supplied to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by Provincial and Federal Departments of Agriculture personnel in the various fruit growing areas and by the Quebec Bureau of Statistics. The 1965 figures are preliminary and subject to revision.
