CANADIAN GRAIN SUPPLIES AND MOVEMENT

World grain supplies in 1958-59 attained record proportions with both carry-in stocks and production registering increases. Estimated stocks of wheat, rye, barley, oats and corn in the four major exporting countries (United States, Canada, Argentina and Australia) at July 1, 1958 amounted to 123.8 million metric tons, exceeding by one per cent the July 1, 1957 total of 122.4 million and representing an increase for the sixth consecutive year. Total world production of the same five grains in 1958 was estimated at 593.9 million metric tons, some 10 per cent greater than the 1957 outturn of 538.3 million. Production of breadgrains increased by 12 per cent and reflected larger outturns for both wheat and rye. World wheat production climbed from 208.5 million metric tons in 1957 to a record 236.8 million in 1958, largely due to expanded crops in United States, Australia and Argentina. World rye production amounted to 37.2 million metric tons compared with the 1957 harvest of 35.8 million. Production of oats, at 61.5 million metric tons, and barley, at 72.0 million, were both above the comparable 1957 totals of 58.0 million and 69.1 million metric tons, respectively. Production of corn amounted to a record 186.4 million metric tons, 12 per cent greater than the 1957 level of 166.9 million.

World exports of wheat, wheat flour in terms of grain, rye, oats, barley and corn during the 1958-59 (July-June) crop year amounted to some 48.4 million metric tons, representing an increase of 4 per cent over the 1957-58 total of 46.7 million. World trade in wheat and wheat flour in terms of grain in 1958-59 exceeded the level of the preceding year due almost entirely to larger exports of wheat while flour movement showed relatively little change. According to "World Grain Trade Statistics" published by the Food and Agriculture Organization in Rome, the 1958-59 (July-June) world trade in wheat and wheat flour in terms of grain equivalent amounted to 30.8 million metric tons, an increase of 5 per cent over the 1957-58 total of 29.3 million. World exports of rye in 1958-59 were placed at 710 thousand metric tons compared with the 715 thousand exported during the preceding crop year. Reflecting the increased export movement of wheat, the total international trade in breadgrains, at 31.5 million metric tons was 5 per cent greater than the 30.0 million moved in 1957-58. The outstanding feature of the 1958-59 world trade in wheat was the relatively high proportion of the trade under government-assisted export programs. There was a marked decline of some 1.4 million metric tons in wheat exports from France and a substantial increase in exports from the U.S.S.R. which reached a total of 1.6 million metric tons.

In keeping with the high levels of world cattle and hog numbers, international trade in coarse grains (oats, barley and corn) increased by 1.4 per cent from 16.7 million metric tons in 1957-58 to 16.9 million in 1958-59. Although a substantial decline in world exports of oats was accompanied by a relatively small reduction in barley exports, these declines were more than offset by a larger international movement of corn. In addition, it is to be noted that world trade in grain sorghum, originating primarily in the United States, has climbed sharply in recent years from approximately 1.2 million tons in 1956-57 to 1.5 million in 1957-58 and 3.0 million in 1958-59.

In addition to wheat, flour and the feed grains, shipments of flaxseed and oil in terms of seed from the four major exporting countries (Canada, United States, Argentina and India) amounted to 1,057 thousand metric tons in 1958-59 compared with 1,469 thousand in 1957-58.

Exports of Canadian grain and grain products during 1958-59 based on the crop year August-July, amounted to 298 million bushels of breadgrains and 78 million of feed grains (oats and barley) representing approximately 26 per cent of the world trade in breadgrains and 10 per cent of the trade in feed grains. In 1957-58 Canadian exports of these same commodities had accounted for an estimated 30 per cent of the world trade in

breadgrain and 13 per cent of the non-breadgrains. The 14.6 million bushels of Canadian flaxseed and oil in terms of seed cleared during August-July 1958-59 equalled approximately 35 per cent of the July-June shipments from the four major exporters, an increase of 10 per cent over the corresponding 1957-58 level. The United States, retained its position as the leading world exporter of wheat (including flour), accounting for some 39 per cent of the 1958-59 (July-June) total world trade in these commodities.

Crop conditions across Canada were variable in 1958 and although drought was experienced in the Prairie Provinces for the second consecutive year, hail damage was light and losses from rust were negligible. Weather conditions favoured the development of high quality in the 1958 outturn of hard red spring wheat and about 90 per cent of the crop placed in the top three grades. With bumper grain crops being harvested in five of the seven preceding crop years the pressure on Canada's grain storage and handling facilities remained great. Marketings of and payments for wheat, oats and barley continued under the compulsory crop year pools system under the jurisdiction of the Canadian Wheat Board.

Carryover stocks of each of the five principal Canadian grains, at the beginning of the 1958-59 crop year, registered decreases from 1957-58 levels. Total production of these grains increased by 4 per cent in 1958, due to larger outturns of oats and barley. The effect of smaller carryovers, however, more than offset the increase in production and as a result total estimated domestic supplies of wheat, oats, barley, rye and flaxseed in 1958-59, at 1,976.5 million bushels, represented a decline of 7 per cent from the 1957-58 combined total of 2,134.1 million. Domestic supplies of wheat, consisting of the August 1 carryover of 639.5 million bushels and the 1958 crop of 371.7 million amounted to 1,011.2 million bushels, 10 per cent less than the 1957-58 total of 1,119.1 million and 12 per cent below the record 1956-57 domestic supplies of 1,152.6 million bushels. Supplies of oats, at 555.9 million bushels, were 50.9 million less than the 1957-58 level, while barley supplies, totalling 362.9 million bushels, represented a relatively small increase over those of the preceding year. Supplies of rye in the 1958-59 crop year amounted to 18.1 million bushels compared with 22.7 million in 1957-58. Flaxseed supplies, reflecting larger production, totalled 28.4 million bushels and exceeded by 6 per cent the 1957-58 figure of 26.8 million.

Total marketings of the five major grains by farmers in the Prairie Provinces during the crop year 1958-59 amounted to 552.0 million bushels, representing a decrease of 4 per cent from the comparable 1957-58 level of 576.0 million and 5 per cent less than the ten-year (1947-48-1956-57) average of 578.4 million.

Total exports of the five major grains and their products in 1958-59 amounted to 390.0 million bushels of grain equivalent representing a decline of 13 per cent from the 1957-58 movement of 445.9 million but 2 per cent greater than the ten-year (1947-48-1956-57) average of 382.2 million and 21 per cent above the long-term (1927-28-1956-57) average of 321.3 million bushels. The 1958-59 total exports of Canadian grain and grain products fell short of the 1957-58 level due to reductions which occurred in shipments of wheat, oats, barley and rye. Flaxseed was the only grain recording an increase over the 1957-58 export movement. Exports of wheat and wheat flour in terms of grain equivalent, at 294.5 million bushels, represented a decrease of 8 per cent from the 320.3 million bushel level of the preceding year. Shipments of the feed grains, including milled and processed products, amounted to 7.5 million bushels of oats and 70.4 million of barley, with both grains registering relatively substantial decreases from 1957-58 totals of 26.2 million and 80.3 million bushels, respectively. Exports of rye

declined from 5.4 million bushels in 1957-58 to 3.2 million in 1958-59. Clearances of flaxseed amounted to 14.3 million bushels and exceeded the 1957-58 level of 13.6 million.

The crop year 1958-59 coincided with the third year of the third three-year International Wheat Agreement. Under its provisions Canada's guaranteed export quota was set at 100.3 million bushels, in the event that the L.W.A. price were to drop to the floor level of \$1.50 per bushel, basis No. 1 Manitoba Northern, in store Fort William-Port Arthur. According to the final report on the year's transactions, Canadian sales under the Agreement totalled 83.5 million bushels. Sales under the Agreement were quite widely distributed, with 26 of the 42 importing countries included in the pact purchasing wheat and/or flour from Canada. The larger purchases from Canada under the Agreement were as follows, in millions of bushels: the Federal Republic of Germany, 29.1; Japan, 15.0; the Netherlands, 6.6; Switzerland, 6.1; Union of South Africa, 5.5; India, 5.3; and Norway, 3.4. The greater part of Canada's wheat trade during 1958-59 was carried on in Class II wheat (i.e. wheat exported outside the provisions of the International Wheat Agreement). The leading market for Class II wheat was the United Kingdom, with shipments to that country accounting for 100.9 million bushels of Canadian wheat and wheat flour in terms of wheat.

Exports of wheat in bulk during the 1958-59 season amounted to 252.2 million bushels, 9 per cent less than the 1957-58 level of 275.7 million but 13 per cent greater than the ten-year (1947-48 - 1956-57) average of 223.4 million. The decline of 23.5 million bushels from 1957-58 clearances of bulk wheat was accounted for by reductions of 3.3 million in clearances to the United Kingdom, 12.4 million in exports under Colombo Plan to India, 7.5 million bushels to Russia and 13.9 million to the Netherlands. The United Kingdom remaining in its position as Canada's largest market for wheat in bulk, decreased purchases of Canadian wheat from 90.3 million bushels in 1957-58 to a total of 87.0 million during 1958-59. Both Japan and Germany increased their purchases of wheat from Canada during the 1958-59 crop year. Exports of Canadian wheat in bulk to Japan increased to 41.0 million bushels compared with 38.0 million in the preceding crop year while shipments to the Federal Republic of Germany amounted to 35.0 million bushels, an increase of 5.2 million over the 1957-58 total. In addition, nineteen other countries purchased Canadian wheat in bulk in amounts exceeding one million bushels. These countries, with quantities imported during the 1958-59 crop year were as follows, in millions of bushels: India, 11.4; Belgium, 10.7; Netherlands, 7.9, Union of South Africa, 7.6; U.S.S.R., 7.3; Switzerland, 6.3; Poland, 5.4; Ireland, 4.1; Pakistan, 3.8; Norway, 3.6; United States, 3.4; Austria, 3.0; Venezuela, 2.9; Peru, 1.9; Israel, 1.6; France, 1.4; Philippine Islands, 1.2; Ecuador, 1.1; and Italy, 1.1. Total wheat shipments to Commonwealth countries, including the United Kingdom amounted to 111.0 million bushels, while those to non-Commonwealth countries totalled 141.1 million. Of the 248.8 million bushels of bulk wheat shipped to overseas destinations, some 105.2 million were cleared from Vancouver-New Westminster. The next largest amount, 49.2 million bushels, was shipped from Montreal while clearances from the Port of Churchill amounted to 18.4 million. Most of the remainder was accounted for by the following St. Lawrence and Atlantic Ports with quantities shipped in millions of bushels: Sorel, 17.8; West Saint John, 13.7; Halifax, 13.2; Three Rivers, 12.4; Quebec, 9.9; and Fort William-Port Arthur direct, 5.0.

Exports of bagged seed wheat, based on adjusted Customs returns, amounted to some 5.3 million bushels, with United States being the principal market.

WESTERN WHEAT CROP

Reflecting the combined effect of a decrease in the average yield per acre from 17.8 bushels in 1957 to 17.1 bushels in 1958 as well as a 0.2 million acre decrease in seeded acreage, production of wheat in the Prairie Provinces in 1958 was estimated at 346 million bushels, 5 per cent less than the 1957 outturn of 364 million and 26 per cent below the ten-year (1948-1957) average of 466 million. Production by provinces, in millions of bushels, was estimated as follows: Saskatchewan, 192; Alberta, 96; and Manitoba, 58.

The export movement of Canadian wheat flour during the 1958-59 crop year amounted to 16.1 million hundredweight (37.1 million bushels of wheat equivalent) and represented a decrease of 12 per cent from the 1957-58 total of 17.6 million hundredweight (40.4 million bushels of wheat equivalent). As with bulk wheat, the United Kingdom was Canada's best customer for wheat flour, taking 6.0 million hundredweight or 13.9 million bushels of wheat equivalent and accounting for 37 per cent of the total crop year movement. Eight other countries or colonies each purchased Canadian wheat flour equivalent to at least one million bushels of wheat. These countries or colonies in order of their volume of purchases and with quantities in millions of bushels of wheat equivalent, were as follows: Philippine Islands, 3.0; Ceylon, 2.2; United States, 1.6; Jamaica, 1.6; Trinidad and Tobago, 1.6; Ghana, 1.4; Japan, 1.2; and Leeward and Windward Islands, 1.0.

Combined exports of oats, barley, rye and flaxseed (including exports of rolled oats and oatmeal, malt and pot and pearl barley in terms of grain equivalent) amounted to 95.5 million bushels during the crop year 1958-59, some 24 per cent below the comparable 1957-58 level of 125.6 million and 14 per cent less than the ten-year (1947-48 - 1956-57) average of 110.4 million bushels. Most of the decrease occurred in exports of oats and barley to the United States while flaxseed was the only one of the four grains exported in greater volume than in 1957-58.

Export clearances of Canadian oats in the 1958-59 crop year reached a level of only 7.1 million bushels as against 25.9 million in the preceding year. United States usually the principal market for Canadian oats exports, purchased only 1.4 million bushels compared with 21.6 million last year. Germany appeared again in the list of overseas customers with purchases of 1.3 million bushels. Exports to the United Kingdom, at 3.4 million bushels, were only slightly reduced compared with 3.9 million in 1957-58. Canadian Customs exports of oatmeal and rolled oats in terms of grain equivalent during 1958-59 amounted to 0.5 million bushels compared with 0.3 million in 1957-58.

The 64.4 million bushels of Canadian barley exported in 1958-59 represented a decline of 10.7 million from the 1957-58 level. This total is still approximately 34 million bushels ahead of the 30-year average. United States users reduced their imports by 11.3 million bushels, while the United Kingdom increased purchases by 4.8 million, thus maintaining the first position with a total of 41.5 million bushels. Japan, in third position, decreased imports of Canadian barley to 5.7 million bushels from 10.2 million in the preceding year and Poland again entered the Canadian barley export market with purchases of 4.3 million bushels in 1958-59. According to Canadian Customs returns exports of malt and pot and pearl barley amounted to the equivalent of 6.1 million bushels during the crop year 1958-59 compared with 5.2 million in 1957-58.

Exports of Canadian rye in the crop year 1958-59, at 3.2 million bushels, declined from the 1957-58 level of 5.4 million and were the lowest since the crop year 1945-46. Shipments of 2.1 million bushels to the United States, 0.5 million to the Federal Republic of Germany and 0.2 million to the United Kingdom accounted for most of the 1958-59 total. A slight expansion of 0.6 million bushels was recorded in Canada's overseas shipments of flaxseed in 1958-59. The total for the crop year, at 14.3 million bushels, is some 7 million less than the 1956-57 record exports. Largest single importer of Canadian flaxseed in 1958-59 was the United Kingdom with 6.9 million bushels followed by Japan, 2.5 million; Germany, 1.3 million; and the Netherlands, 1.1 million.

Under the terms of the Temporary Wheat Reserves Act, the carrying costs of temporary wheat reserves owned by the Canadian Wheat Board in respect to Board stocks of wheat in excess of 178 million bushels at the commencement of a crop year were paid for by the Minister of Finance out of the consolidated revenue fund. On the basis of stocks owned by the Canadian Wheat Board on August 1, 1958 payments to the Board's Account under the Temporary Wheat Reserves Act amounted to \$39,825,303.51. Of this amount \$29,276,631.96 was allocated

to the 1957-58 pool and \$10,548,671.55 to the 1958-59 pool. On August 7, 1958, the Prairie Grain Advance Payments Act was amended to provide:

1. That cash advances be related solely to the quantity of grain deliverable by producers on a quota of 6 bushels per specified acre, less deliveries by producers on the foregoing quota within the crop year in which an application for a cash advance is made. The amendment was enacted in order to provide that deliveries of grain under special quotas or authorizations would not reduce the opportunity of producers to secure cash advances relating to grain deliverable under their general delivery quotas. The amendment was designed particularly to meet the circumstances of producers who deliver malting barley under over-quota provisions.

2. That grain delivered by producers, in accordance with Wheat Board regulations, for the purpose of acquiring registered and certified seed should be excluded from the repayment provisions of the Act.

Marketing of Western Canadian wheat during the crop year 1958-59 was again conducted by the Canadian Wheat Board on a one-year pool basis. The initial payment to producers for No. 1 Northern wheat remained at \$1.40 per bushel. A 10 cent premium on No. 1 C.W. Amber Durum was discontinued and the initial price for this grade was also \$1.40 per bushel. No adjustment payments on the 1958-59 deliveries were made during the crop year but on February 12, 1960 an interim payment on the 1958-59 pool account for wheat was announced, amounting to 10 cents per bushel for all grades. The full amount of this payment was some \$36.7 million. The final payment (announced on June 15, 1960) amounted to some \$33.9 million after providing for payment costs and Prairie Farm Assistance Act levy. The average final payment amounted to the equivalent of 9.2425 cents per bushel while the total payment for No. 1 Northern, basis in store Fort William-Port Arthur or Vancouver and prior to deduction of the P.F.A.A. levy amounted to \$1.59569 per bushel.

On July 24, 1958 the Canadian Wheat Board announced the main features of the delivery quota policy for the 1958-59 crop year. As in the preceding year an initial quota of 100 units was to be effective at local delivery stations as announced by the Board. One unit consisted of 3 bushels of wheat, or 5 bushels of barley or rye, or 8 bushels of oats or any combination of these grains amounting to 100 units. Under this policy a permit holder was entitled to deliver a maximum of 300 bushels of wheat or 800 bushels of oats or 500 bushels of barley or 500 bushels of rye or any combination of these grains which, when calculated on the unit basis, did not exceed 100 units. Deliveries of

flaxseed were subject to an initial quota of 5 bushels per seeded acre, effective August 1. The initial unit quota was followed by general delivery quotas, based upon bushels per specified acreage with the first general quotas established at September 29, 1958. Prior to the crop year 1958-59, acreage seeded to durum wheat was excluded from specified acreage. However, on January 21, 1958 the Canadian Wheat Board announced that effective August 1, 1958 acreage seeded to durum wheat would be considered part of the producer's specified acreage for quota purposes. As a result of this change durum wheat was deliverable only on the unit or specified acreage quotas during 1958-59. Therefore, effective August 1, 1958 the "specified acreage" for delivery purposes consisted of each permit holder's acreage seeded to wheat (including durums), oats, barley and rye, as well as summerfallow and eligible acreage seeded to cultivated grasses and forage crops. The final quota summary for the 2,028 shipping points in the Western Division showed that at July 31, 1959 a total of 946 points were on a quota of 8 bushels per specified acre, 647 points were on a 7-bushel quota and 183 points were on a 6-bushel quota. An additional 252 points were on a "limited" quota. In February 1959 the Board designated certain delivery points as "limited" stations. These were stations where specific general quotas would provide for the delivery of the total quantity of marketable grain at the station. Where individual producers held more grain than could be delivered under the "limited" quota, provision was made whereby such producers could apply for a special delivery permit which would bring their deliveries up to the maximum general delivery quota established for the crop year. On July 28, 1959 the Board advised that all delivery quotas in effect in the 1958-59 season including specified acreage quotas, supplementary quotas on oats, barley and rye, open quota on flaxseed and all special permit authorizations would automatically expire as of the close of business July 31, 1959.

Inspections of wheat in the Western Division during the crop year amounted to 185,000 carloads compared with 200,000 inspected in 1957-58. Fort William-Port Arthur, the principal inspection center, accounted for 96,000 carloads, representing 52 per cent of the total inspections for 1958-59. The quality of the 1958-59 marketings of wheat, as indicated by the proportions falling into the higher grades, was above that of the two preceding years. Seventy-seven per cent of the wheat inspected during the crop year graded Nos. 1 to 4 Northern compared with 75 per cent in 1957-58 and 68 per cent in 1956-57. Moisture content was considerably higher with 7.8 per cent of all grades and varieties grading "Toughs" and 0.5 per cent grading "Damps" in 1958-59 compared with 2.5 per cent and 0.1 per cent, respectively, in 1957-58.

EASTERN WHEAT CROP

Production of wheat in Eastern Canada in 1958 was estimated at 24.7 million bushels, 21 per cent more than in 1957. With the exception of an estimated 471,000 bushels produced in Quebec and the Maritime Provinces, all of the 1958 Eastern wheat crop was grown in Ontario. All but 363,000 bushels of the Ontario crop of 24.3 million was winter wheat, yielding an

average of 41.2 bushels per acre. The quantity of Ontario winter wheat milled into flour during 1958-59 amounted to 6,332,000 bushels, 2 per cent above the 6,229,000 bushels milled in 1957-58. Eastern wheat continued to be sold on the open market.

OATS, BARLEY, RYE AND FLAXSEED

Outturns of oats, barley and flaxseed in Canada in 1958 were each above their comparable 1957 levels while production of rye was below that of the preceding year. The largest increase, some 28.8 million bushels, occurred in production of barley with the all-Canada 1958 outturn of this crop placed at 244.8 million bushels, 13 per cent more than the 1957 harvest of 216.0 million. Production of oats, estimated at 401.0 million bushels was some 5 per cent greater than the 1957 outturn of 380.6 million. Production of oats and barley in the Prairie Provinces amounted to 240 million and 238 million bushels, respectively. The 8.0 million bushels of rye produced in Canada in 1958 was 6 per cent less than the 1957 crop of 8.5 million. Flaxseed production, at 22.8 million bushels, represented an increase of 19 per cent over the 19.2 million harvested in 1957.

Marketing of Western Canadian oats and barley was again carried on through compulsory crop-year pools, administered by the Canadian Wheat Board. During the crop year a number of

supplementary delivery quotas were issued on oats, barley, rye and flaxseed, with the flaxseed quota, based on seeded acreage, being declared open as at November 11, 1958. (For details of these supplementary quotas see "Report of the Canadian Wheat Board, crop year 1958-59"). The amount of grain marketed under these special authorizations was, of course, in addition to the quantities of oats, barley and rye which producers chose to deliver under the initial and general quota policies outlined in the foregoing section on "Western Wheat Crop".

The initial payment for oats in the 1958-59 crop year, basis No. 2 C.W., in store Fort William-Port Arthur, was 60 cents per bushel, the same as in 1957-58. The initial payment for barley, basis No. 3 C.W. Six-Row, in store Fort William-Port Arthur, at 96 cents per bushel, was also unchanged from that of 1957-58. No interim payments were made on either grain during the crop year but final payments were announced

on April 1, 1960. The final payment on the 122.4 million bushels of barley delivered to the 1958-59 pool averaged 4.35946 cents per bushel after deduction of payment expenses and the one per cent Prairie Farm Assistance Act levy. Total prices (basis in store Fort William-Port Arthur) realized by producers for representative grades after deducting carrying charges in country and terminal elevators, Board administrative costs etc., but before deducting the 1 per cent P.F.A.A. levy were \$1.00681 per bushel for No. 3 C.W. Six-Row barley and \$0.90021 per bushel for No. 1 Feed barley. Final payment on the 38.7 million bushels of oats delivered to the 1958-59 pool averaged 8.1381 cents per bushel. Total prices realized by producers for representative grades, on the same basis as for barley, were \$0.69465 per bushel for No. 2 C.W. and \$0.63402 per bushel for No. 1 Feed oats.

GRAIN MOVEMENT VIA THE ST. LAWRENCE SEAWAY 1959

The following analysis of Canadian and United States grain movements through the St. Lawrence Seaway system in 1959 was extracted from the Weekly Bulletin "Canadian Grain Position" published by the Statistics Branch of the Board of Grain Commissioners for Canada, for the week ending December 23, 1959.

The clearing of the S.S. Laketon on December 17 closing navigation for the 1959 season at the Canadian Lakehead also signalled the end of the first experimental season of shipping for the new St. Lawrence Seaway. The full impact of the Seaway on Canada's grain movement will take a number of years to develop. The results of the first year's operations will also take some time to analyse but for those who would, here are a few key statistics of the 1959 grain flow through the Seaway system.

First and perhaps foremost insofar as the grain trade is concerned, the Seaway resulted in several major shifts in grain handling patterns.

1. Direct overseas shipping in volume from the head of the lakes. Small ocean vessels have called in the past and taken on grain at Fort William-Port Arthur for direct overseas shipment but the volumes have been small. During the 1959 season 71 ocean vessels loaded 16.4 million bushels of grain at the Canadian Lakehead direct for overseas. Some 15 of these cargoes went, as is, insofar as grain was concerned; the remainder topped off with varying quantities at St. Lawrence ports. Two small cargoes moved direct from Samia to overseas.

2. Canadian coasting ships of both laker and saltie type construction were able to move direct from the Lakehead to St. Lawrence ports thus eliminating the traditional transfer of the grain to canal-type vessel at Lower Lake ports. This movement again had always existed but not in volume. For example, in 1958 St. Lawrence ports received only 4 per cent of their grain by direct water while from April to November inclusive, 1959 almost 50 per cent of the grain unloaded at the 4 lower river ports came direct in one run. A corollary of this was that 56 million bushels or not quite 50 per cent of their input came on a lake transfer basis ex upper ports such as Port Colborne, Kingston and Prescott. Also affected was the volume moved by lake and rail combinations ex Bay ports; this traditional opening and closing and/or reserve movement was displaced to some degree this year. From April 1 to November 30, Bay ports railed 15 per cent of the receipts at the St. Lawrence ports compared with 22 per cent in the same period of 1958.

3. A part of this direct movement, but nevertheless new in 1959, was the volume carried by saltie type vessels of United Kingdom registry. Some 15 vessels participated in the 41 cargoes totalling 15.4 million bushels ex Lakehead to Eastern Canadian ports.

All grains in Eastern Canada, and rye and flaxseed in Western Canada continued to be traded on the open market.

Deliveries of the various grains from Western farms in 1958-59 in millions of bushels, with the 1957-58 figures in brackets, were as follows: oats, 39.3 (58.3); barley, 122.8 (116.9); rye, 4.7 (7.4); and flaxseed, 17.5 (15.3). Based on Board of Grain Commissioners' inspections during the crop year 1958-59, percentages of the four grains falling into the higher grades (excluding "Toughs" and "Damps") with comparable data for the 1957-58 crop year and the five-year (1952-53-1956-57) averages, respectively, in brackets, were as follows: oats, 1 Feed or higher, 94.5 (95.7, 87.4); barley, 1 Feed or higher, 80.4 (76.6, 63.4); rye, 3 C.W. or higher, 89.8 (85.1, 75.8); and flaxseed, 1 C.W. and 2 C.W., 94.8 (94.2, 91.3).

4. Not only could the vessels move direct to St. Lawrence ports but the saltie type ships could also go out into the Gulf of St. Lawrence and down the coast to the Maritime ports of Halifax, Port Williams and Shediac and some 1.7 million bushels of grain moved in this manner. All but two cargoes (ex Prescott) moved direct from the Lakehead.

5. The Seaway presented similar opportunities to United States grain shippers and approximately 85 million bushels of U.S. grain moved on a direct overseas basis from Duluth-Superior (71.2 million) and Chicago (13.9 million). But of more concern to Canadian elevator operators was the use of St. Lawrence elevators for either transfer loading or topping off operations on these United States cargoes. St. Lawrence ports loaded 26.7 million bushels of U.S. grain for overseas on this basis. U.S. grain has periodically moved through Canadian ports and the 1959 handlings were less than half the record 63.6 million bushels of U.S. grain shipped overseas through the Canadian system in 1937-38. A further 7.3 million bushels of U.S. grain were handled by eastern Canadian elevators in 1959, 4.1 million of this for Canadian domestic and 3.1 million returned or trans-shipped to eastern United States points. Unofficial sources add a further 9 million bushels of U.S. grain (chiefly soybeans) to the lake movement from the U.S. to Canada, with this latter quantity moving into unlicensed channels. Of this grand total of 44.5 million bushels of U.S. grain moved to Canadian ports by lake during the 1959 season, 13.0 million came from Duluth-Superior, 20.1 million from Chicago and 11.4 million from Toledo.

These represented the principal developments in grain shipping patterns. Also of major consequence to the grain trade was the influence of the Seaway on Lake Freight rates. Even before the opening, rates from the Lakehead to all sectors had fallen away from the old maximum levels prevailing during the preceding 3 seasons. Low monthly averages for wheat to the Bay, Kingston and Montreal were established as follows—Bay 4.5 cents in April-September period, Kingston 7.75¢ in June and Montreal 13¢ in June. They gradually pushed upwards during the season but the 1959 averages for these three points were still only 4.539¢ to Bay, 8½¢ to Kingston and 14¢ to Montreal compared with 5½¢, 8¼¢ and 16¢, respectively, in 1958.

Reviewing the overall movement for 1959 the Lakehead shipped 286.2 million bushels compared with 322.4 million in 1958. Of this total 16.4 million moved direct overseas (last year 0.6 million) 19 million moved to the United States (26.3 million last year) 196 million moved to Eastern Canadian ports west of Montreal for both domestic and transfer and the balance to St. Lawrence ports and the Maritimes.

Note: To exclude minor revisions involving winter storage cargoes and delayed outturns, these statistics are based on April-November preliminary balances.

CARRYOVER OF CANADIAN GRAIN IN CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES, 1929-59

The figures shown below are not entirely comparable, and the following omissions should be noted. The Canadian carryover figures for 1929 to 1931 do not include grain in transit to United States ports. Beginning with 1932, this item is included in stocks of Canadian grain in the United States. Stocks of Canadian grain in United States Lake and Seaboard ports from 1929 to 1931 are not exact month-end

figures, but rather are for the week-end nearest the crop year-end for each of those years. Stocks of Canadian wheat held in bond by United States flour mills were omitted each year until 1940-41 when they were included for the first time, but have since been part of the carryover. Stocks on farms are included in all years.

FLOUR MILLING IN CANADA

Canadian flour mills reporting on a monthly basis for the crop year 1958-59 had a total flour outturn of 39.8 million hundredweight compared with 40.8 million hundredweight recorded for the previous crop year. Wheat milled for flour in the crop year under review amounted to 90.1 million bushels, yielding an average of one hundredweight (100 pounds) of flour for

every 2.3 bushels of milled wheat. Wheat flour exports (based on Customs returns adjusted to remove effect of time lag) for 1958-59 amounted to 16.1 million hundredweight, a decrease of 8 per cent from the previous crop year shipments of 17.6 million hundredweight.
