PRODUCTION OF MAPLE PRODUCTS 1957 AND VALUE OF MAPLE PRODUCTS 1956

The 1957 production of maple products (expressed as syrup) at 3,134,000 gallons was about 17 per cent above the 1956 crop and 19 per cent higher than the 1950-54 average. Production of maple syrup, estimated at 3,068,000 gallons, was about 17 per cent above 1956 and 25 per cent above the 1950-54 average. Syrup production was up in all producing provinces this year. The 1957 production of farm-made maple sugar, however, estimated at 661,000 pounds, was also up over last year by 13 per cent. Sugar production was greater in all producing provinces.

Estimates of the prices paid farmers for maple products are not yet available for 1957. These will be released when available. Estimated farm prices and returns to farmers from the sale of maple products in 1956 with comparable figures for 1955, 1954 and the five-year period 1949-53 are shown in tables 4, 5 and 6.

The total value of production of maple products for the 1956 crop in Canada stood at \$9.9 million, 9 per cent below the 1955 figure of \$10.9 million. The 1956 crop of 2.7 million gallons (syrup and sugar expressed as syrup) was 20 per cent above that of the previous year but lower prices for both syrup and sugar in Quebec, the principal producing province, more than offset the effects of the larger crop.
