## MAPLE PRODUCTS

Ottawa, June 30, 1948.- The Dominion Bureau of Statistics in co-operation with the Department of Agriculture, issues today a report on production and value of maple products in 1948.

## PRODUCTION

Production of maple products in 1948 shows a sharp decline from the record levels achieved in 1947. The crop this year, expressed as syrup, is estimated at 2,394,000 gallons compared with the 1947 crop of 3,923,000 gallons. This year's crop is 13 per cent smaller than the 10-year, 1938-47, average of 2,750,000 gallons. Total production of syrup this year is estimated at 2,159,000 gallons compared with 3,580,000 gallons a year ago. Production of syrup in 1948, by provinces, with comparable data for 1947 in brackets is as follows: Nova Scotia, 8,000 gallons (9,000 gallons); New Brunswick, 12,000 gallons (23,000 gallons); Quebec, 1,750,000 gallons (2,831,000 gallons); Ontario, 389,000 gallons (717,000 gallons). Maple sugar production in 1948 with 1947 production in brackets is: Canada, 2,350,000 pounds (3,434,000 pounds); Nova Scotia 16,000 pounds (14,000 pounds); New Brunswick, 124,000 pounds (93,000 pounds); Quebec, 2,187,000 pounds (3,260,000 pounds); Ontario 23,000 pounds (67,000 pounds).

#### THE 1948 SEASON

The season was generally poor in all provinces. The ground was not frozen to any depth and the snow disappeared rapidly. There were few bright, sunny days and limited night frost which combined to reduce the flow of sap. Growers reported the sap as having below normal sugar content. The quality of the syrup generally was below average.

#### MARKETS AND PRICES

The average price of syrup in Canada was only slightly below the 1947 level at \$3.58 compared with \$3.59. While prices in the Maritimes and Quebec show a slight increase over last year, the prices paid in Ontario are down somewhat. Average prices paid to farmers for syrup this year by provinces with 1947 prices in brackets are: Nova Scotia \$4.08 per gallon (\$3.94); New Brunswick \$4.28 per gallon (\$4.25); Quebec \$3.49 per gallon (\$3.48); Ontario \$3.93 per gallon (\$4.00). Prices of sugar this year, with corresponding prices for 1947 in brackets are: Nova Scotia \$.46 per pound (\$.52); New Brunswick \$.49 per pound (\$.50); Quebec \$.34 per pound (\$.37); Ontario \$.35 per pound (\$.41); Canada \$.349 per pound (\$.374).
