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PRODUCTION OF MAPLE PRODUCTS 1956 AND VALUE OF MAPLE PRODUCTS 1955

The 1956 production of maple products (expressed as syrup) at 2.7 million gallons was about 20 per cent above the 1955 crop and one per cent higher than the 1949-53 average. The increased crop this year was attributed to favourable weather conditions. Although early in the season conditions were not promising, a late run of sap developed which prolonged the season and ensured good yields in many areas. Production of maple syrup, estimated at 2.6 million gallons, was about 22 per cent above 1955 and 6 per cent above the 1949-53 average. Syrup production was up in both Ontario and Quebec this year but lower in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. The 1956 production of farm-made maple sugar, however, is estimated at 586,000 pounds, 31 per cent below last year. Sugar production was down in all producing provinces.

Estimates of the prices paid farmers for maple products are not yet available for 1956. These will be released when available. Estimated farm prices and returns to farmers from the sale of maple products in 1955 with comparable figures for 1954, 1953 and the five-year period 1948-52 are shown in tables 4, 5 and 6.

The total value of production of maple products for the 1955 crop in Canada stood at \$10.9 million, slightly lower than the 1954 figure of \$11.0 million. The 1955 crop of 2.2 million gallons (syrup and sugar expressed as syrup) was 8 per cent below that of the previous year but higher prices for both syrup and sugar largely offset the reduced output. Syrup prices to farmers were higher in all producing provinces in 1955 than in 1954 while sugar prices were also up in Nova Scotia and Quetec but down in New Brunswick and Ontario.
