CONTRACTED ACREAGES OF CANNING CROPS, 1956

The survey of vegetable processors to determine the acreage contracted of asparagus, beans, corn, peas and tomatoes has been completed for 1956 and the results are shown in the accompanying tables. Contracted acreages reported for beans, corn and peas were all lower this year than last while the area of asparagus and tomatoes under contract was higher. At least some of the reductions in contracted acreages in 1956 were attributed to the late spring which prevailed throughout Eastern Canada.

The acreage of beans under contract was greater this year than last in all provinces for which statistics are collected except Quebec and Alberta. Corn acreage was down in all provinces except Alberta where there was a substantial increase and Manitoba where the acreage remained the same as in 1955. British Columbia and Alberta were the only two provinces reporting increases in the contracted acreage of peas this year. Tomatoes were up in Ontario and Quebec but down slightly in British Columbia.

Estimates of contracted acreages are compiled from a survey made by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics of all licensed canners packing these products in Canada. Questionnaires were sent out in May and for the most part completed and returned during June. Therefore these figures represent the total acreages reported contracted or to be contracted at the time of reporting. Figures for the previous years were reported at the corresponding time each mason, therefore the figures are comparable. Subsequent changes in plans occasioned by variations in factors such as weather or economic conditions may result in actual plantings varying somewhat from contract indications. Such changes would, of course, influence any inferences which may be drawn from these figures.

The relationship between acreages contracted and acreages planted under contract was studied by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the years 1954 and 1955 in all provinces for which contracted acreage statistics are compiled except British Columbia. Questionnaires were sent during the summer to all firms reporting contracts for the year in question. Results indicated that in 1954 the acreage of beans planted under contract was equal to acreage contracted while in the case of corn, acreage planted stood at 113 per cent of acreage contracted, peas 99 per cent and tomatoes 97 per cent. For 1955, 98 per cent of the bean acreage under contract was planted. There was a 2 per cent increase in corn while 96 per cent of the pea acreage and 98 per cent of the tomato acreage contracted were actually planted.
