FRUIT FRODUCTION AND CONTRACTED ACREAGE OF VEGETABLES, 19 4 9
OTTAWA, July 5, 1949 - The Dominion Bureau of Statistios, in comoperation with the Larketing Servico of the Department of Agriculture and the Provincial Departments of Agriculture, issues to =hor a report containing the first estimates of fruit production and the coctractod acreages of the major vegetable crops used by processors.

## SUMMARY

The first estimates of fruit production in Canade in 1949 show moderate increases of most fruit since last season. Apple production is ourrently estimated at $16,770,000 \mathrm{bu}$ or 25 percont above the 1948 level. The pear srop will amount to $831,000 \mathrm{bu}$. Which is slightly larger than the 1948 crop 0: 789,000 bu. Plume and punes also are expected to show an inorease this season anti are astimated at 244,000 bu. The previous crop amounted to 671,000 bu. A 15 peroent increase since last season is looked for in the peach crop whioh is at present estimated at 2,025,000 bu. Apricots also will be a larger crop at 172,000 bu. This fruit is grown commercially only in British Columbia where the 1948 orop amounted to 152,000 bu. The production of cherries is expected to be only three percent heavier than in 1948 . The crup is currently estimated at 404,000 bu. Loganberries which are grown Commerainily in British Columbia are sharply reduced this season at 1,248,000 1b. scmpared with the 1948 crop of $2,261,000$ 10. The grape crop according to tho fiarst estimate will amount to $64,329,000 \mathrm{lb}$ or 12 percent above the 1948 leval of production.

According to a survey fust oompleted the acreage of asparagus, beans, peas, and tometoos under contract to the vegotable processors is sharply reduced this
season. The corn acreage on the other hand shows an increase of 23 percent over that of last year. The 1949 contracted acreage with comparable figures for 1948 in brackets is: Asparagus 790 acres ( 1,210 acres); beans 5,020 acres ( 8,150 acres); corn 63,180 acres ( 51,440 acres); peas 33,120 acres ( 49,220 acres); tomatoes 38,980 acres ( 67,120 acres).
