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CONTRACTED ACREAGES OF CANNING CROPS, 1958.

The survey of vegetable processors to determine the acreage contracted of asparagus, beans, corn, peas and tomatoes has been completed for 1958 and the results are shown in the accompanying table. The area under contract in 1958 was below that of 1957 for each crop except beans, where there was no change. Peas showed the greatest proportional reduction, with the 1958 area under contract being 29 per cent below that of the previous year.

In the Maritime Provinces, the acreage of beans contracted was greater this year than last but peas were down. Canners in Quebec contracted for smaller acreages of peas and tomatoes this year but increased areas of beans and corn. In Ontario and British Columbia the acreages contracted were reduced this year for all crops. In the Prairie Provinces large area to the peak of the contract this year than last, but corn and down.

Estimates of contracted acreages are compiled from a survey made by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics of all licensed canners packing these products in Canada. Questionnaires were sent out in May and, for the most part, completed and returned during June. Therefore, these figures represent the total acreages reported, contracted or to be contracted, at the time of reporting. Figures for the previous years were reported at the corresponding time each season, therefore the figures are comparable. Subsequent changes in plans, occasioned by variations in factors such as weather or economic conditions, may result in actual plantings varying somewhat from contract indications. Such changes would, of course, influence any inferences which may be drawn from these figures.

The relationship between acreages contracted and acreages planted under contract has been studied by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics for the years 1954, 1955, 1956 and 1957, in all provinces, except British Columbia, for which contracted acreages statistics are compiled. Questionnaires were sent during the summer to all firms reporting contracts for the year in question. Results indicated that in 1957, the acreage of beans planted under contract stood at 98.5 per cent of the contracted area, corn at 97.8 per cent, peas at 96.0 per cent and tomatoes at 97.1 per cent.
