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## SECOND ESTIMATE OF THE COMMERCIAL PRODUCTION OF ALL FRUITS, 1969

Estimates released in this memorandum, except where otherwise indicated, are based on reports submitted to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics by the Quebec Bureau of Statistics and Federal and Provincial Departments of Agriculture personnel in the various fruit growing areas. All 1969 figures are subject to revision. Reports were made as of September for Ontario. Estimates for the Atlantic Provinces and Quebec were also based on conditions at the middle of September. The British Columbia crop estimates for apples, pears, peaches, apricots, cherries, plums and prunes and grapes were released by the Provincial Department of Agriculture on September 12 and the figures on strawberries, raspberries, loganberries, were released September 3, blueberries and cranberries were released August 18. Accordingly all estimates apply to the situation as it existed at the time when the reports concerned were made.

In the case of British Columbia the original figures were in pounds the volumetric estimates were calculated as follows: 1 bushel of apples = 45 pounds; 1 bushel of all other tree fruits = 50 pounds (net weight); 1 quart of berries = 1.5 pounds.
